ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT THE MOUNT

The Mount provides its students with athletic fields and the Harrington Center, a modern two-level student union with a running track, gym, fitness center, and food court. During the 2003-2004 academic year, the Mount began its "Building Excitement" Campaign, which included athletic fields to accommodate more Mount teams on campus for practice and home games.

On the east side of the Mount's campus, the Lions have the Sports Complex and Schueler Field, home to the College's football, soccer, lacrosse, and track & field programs. The Sports Complex seats up to 2,400 spectators and additional facilities house the Mount's academic program in athletic training, as well as locker rooms and concessions. The "Building Excitement" Campaign, which included the renovation of nearby College property into practice fields on River Road, has given the Lions' softball team a home field – the Kinder Morgan Softball Complex, and practice fields for the College's baseball, soccer, football and lacrosse teams.

The Mount Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field in Amelia, Ohio, one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for

teams and spectators. They also play home games at the University of Cincinnati's Marge Schott Stadium, one of the top collegiate settings in the Midwest.

The Harrington Center, which opened in 1998, contains two full courts for Lions' volleyball and basketball as well as the full range of Mount intramural teams. The Harrington Center also features a specially-surfaced indoor running track; courts for racquetball, squash and wallyball; fitness center; weight training; athletic training; and locker facilities. The Mount's wrestling team also has home matches and invitationals in the Harrington Center.

The Mount's west campus field, the J. Page Hayden Athletic Field, is the location for the Mount's field events during track & field meets and is a practice field for the Lion's Roar Band. The Mount also provides lighted tennis courts for intercollegiate and intramural teams.

The Mount men's golf team's home course is Miami Whitewater Forest Golf Course in Harrison, Ohio. The course is a par-72, 6,808-yards course with a rating of 72.3 and a slope of 125. The women's golf team's home course is Aston Oaks Course in North Bend, Ohio.

MOUNT ATHLETICS DIRECTOR



Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe entered his 14th year as the Lions' athletic director for the 2008-2009 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount.

The Mount's athletics programs enjoyed many successes this past fall. Football finished the season with a 5-5 overall record, the seventh straight season for the Lions to finish with a .500 or better record. The

Women's Soccer team, which won the HCAC with a perfect 8-0 season in the HCAC, captured the HCAC Tournament Championship to qualify to the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Regional. The 14 wins they had were a school single-season record. The Volleyball Team, a regular member of the AVCA Coaches Poll Top 25, finished with a 29-11 record, won the HCAC Regular Season title with a 7-1 record and also won the HCAC Tournament. The Lions received an automatic qualification to the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Regional where they knocked off Washington & Lee University.

The Lions' winter athletic teams, men's and women's basketball, and wrestling, were engaged in competitive seasons and looking to move on to the Conference Tournaments and perhaps beyond. Many individuals were enjoying strong seasons.

Radcliffe, who oversees 21 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. A retired athletic trainer, Radcliffe began his athletic training career in 1976 and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition, Radcliffe has been the Lions' head athletic trainer, working with athletes from all the intercollegiate sports, as well as teaching athletic training at the College.

Radcliffe, who received his bachelor's degree in 1978 and his master's in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio), became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, Radcliffe stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount. Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

2009 OUTLOOK

The Lions will look to continue the superb success of recent years in 2009. Last season, the Lions finished with a conference-best record of 16-5 while posting an overall mark of 24-18. Finishing the regular season in first place, the Lions had the honor of hosting the HCAC Tournament. The home field advantage, however, proved to be no aid to the Lions and they were swept out of the HCAC Tournament by consecutive losses to eventual champion Transylvania University and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology.

This year, the team hopes to continue their winning ways deeper into the post-season.

“Some of our goals, this year and every year, are to win the HCAC Regular Season and the HCAC Tournament,” says Head Coach Chuck Murray. “We also hope to make it into the NCAA Division III tournament.

This year’s team appears poised to make those goals a reality. Seven of their top 10 hitters are back this season, including the top two, senior outfielder Nick Weimer and sophomore outfielder Ben Stroube. Weimer, who had a .369 batting average, clouting 62 hits with a team-best 39 RBI was selected Second Team All-HCAC last season while Stroube, who had a .356 batting average and a team-high 17 doubles, was named HCAC Freshman of the Year. Sophomore outfielder Ryan Rodriguez (Second Team All-HCAC) and junior third baseman Matt Flamm (Honorable Mention All-Conference) add to the team’s expected starting core of position players.

