ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT THE MOUNT

The Mount provides its students with athletic fields and the Harrington Center, a modern two-level student union with a running track, gym, fitness center, and food court. During the 2003-2004 academic year, the Mount began its Campus Expansion Plan, which includes athletic fields to accommodate more Mount teams on campus for practice and home games.

The Mount's East Fields on Delhi Road, which have been the home field for women's soccer, have been expanded into a game field and running track with seating for up to 2,400 spectators. The new Sports Complex gives the Mount Lions' football team its first home field on campus since 1990. It also provides a home field for women's soccer, men's soccer and lacrosse teams for men (2007) and women (2008). The track serves the Mount's track & field teams and additional facilities house the Mount's academic program in athletic training, as well as locker rooms and concessions. The Campus Expansion Plan also included the renovation of nearby College property into practice fields. The Lions' softball team began playing home games at the new River Road softball field in 2007.

The Mount Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field, one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators.

The Harrington Center, which opened in 1998, contains two full courts for Lions volleyball and basketball as well as the full range of Mount intramural teams. The Harrington Center also features a specially surfaced indoor running track; courts for racquetball, squash and walleyball; fitness center; weight training; athletic training; and locker facilities.

The Mount's west campus field, the J. Page Hayden Athletic Field, is the location for the Mount's field events during track & field meets and is a practice field for the Lions' Roar Marching Band. The Mount also provides lighted tennis courts for intercollegiate and intramural teams.

The Mount men's golf team's home course is Miami Whitewater Forest Golf Course in Harrison, Ohio. The course is a par-72, 6,808-yards course with a rating of 72.3 and a slope of 125.

MOUNT ATHLETICS DIRECTOR



Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 13th year as the Lions' athletic director for the 2007-2008 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount. The Lions captured three conference championships last fall. The football team won their third straight HCAC championship, and once again qualified to the NCAA Division III playoffs. The volleyball team was first in

the HCAC regular season and won their ninth straight HCAC Tournament title advancing them to the Great Lakes Regional. The baseball team won the HCAC Tournament title advancing to the Mideast Regional. The Mount also had men's lacrosse for the first time last spring.

In addition, there were plenty of other highlights, both individually and team-wise, for the Mount's athletic programs last season. The women's soccer team and men's basketball teams both had winning

season, as women's soccer advanced to the HCAC Tournament championship game. The Lions' wrestling team was second in the conference, fourth in the regional and sent two wrestlers to the NCAA Division III National Wrestling Tournament, recording two placers.

Radcliffe has long been a part of the sports programs at the Mount. A retired athletic trainer, Radcliffe began his athletic training career in 1976 and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition, Radcliffe has been the Lions' head athletic trainer, working with athletes from all the intercollegiate sports, as well as teaching athletic training at the College.

Radcliffe, who received his bachelor's degree in 1978 and his master's in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio), became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, Radcliffe stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount.

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

2007-2008 OUTLOOK

After two straight winning seasons, a solid group of returning players and the program's second straight promising class of freshmen and transfers, Head Coach Larry Cox and his team are hoping to make a strong push toward claiming a conference championship this season.

The Mount went 13-12 last season, and 9-7 in the HCAC, narrowly missing out qualifying for the HCAC Tournament. The top four teams advance to the tournament, won by Transylvania, as the Mount finished with the third-best record in conference regular season play but did not make the HCAC Tournament due to the tie-breaker.

While the Mount's losses were huge due to graduation - Tony Blomer, Robbie Noschang and Jeff Perry combined for close to 2,000 career points - Cox is looking for the returners from last season to pick up their scoring. Couple that with a strong group of incoming players, the Lions look to approach the season they had two years ago when they went 16-11. They lost that season in the HCAC Tournament Semifinals to Transylvania, 83-79.

"We had some guys here last season that had some nice individual seasons and we're hoping for more of the same this season," Cox says. "We had a fairly successful year, leading the conference with two weeks left, but we didn't finish well. We did beat all four of the conference tournament teams, however, in the regular season, which we feel good about."

Included in the Lions 2007 season were two, one-point HCAC losses and two overtime losses. In all, the Mount lost nine games by seven points or less last season.

"We believe we're closing the gap on the rest of the conference teams," Cox states. "We feel that we're getting closer to winning a conference championship and having a full-time assistant coach (Del Walters) has helped us a lot with that, especially in the recruiting area."

