ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT THE MOUNT

The Mount provides its students with athletic fields and the Harrington Center, a modern two-level student union with a running track, gym, fitness center, and food court. During the 2003-2004 academic year, the Mount began its Campus Expansion Plan, which includes athletic fields to accommodate more Mount teams on campus for practice and home games.

The Mount's East Fields on Delhi Road, which have been the home field for women's soccer, have been expanded into a game field and running track with seating for up to 2,400 spectators. The new Sports Complex gives the Mount Lions' football team its first home field on campus since 1990. It also provides a home field for women's soccer, men's soccer and lacrosse teams for men (2007) and women (2008). The track serves the Mount's track & field teams and additional facilities house the Mount's academic program in athletic training, as well as locker rooms and concessions. The Campus Expansion Plan also included the renovation of nearby College property into practice fields. The Lions' softball team began playing home games at the new River Road softball field in 2007.

The Mount Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field, one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators.

The Harrington Center, which opened in 1998, contains two full courts for Lions volleyball and basketball as well as the full range of Mount intramural teams. The Harrington Center also features a specially surfaced indoor running track; courts for racquetball, squash and walleyball; fitness center; weight training; athletic training; and locker facilities.

The Mount's west campus field, the J. Page Hayden Athletic Field, is the location for the Mount's field events during track & field meets and is a practice field for the Lions' Roar Marching Band. The Mount also provides lighted tennis courts for intercollegiate and intramural teams.

The Mount men's golf team's home course is Miami Whitewater Forest Golf Course in Harrison, Ohio. The course is a par-72, 6,808-yards course with a rating of 72.3 and a slope of 125.

MOUNT ATHLETICS DIRECTOR



Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 13th year as the Lions' athletic director for the 2007-2008 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount. The Lions captured three conference championships last fall. The football team won their third straight HCAC championship, and once again qualified to the NCAA Division III playoffs. The volleyball team was first in

the HCAC regular season and won their ninth straight HCAC Tournament title advancing them to the Great Lakes Regional. The baseball team won the HCAC Tournament title advancing to the Mideast Regional. The Mount also had men's lacrosse for the first time last spring.

In addition, there were plenty of other highlights, both individually and team-wise, for the Mount's athletic programs last season. The women's soccer team and men's basketball teams both had winning

season, as women's soccer advanced to the HCAC Tournament championship game. The Lions' wrestling team was second in the conference, fourth in the regional and sent two wrestlers to the NCAA Division III National Wrestling Tournament, recording two placers.

Radcliffe has long been a part of the sports programs at the Mount. A retired athletic trainer, Radcliffe began his athletic training career in 1976 and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition, Radcliffe has been the Lions' head athletic trainer, working with athletes from all the intercollegiate sports, as well as teaching athletic training at the College.

Radcliffe, who received his bachelor's degree in 1978 and his master's in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio), became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, Radcliffe stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount.

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

2007 SEASON OUTLOOK

After going winless with only one tie during their inaugural season in 2005, the Mount's men's soccer team improved last season, winning two games and tying two games. The team claimed its first-ever HCAC wins, with victories over Rose-Hulman and Franklin. Head Coach Carrie Taylor feels this season's team is ready to show marked improvement again in the win-loss column this fall.

Among the Lions' losses last season were three games they lost by 1-0 scores, two setbacks by 2-0 finals and a 3-1 loss. Four of those losses were to HCAC teams, and if the Mount can improve their offensive attack this season, those close outcomes might go more towards the Lions' way. The Mount played four overtime games in 2006, losing two and tying two others.

"We narrowed the margin of loss last season, but our record was not dramatically different than the year before," Taylor states. "Our level of playing in each game improved and that was due to the fact that our players having a year of experience under their belts."

Taylor said she sees a .500 record as a realistic goal for her team this fall. She's banking on her team's experience to help them win more of those closer games and make inroads toward their preseason goal. This season's preseason roster had 25 players, including three seniors and seven juniors. Many of the team's sophomore, junior and senior players were starting their second or third season of play for the Lions.

