## ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT THE MOUNT

The Mount provides its students with athletic fields and the Harrington Center, a modern two-level student union with a running track, gym, fitness center, and food court. During the 2003-2004 academic year, the Mount began its Campus Expansion Plan, which includes athletic fields to accommodate more Mount teams on campus for practice and home games.

The Mount's East Fields on Delhi Road, which have been the home field for women's soccer, have been expanded into a game field and running track with seating for up to 2,400 spectators. The new Sports Complex gives the Mount Lions' football team its first home field on campus since 1990. It also provides a home field for women's soccer, men's soccer and lacrosse teams for men (2007) and women (2009). The track serves the Mount's track & field teams and additional facilities house the Mount's academic program in athletic training, as well as locker rooms and concessions. The Campus Expansion Plan also included the renovation of nearby College property into practice fields. The Lions' softball team began playing home games at the new River Road softball field in 2007.

The Mount Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field, one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators.

The Harrington Center, which opened in 1998, contains two full courts for Lions volleyball and basketball as well as the full range of Mount intramural teams. The Harrington Center also features a specially surfaced indoor running track; courts for racquetball, squash and walleyball; fitness center; weight training; athletic training; and locker facilities.

The Mount's west campus field, the J. Page Hayden Athletic Field, is the location for the Mount's field events during track & field meets and is a practice field for the Lions' Roar Marching Band. The Mount also provides lighted tennis courts for intercollegiate and intramural teams.

The Mount men's golf team's home course is Miami Whitewater Forest Golf Course in Harrison, Ohio. The course is a par-72, 6,808-yards course with a rating of 72.3 and a slope of 125.

## MOUNT ATHLETICS DIRECTOR



### Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 13th year as the Lions' athletic director for the 2007-2008 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount.

The Lions' volleyball team captured the HCAC Championship this past fall and advanced to the Conference Championship game. The Mount football team finished as runner-ups in the HCAC regular season and

qualified to their fourth straight NCAA Division III playoffs.

Women's soccer also advanced to the HCAC Semifinals while the men's soccer team enjoyed their best season to date.

In addition, there were plenty of other highlights, both individually and team-wise, for the Mount's athletic programs this past fall.

Radcliffe has long been a part of the sports programs at the Mount. A retired athletic trainer, Radcliffe began his athletic training career in 1976 and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition, Radcliffe has been the Lions' head athletic trainer, working with athletes from all the intercollegiate sports, as well as teaching athletic training at the College.

Radcliffe, who received his bachelor's degree in 1978 and his master's in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio), became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, Radcliffe stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount.