The Lions 2007-08 squad will be paced by senior returning starters Josh Carter, a 5-10 point guard and Michael Eirons, a 6-6 forward; and sophomore returning starter Michael Romes, a 6-4 forward. Carter had played 24 games last season, including 22 starts, averaging 25 minutes, four points, 2.7 rebounds, and 3.4 assists per game. Eirons played in all 25 games, starting 24, playing 28 minutes per game and averaging 10.2 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. Eirons was an Honorable Mention All-HCAC selection in 2006-07.

Romes led the team in scoring last season at 16.1 points per game, playing 22 games and starting 18. He also pulled down 5.2 rebounds per game and shot a single-season school best 68 percent from the field. For his efforts he was named First-Team All-HCAC and HCAC Freshman of the Year.

Four other returners from last season's strong freshman class also return, and are likely to see large amounts of playing time. They are

sophomores Travis Huffman, Robby Lykes, both guards; and classmates Shawn Finamore and Kyle McCord, both forwards. Huffman played in 24 games last season while McCord saw action in 22 games last winter. Finamore played in 12 games last season while Lykes, who joined the team second semester, played in four games on the varsity level.

"We lost three good seniors but we have seven returners back, most who played significant minutes last season," Cox adds. "We're looking for guys to take on expanded roles, show improvement and increase their scoring."

Cox added that the team, overall, has put in a good off-season of work and is looking forward to the upcoming campaign. The Mount figures to run the same offense and defense as in the past, with the individual players in charge of making plays at both ends of the floor.

"We have returners, recruits and transfers who we feel are good shooters, have the ability to attack the basket and make plays," Cox states. "We want to have our big men be able to shoot the three and post up, as well as our guards to have the ability to do both. We have players that can create space on the floor and match-up problems for our opponents."

Cox went on to say how he and his coaching staff looked to recruit players that could play facing the basket and with their back to the basket. They also wanted to target players from successful high school programs that understand what it takes to succeed on the court and off.

"We want our players to understand the work ethic it takes to be a winning program," Cox adds. "It's a 12-month program here at the Mount, with the weight training, off-season workouts and all the other things. We do all the same things the bigger schools do."

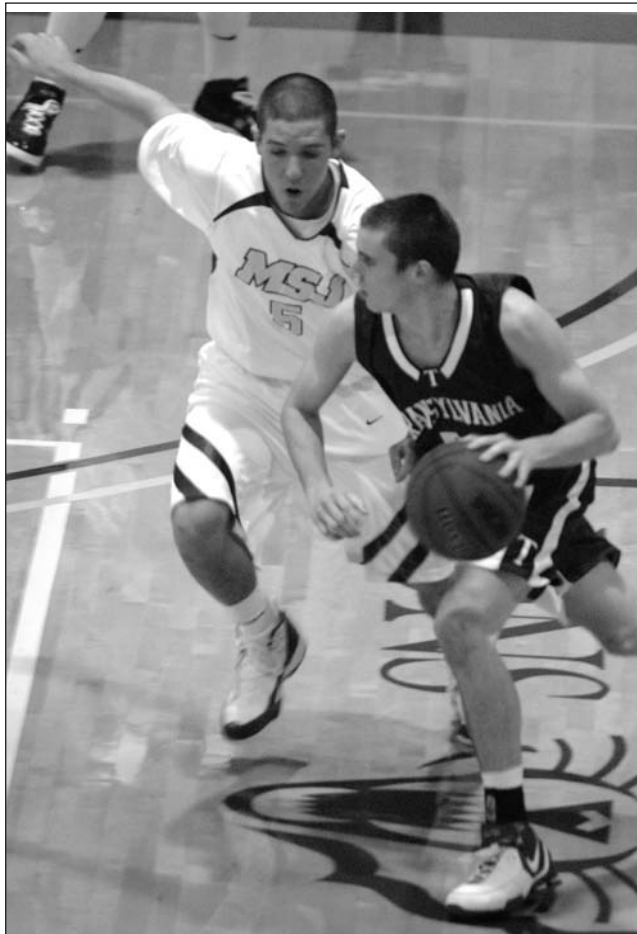
The team will have a large schedule of JV games this season, which Cox hopes gets his younger players the college experience they'll use as they transition to help the varsity team in the future. He figures upwards of six

first-year players, however, could make an impact on the varsity team this winter.