"I've told the guys we can not claim to be a new program anymore and use that as an excuse," Taylor adds. "I think they are ready for the challenge and they have worked hard in the off-season."

Two juniors, goalkeeper Austin Campbell and Rob Huesman, both juniors, will lead the Lions on and off the field again this fall. Campbell was a Second Team All-Conference selection last season,

while Huesman was an Academic All-Conference Team member. Campbell had his first collegiate shutout last season, a 1-0 home blanking over HCAC-foe Rose-Hulman and shaved nearly a goal per game allowed off his average from the season before. Huesman played in and started 16 games last fall and had a goal and assist while providing solid field play and direction.

While the Lions will have to make up for the loss of their top two goal scorers (and points scorers) from a season ago, Taylor feels that the team has a solid mix of returning players that could provide scoring and newcomers who will be scoring threats.

Huesman, along with junior Andrew Brockman, junior Ben Denier, and junior Jake Merkel, among others will lead this season's team from the midfield area back to the defense. A few of these players will also be counted on to help improve the team's goal-scoring.

"We are looking at increasing our scoring output," Taylor adds. "We think we are pretty solid on defense and we have Campbell in goal, with someone who will push him. We have brought in some players that could have an immediate impact in both scoring and others areas on the team."

Taylor said she thinks the team has a good core of players and was happy with how the recruiting went this past off-season. Of the 25 players on the preseason roster, 11 are first-year players.

As for how she thinks the conference will wind up, Taylor mentioned Transylvania, Rose-Hulman and Manchester as probably the top teams heading into the 2007 campaign. She's hoping that her team will be able to sneak up on some opponents this season.

"I think teams will look past us again this season and we may surprise some of them," Taylor adds. "They're excited about the season starting and so am I."

2007 COACHING STAFF



Head Coach Carrie Taylor

Carrie Taylor begins her third season with the Mount's men's soccer team in 2007. Taylor was hired in December 2004 as the school's first full-time head soccer coach, heading up both the women's and men's programs at the Mount.

The Lions' coach has a variety of soccer coaching experience. She came to the Mount from Milford High School, where she was the girls' coach from 2001 through 2004. She was an assistant coach at Division I Xavier University (1999-2001) and was involved with youth and Olympic Development soccer for nearly 10 years. She also was an assistant coach at Division I Temple University (1997).

In addition, coach Taylor has worked with Kentucky, Nevada and Hawaii ODP teams, has been the Alaska ODP State Team head

coach and is a Regional II staff coach. She has recently been named United States Adult Soccer Association Women's Region II Select Team coach and USASA National Staff Assistant coach. Taylor also has a United States Soccer Federation A License and National Youth License, and is a licensing clinician in Ohio and Kentucky.

Taylor has a bachelor's degree in biology from the University of Michigan, a master's degree in sport administration from Wayne State University and an alternative teaching certificate in life science.

She played on the University of Michigan club soccer team (1990-1994) and was a member of the Wolverines' inaugural varsity team in 1994. She played in the USWISL (United States Women's Independent Soccer League) in 1996 for the Columbus Zigx and in the WUSL (Women's United Soccer League) in 2000 for the Kentucky Fillies.

She resides in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Assistant Coach Leah Miller

Leah Todd returns to the Mount for her third season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams. She is currently enrolled at the Mount and is working toward a second bachelor's degree (athletic training), which she expects to complete in 2008.

Todd is a December 2003 graduate of Seton Hall University, where she was a four-year starter for the Division I Pirates. She was a team co-captain her senior season and was named to the Big East All-Academic Team for three years. She also graduated with the record for most saves in a Big East Conference Tournament. Todd received a Bachelor of Arts in Social and Behavioral Science degree.

She was an undergraduate assistant coach for Seton Hall in 2003, assisting with the team's goalkeepers and team conditioning.

The Lions' assistant coach played for the Cincinnati Ladyhawks amateur soccer team in the WUSL for five years, after playing briefly for the Atlanta Beat in the now-defunct professional WUSA. Todd has also worked at local soccer camps, and has served as a goalkeeper coach.