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

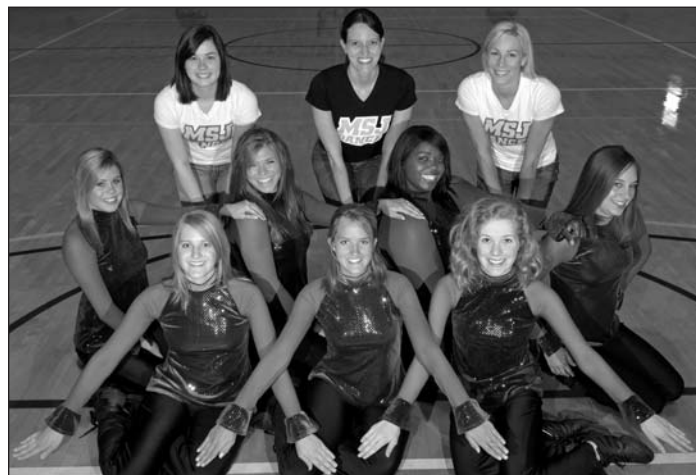

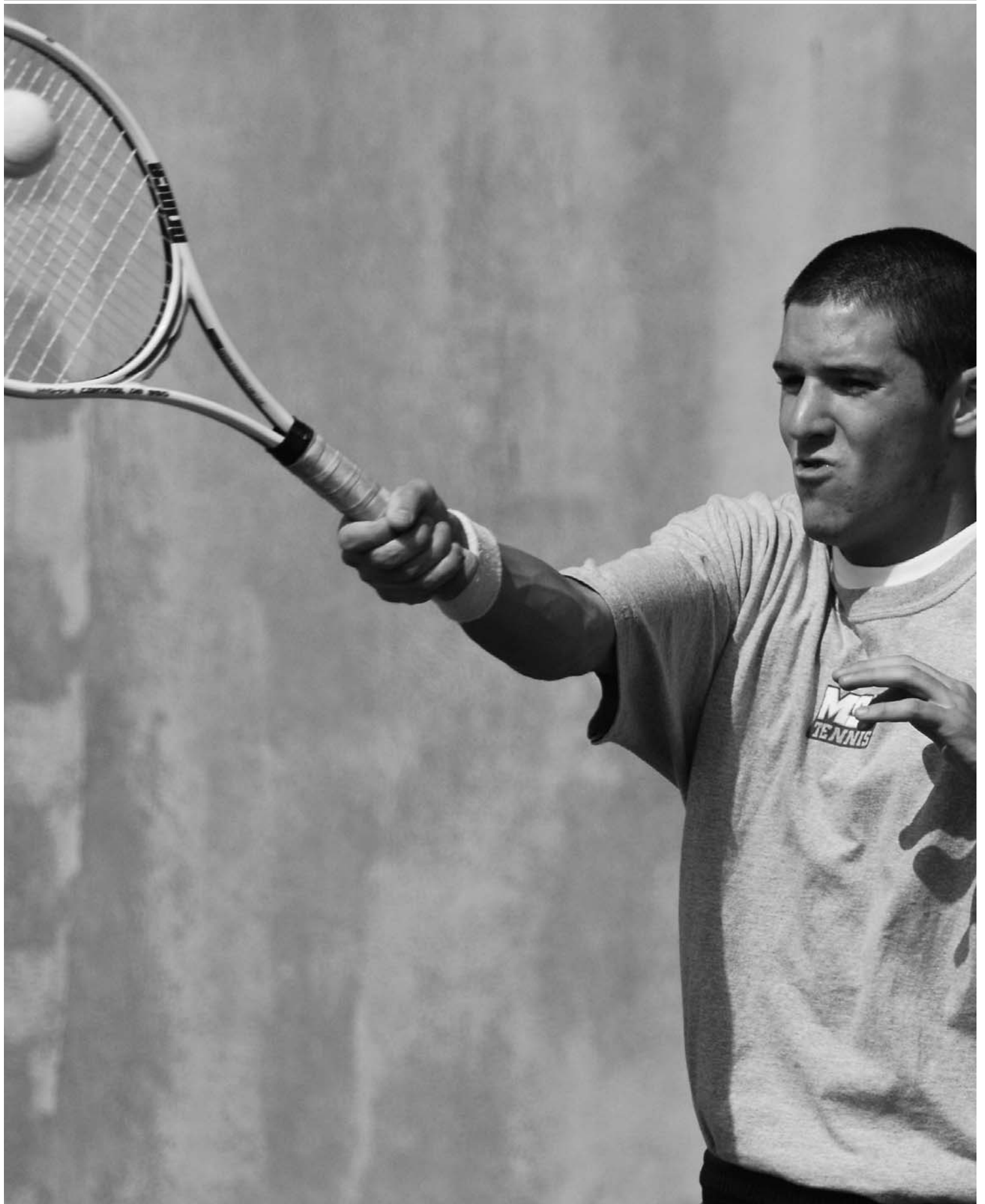

## 2008 OUTLOOK

The Mount looks to rebound in 2008 after a tough 2007 campaign. Last season saw the Lions finish 3-9 overall but go winless in the conference en route to a last place finish in the HCAC. This year's team hopes that the valuable experience earned by last season's young team will contribute to an improved finish this spring.

Head Coach Del Walters looks to turn around the results thanks in part to five returning players and three newcomers. The team looks to have good athleticism as Walters has helped coach five of the Mount's eight players on the basketball team.

In a competitive conference such as the HCAC, no match will prove to be easy. The Mount's schedule will also be a challenging test for this year's Lions. Five players that competed last season, and totaled 24 wins between them, will not return this season, having either graduated, left the program or used their eligibility.

"Our schedule will be tough," Walters states. "Outside of the conference we play Thomas More, Wilmington, Miami-Middletown twice, and Central State twice, all of which are very competitive. Each match will be a battle, in the conference, too, so we will have to learn from what we do every time we hit the court and continue to improve."