As for team goals in 2007-08, Cox said he wants the players to come out each game and play with enthusiasm. He adds that in order to win the HCAC a team has to play consistently each time out on the court.

"We're looking forward to this season," Cox says. "I think we'll be a deeper team, play faster and look to make things happen full court."

As for the conference race, Cox said Defiance and Franklin have a lot of returners and will be near the top of the standings. He also said Transylvania, Hanover and Bluffton as well as the other schools in the HCAC will be good match-ups again this season.

2007-2008 COACHING STAFF



Head Coach Larry Cox

Larry Cox begins his tenth season as the only men's basketball coach in the history of the Lions' program. He started the program in 1998 and his team finished with a winning record in its inaugural season. Over the past nine seasons he has built the Mount program into a solid, competitive team and is looking to take the next step this year for the top

spot in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. Last season, the Lions led the conference for most of the year before suffering one-point losses late in the season, but still finished with their second straight winning season. Coach Cox is also entering his fifth year as the Mount's assistant athletic director.

Coach Cox's first head coaching position came in the 1990 season at Thomas More College as he inherited a program that had not had a winning season in a decade and during his coaching tenure he turned the program around - finishing with four straight winning seasons. He compiled an overall record of 96-95 and was named AMC Coach of the Year in both the 1994-95 and 1995-96 seasons, while also leading his school to the AMC regular season and tournament championships.

Prior to his tenure at Thomas More, Cox was the associate head coach from 1983-1989 at St. Joseph's College (Indiana), an NCAA Division II program, where he helped lead the program to an average of 16 wins a season in the tough Great Lakes Valley Conference, which includes perennial powerhouses Kentucky Wesleyan, Southern Indiana and Northern Kentucky.

Coach Cox also spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at NCAA Division I Bowling Green State University (Ohio) in 1981-82 and 1982-83. During the first season the Falcons were conference runners-up and in the second season they won the Mid-American Conference outright finishing with a 21-9 record. For two seasons, from 1979-1981, he was an assistant at Hanover College (Indiana), where the school averaged 24 wins a season, won two Hoosier-Buckeye Conference Championships and advanced to the Elite Eight in the NAIA National Tournament.

Coach Cox holds a Bachelor of Arts in History degree from Hanover College (Indiana) and a Master of Arts in History degree and a Master of Education in Physical Education degree from

Bowling Green State University (Ohio). He has taught classes at Bowling Green State University, St. Joseph's College, Thomas More College, and the Mount. During his tenure as a head coach, every player who has completed their four years of eligibility has their degree.

Coach Cox and his wife, Beth, reside in West Chester, Ohio and had triplet sons, Luke, Jake, and Ryan born on October 26, 2007.

Associate Head Coach Del Walters

Del Walters begins his second season as a Mount basketball assistant coach. Walters is also the Lions' head men's tennis coach. He was named associate head men's basketball coach in August 2007. Walters is also the program's recruiting, strength and conditioning and summer camp

coordinator.

Walters came to the Mount from Thomas More College where he was a men's basketball assistant coach since 2000. He was also Thomas More's head men's tennis coach (2004-2005), guiding the team to a 7-5 record, and was the men's and women's head cross country coach (2005-2006). Walters also assisted the men's basketball team at John Carroll University as a graduate assistant coach (1999-2000), after playing for two seasons and being a student assistant coach for two seasons. He also has worked at Thomas More College, John Carroll University and Wittenberg University basketball camps.

The Lions' second-year coach is a 1994 graduate of Villa Angela-St. Joseph High School in Cleveland, Ohio, where his team won the Ohio Division II state Championship during his senior season. Walters was a Second Team All-District and Honorable Mention All-City selection while in high school. He is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the Black Coaches Association.

Walters is a 1999 graduate of John Carroll University, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Communications degree. He resides in Ft. Mitchell, Kentucky.

MOUNT IN THE HCAC

This will be the 10th season for the Mount's men's basketball team in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC). Other institutions that are also members of this conference include: Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University.

In 1998, the first year for the Mount's basketball program as well as the first year of HCAC play, the Lions went 5-9 in the conference, which put them in sixth place out of eight teams. Jarett Young was named Freshman of the Year and gained an Honorable Mention All-Conference award. Joe Toney also received an All-Conference Honorable Mention award for his efforts during the season.