Assistant Coach Rudy Argueta

Rudy Argueta begins his first season as an assistant coach for the Lions' soccer team. He is a 2002 graduate of NAIA Union College in Barbourville, Kentucky, where he was a four-year starter. While at Union, he was the first player in school history to score 40 goals and have 40 assists. He was a First Team All-Conference selection from 1999-2001, a two-time team captain, team MVP in 2000, and was honored with All-Region and All-American Honorable Mention Awards in 1999. Argueta graduated with a triple major, business administration, sports management and physical education, and a minor in economics.

Argueta, a midfielder, also has professional soccer experience with the Columbus Crew in 2002 and played for Info Sport at the Professional Soccer Combine (All-Star team) in 2002. Furthermore, he played with two different teams in the Professional Development League and the U-12 Guatemala National Youth Team from 1989 to 1991.

He has most recently been the varsity boys' assistant soccer coach at Turpin High School in Cincinnati, Ohio, as well as the junior varsity head coach for the past four years. In addition he has coached youth soccer and has been active in working many prestigious soccer camps around the country. Argueta has also worked as a personal soccer coach, training individuals, club teams and high school teams. He is currently the U-16 Cardinals Soccer Club's head coach.

2007 SEASON OUTLOOK

The Mount has played in the HCAC Championship game the last two seasons, and after winning the conference tournament title in 2005 and finishing second last season, look ready to make another run at the conference tournament championship and qualifying to the NCAA Division III Tournament.

To accomplish that, the Lions will have to overcome the loss of their top two scorers from last season, as well as their starting goalkeeper. The team also has a tough non-conference schedule, in addition to an always demanding HCAC slate of games. The Mount will take on non-conference foes Calvin, Ohio Wesleyan and Hope, along with Wittenberg and Wilmington. Head Coach Carrie Taylor said she boosted the non-conference schedule to get the team ready for the HCAC Tournament and a run at the post-season NCAA Tournament.

"It is always a challenge to see who will step up and replace players that have graduated," says Taylor of her team's key personnel losses. "I think we will be less predictable offensively, and more balanced. It will be a challenge to the returning players to see who is ready to rise up and show improvement."

Taylor hopes to rely on a solid group of returners - many of whom went to the NCAA Tournament in 2005 after the Lions won the HCAC Tournament with a 2-0 win over Transylvania. The Mount lost last season to Transylvania, 3-1, in the HCAC Tournament final and look to make-up for that setback.

Junior forward Beth Schuermann, who was third on the team last season with six goals and 17 points, looks to lead the offensive charge for the Mount this season. She was a Second-Team All-Conference selection last season. Among others who will be expected to pace the Mount's charge this season, both offensively and defensively, are junior midfielder Allie Pirman, sophomore defender Laurie Neumann and junior goalkeeper Kelly Bare. Pirman is in her third year of play for the Mount while Neumann was a Second Team All-HCAC selection in 2006. Bare is a transfer from NCAA Division II Northern Kentucky University. Taylor is also looking for

her other five first-year players, all freshmen, to make an impact in 2007.

"Last season was successful but we did fall short of winning the conference," Taylor adds. "Many of our returners know what it's like to be a conference champion and to also come up one step short from a championship."

Taylor thinks the conference race will come down to her team, Transylvania and Rose-Hulman. A strong finish in the HCAC along with some key wins against non-conference competition this season should help the Mount become a more recognizable team among the top Great Lakes teams. With one senior and eight juniors on this season's roster, the Lions look poised to make it happen.

MOUNT IN THE HCAC

This season marks the Mount's tenth season of action in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. While a member of the conference, the Lions have been an HCAC power, competing against Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University. Their overall record during their time spent in the conference is 57-10-7. That mark includes five outright conference titles and one shared HCAC title.