This season the Lions will mix a good group of returners with some promising first-year players. Aiming for an improved season for the Mount will be returners C.J. Knapp, Tim Moody, Travis Huffman, Robby Lykes, and Kyle McCord. Walters is also optimistic about this year's freshman athletes including Price Combs, Hilton Rodriguez and Ryan Tarvin.

"Price Combs could have the biggest impact as a freshman this season," Walters says. "He is a nice talent that should produce some solid play for us."

Overall, the Lions look to put last season's results behind them and focus on improvement for the upcoming season, and for the future.

"Our goals for this season are to continue the overall growth of the program," Coach Walters adds. "We did a decent job with our non-conference schedule last season, this season we intend to be more competitive within the conference and take another step towards competing for the conference championship."

## Head Coach Del Walters

Del Walters returns for his second season as a Mount men's head tennis coach. Walters is also the Lions' associate men's head basketball coach.

He came to the Mount from Thomas More College where he was a men's basketball assistant coach since 2000. He was also Thomas More's head men's tennis coach (2004-2005), guiding the team to a 7-5 record, and was the men's and women's head cross country coach (2005-2006). Walters also assisted the men's basketball team at John Carroll University as a graduate assistant coach (1999-2000) after playing for two seasons and being a student assistant coach for two seasons. He also has worked at Thomas More College, John Carroll University and Wittenberg University basketball camps.

The Lions' first-year coach is a 1994 graduate of Villa Angela- St. Joseph High School in Cleveland, Ohio, where his team won the Ohio Division II State Championship basketball title during his senior season. Walters was a second team all-district and honorable mention all-city basketball selection while in high school. He is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the Black Coaches Association.

Walters is a 1999 graduate of John Carroll University, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Communications degree. He resides in Ft. Mitchell, Kentucky.

## THE MOUNT IN THE HCAC

The Mount's tennis team is hoping to move up in the conference standings this season after finishing eighth last year. The Lions are entering their tenth season in the HCAC. Institutions that the Mount competes against include: Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University.

The Lions came in last place in 1999 with zero points, but greatly improved in 2000 and grabbed fifth place out of eight schools in the HCAC Tournament. They accumulated 28 points while the winner, Hanover, had 88.

In 2000 the Mount placed fourth out of seven teams. The Mount hosted the conference tournament in 2001 and finished in sixth place with 21 points. The Lions gained points from Eric Goshorn, Clint Adkins, Craig Hoerst, Ryan Coslett, Jake Potet, Alex Wehrum, and Jeff Hershner. Eric Goshorn was also named to the All-Conference team.

The 2002 season saw the Lions defeat Defiance College on the road, 6-3. The Mount captured 11 points in the tournament with a sixth-place singles finish by Jeff Hershner as well as seventh-place finishes from Ryan Coslett, Alex Wehrum and Marc Cruz. Cruz and teammate Jason Gilbert came together to finish in fifth place in the third doubles position while the Coslett/Wehrum team posted a seventh place finish in first doubles.

The Mount had a tough conference season in 2003, going 0-6 in HCAC play. Included in those matches was a 7-2 loss to Defiance College, where the Lions won at third singles and first doubles; and a 6-3 setback to Transylvania, where the Mount won three of six singles matches versus the Pioneers. The Lions did not face HCAC-foe Franklin College in 2003.

The Lions had another tough season in 2004, going 0-6 in the HCAC. They did not face-off with Franklin College last year but did compete against Hanover twice. Even though the Mount did not claim any HCAC wins in the regular season they did score points against Hanover College in each match-up. In the first match-up with Hanover, Joe Hartkemeyer won at second singles; in the second match-up Hartkemeyer won at first singles and Andrew Hall won at sixth singles.

The 2005 season saw the Mount go 1-10 overall and 0-6 in the HCAC. They did not win any sets in HCAC play during play last spring.

In 2006 the Lions finished with an overall record of 4-13. The Mount struggled early in the season, losing 12 of their first 14 matches and finished eighth in the HCAC tournament.

The Lions posted a 3-9 overall record in 2007 while going winless in the conference with an 0-6 record. They did not qualify for the HCAC tournament.