The Mount greatly improved in the 1999-2000 season. The Lions were 6-6 in conference play and won their way into the final four of the tournament where they lost in overtime to the champion, Franklin College. Jarett Young was on the All-Tournament team for his contribution during the post-season. Other Lions received acknowledgement for outstanding play. Jared Franz and Joe Toney were named All-Conference while Young was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. Joe Toney also was named Player of the Week twice during the season.

The Lions tied for fifth place in the HCAC with five wins and seven losses in the 2000-01 season. The Mount was actually in first place with about two weeks to play but slipped in the standings and finished as the seventh and last seed in the post-season conference tournament. The Lions' season came to an end in the first round with a loss to Hanover, 73-69. Junior forward Jared Franz was selected All-Conference while junior forward Steve Bain was chosen Honorable Mention All-Conference.

The 2001-2002 campaign was a season marked by milestone achievements for two players. Seniors Joe Toney and Jarett Young both scored their 1,000th career point. Steve Bain was named First-Team All-Conference, and was also a Player of the Week. Young received an All-Conference Honorable Mention award. The Mount lost in the first round of the tournament but placed fifth in the regular season team standings, recording a 5-9 mark.

The Lions began the 2002-2003 season winning three of their first four conference games and were 5-3 before suffering six straight HCAC losses. The Mount defeated second-place Anderson University and fourth-place Defiance College during the regular season. After losing to HCAC-foe Manchester College at home to end the regular season, the Mount bounced back to defeat the Spartans on the road in the first round of the tournament. Tom Luther, who finished second in the conference in rebounding, was a two-time HCAC Player of the Week winner and also made All-Conference. Chris Washington was also selected to the All-Conference team.

In 2003-2004, the Mount played competitively throughout most of the HCAC campaign, despite posting a 4-10 conference mark. Their wins included triumphs over Manchester and Anderson, as well as Defiance and Bluffton (back-to-back). The Mount also lost two games in overtime, to Anderson and Transylvania. They did, however, win three of their last five regular season HCAC games and suffered a one-point loss to Defiance in the HCAC Tournament. Seniors Tom Luther and E.J. Engelkamp collected conference post-season awards. Luther was sixth in the conference in scoring, while senior teammate Matt Volkerding was first in rebounding and third in blocked shots.

The Mount began the 2004-05 conference slate with two straight wins and played well at home, finishing 4-3 in conference play. The Lions, however, recorded a 1-6 road record in the conference, winning only at Defiance College. After that win, the Mount dropped four straight HCAC match-ups to slip to 5-9 in the conference. They dropped a six-point decision in the first round of the HCAC Tournament to eventual runner-up Franklin College. The Lions finished third as a team in blocked shots and tied for first in steals. Kevin Darthard, who was named First Team All-Conference, was fifth in the HCAC in scoring average and field goal percentage. Derrick Jones was selected Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

In 2005-2006, the Lions had one of the most successful seasons in the program's history. Winning six of their first seven games to start the season, the Mount finished 16-11 overall and 8-6 in the tough HCAC. Finishing fourth in the HCAC regular season, the Lions were the number four seed and hosted their conference tournament opener, beating number five seed Manchester, 67-55. However, their season would end in the conference semifinals, when they lost to the seventh-ranked team in the country, Transylvania, 83-79. Leading the way for the Mount were seniors Kevin Darthard and Derrick Jones, who were voted First team All-Conference. Other notable HCAC accomplishments included juniors Robbie Noschang and Tony Blomer being named Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

The Lions started out slowly in the conference last season, going 1-2 but then ran off a five-game win streak to up their record to 6-2. The Mount was in the thick of the conference race for first place the rest of the season, but was hurt by two close losses down the stretch – an overtime loss to Defiance and a one-point defeat to Bluffton. Their 9-7 record was tied for the third-best in the conference, but the Mount was denied the fourth and final HCAC Tournament spot on the tie-breaker system. Michael Romes was selected Freshman of the Year and First Team All-HCAC while teammate Tony Blomer was also a First Team All-Conference selection. Romes led the conference in field goal percentage while Blomer paced the HCAC in blocked shots. Teammates Jeff Perry and Michael Eirons both made Honorable Mention All-HCAC.