In 1998, the Lions' first year in the HCAC, the Mount and Wilmington were co-champions with a record of 5-1-1. There was not a conference tournament that year, but many Mount players were recognized for outstanding achievement. Three players were named First Team All-Conference, one player was named Second Team All-Conference, Mandy Blazer was co-MVP of the conference, and Head Coach Sam Pogoni was named Coach of the Year. The Lions placed second in the regular season with a 5-1 record in 1999, falling just short to Wilmington, who compiled a 6-0 mark. In the HCAC Tournament, the Mount went 3-0, defeating Wilmington by a 1-0 score, giving the Lions the Tournament Championship. Many Mount players were acknowledged for their accomplishments in 1999 as three players were named First Team All-Conference and one player received an Honorable Mention Award.

In 2000, the Lions swept the conference 6-0 and won the end of the season tournament. They went 2-0 in the tournament defeating Anderson 5-0 for the championship. As in previous years, the Mount had a number of players that received awards. Lisa Sutton was named Player of the Year. Sutton and two other players were named First Team All-Conference and two players were named Second Team All-Conference.

In 2001, the Mount placed second behind an undefeated Transylvania team in regular season play with a 5-1 record, but fought back to win the Conference Championship to qualify for the NCAA Division III Regional Tournament. The Lions again received many honors including three All-Conference nominees. In addition, Lisa Sutton was also awarded Academic All-Conference, Verizon Academic All-District, NSCAA All-Ohio, and Conference Player of the Week twice. Jill Miller was also an HCAC Player of the Week honoree and Sam Pogoni was named Coach of the Year.

The Lions won five of seven games in the conference in 2002 (with one tie against defending regular season champion Transylvania). The team's lone setback in regular season play came by a 1-0 score at Hanover College. The Mount avenged that loss by defeating the Panthers 2-0 in the Conference Championship game. Three Mount

players, Erin Fox, Erin Mallory and Lindsay Doll were named All-Conference.

The Lions slipped a bit in conference play during the 2003 season, but still compiled a .500 record with a 3-3-1 mark. That record left them in a fifth place tie with Defiance, as they missed qualifying to the post-season HCAC Tournament for the first time ever. The Mount scored the second most goals in conference-only games. Michele Philips was selected for All-Conference Honors.

After a one-year absence from the HCAC Tournament, the Mount returned to the conference post-season competition in 2004, but dropped a 1-0 double overtime game to eventual HCAC Tournament Champion Manchester. The Lions' defense posted three shutouts in conference play, and qualified to the HCAC Tournament by blanking Bluffton, 6-0, collecting the third seed in the tournament. A conference-tying best total of five players received All-Conference recognition: Margie Pfister, Jessey Spradlin, Lori Sullivan, Michele Phillips, and Sarah Lamping.

Over the course of the 2005 season, the Mount compiled a record of 13-6-2, including a 5-0-2 HCAC record, and steamed rolled to yet another conference championship. Leading the way for the Lions in 2005 was Jessey Spradlin, who tallied nine goals in conference games and was named the HCAC Most Valuable Player. Other players receiving First Team All-Conference recognition were Sandy Rack, Katie Henlein, Michele Phillips, Kristi Poling, and Amanda Hauck. Hauck had an HCAC-best four shutouts in conference play. Head Coach Carrie Taylor was named as HCAC Coach of the Year.

The Lions recorded another stellar season of play in the HCAC last fall, when they rolled to a 7-1 record, good for second place in the conference. The Mount out-scored their opponents 41-5 in HCAC play. The Lions defeated Rose-Hulman in the first round of the HCAC Tournament, 3-1, but fell in the Conference Championship game to Transylvania by an identical score. Jessey Spradlin, who led the conference in points per game, and goals, and was tied for second in assists, was voted HCAC Most Valuable Player for the second straight season. She also won three Conference Player of the Week awards. Mount teammates Katie Henlein, Beth Schuermann and Sarah Thaxton were among the offensive statistical leaders while Becky Thaxton was second in goals against average and shutouts, and tied for sixth in saves, as well as HCAC co-Freshman of the Year. Sandy Rack, Kristi Poling, Spradlin and Henlein were named First Team All-Conference while Laurie Neumann and Schuermann were selected Second Team All-HCAC. As a team, the Lions were first in the conference in points, goals and assists, as well as second in goals against average and tied for second in shutouts.