Seniors Todd Schwertman and Zach Grove, junior Steve Matre, and sophomore Ben Hunterman headline the Mount’s returning pitchers for 2009. The first three combined for 10 wins while Matre had 10 saves and a 0.84 ERA last season. Schwertman was a Second Team All-HCAC honoree last season while Grove was named Honorable Mention All-Conference. Matre, last year’s HCAC MVP, was also named a D3baseball.com First Team All-American last spring and has been selected a 2009 D3baseball.com Preseason Honorable Mention selection.

“We have worked very hard on perhaps our biggest weakness last season, our defense,” states Murray. “There were far too many errors in the infield. This year, we have a new middle infield that we hope will be strong defensively and help us cut down on out error total.”

Among those players that will be competing to shore up those middle infield spots this spring and hold down starting positions are: freshman Josh Denny, sophomore Scott Gesenhues, sophomore John Pasquale, and sophomore Drew Williams. The Mount committed 108 errors overall last season, compared to 85 for their opponents. Their error total was up from the 84 miscues during the 2007 season.

While Murray hopes they have shored up their most glaring weakness from last season – their defense – the Lions have also taken many measures to insure that they will be the strongest team on the diamond this season. The Lions have a large influx of first-year players on the roster in 2009.

“We expect to have ten new athletes this season,” explains Murray. “We also expect all of our new athletes to be able to contribute to this team. We have a new talent at virtually every position.”

First base is expected to be handled by either sophomore Chris Hall or junior transfer Mark Lakas. Freshman Robbie Lubanski will add depth for the Lions at third base this spring. In the outfield, junior Jesse Meadors, and sophomore Trace Norton give the Lions good depth. Sophomore Jake Daugherty and freshman transfer Kyle Ottaway, as well as Stroube, give the team good overall depth at the catching position.

As for the pitching staff, the Lions appear to have a good collection of both experience returners and hopeful newcomers. Those returning from last season and hoping to see action this season are: senior Brian Farrell, freshman red-shirt Robert Layne, sophomore Troy Lippert, senior Tim Murphy, and sophomore

George Raggets. First-year pitching staff members are freshman Ryan Beard, sophomore transfer Brandon Bouley, freshman Drew Ernst, and freshman Mitch Morgan.

The team will need to rely on its depth to get them through the rigors of the long baseball season. The Lions will face a very tough schedule, both in and out of the conference.

“As always we will face a very strong conference this year,” Murray adds. “We hope to play well enough this season to place among the top four of our very tough conference.

In the 2009 HCAC Baseball Coaches Preseason Poll, the Lions were chosen fourth, picking up two, first-place votes. Franklin College, Rose-Hulman and Transylvania were the top three teams in the poll. Anderson, Manchester, Bluffton, Hanover and Defiance rounded out the poll. Franklin (3), Rose-Hulman (2) and Transylvania (2) picked up the other first-place votes.

COACHING STAFF



Head Coach Chuck Murray

Chuck Murray enters his 13th season as the Lions head coach and his 16th season overall with the Mount's baseball program. Coach Murray has been with the program since its inaugural season of 1994, when he served as an assistant coach. In 2008, the Mount recorded a 24-18 overall record and won the HCAC regular season championship with a 16-5 mark. The season was capped by Murray winning the HCAC Coach of the Year award. It was the program's 13th consecutive non-losing season, and 11th season of 24 or more wins. The HCAC Tournament appearance was the sixth straight accomplishment, and their eighth overall HCAC Tournament appearance in ten seasons.

In 2007, the Mount recorded a school-record 33-11 mark, and qualified to the HCAC Tournament, winning the HCAC Championship for the second consecutive season (going undefeated at 3-0). They moved on to the NCAA Division III Mid-East Regional, where they lost two, one-run games. It was their third NCAA Division III post-season appearance over an eight-year time period. The 30-plus wins marked back-to-back 30-win seasons, after a 30-17 mark in 2006.

Murray was also named Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2003 as the Mount recorded a 17-4 regular season HCAC mark and first place finish. In addition, Murray helped lead the Mount to a 27-15 overall mark and runner-up finish in the HCAC Tournament in 2003 and again in 2004.

In 2000 the Lions were the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference champions and Division III Regional runner-up. Murray, who has helped place the Mount baseball program among the top schools in the country, has a 315-190 career record at the Mount, giving him a winning percentage of .623. The Lions have been a member of the HCAC since the 1999 season.

Murray has coached three All-Americans while at the Mount, Mark Schorsch (1999), Mark Sheppard (2003) and Steve Matre (2008), and five of his former players have been signed to professional baseball contracts: Mike Ayers (1996), Mike McNutt (2000), Dennis McRoberts (2003), Jason Miller (2004), and Michael Mayer (2007). In addition, he has coached 12 All-Region, 78 All-Conference players, and two conference Most Valuable Players while at the Mount.

Also working against the team's goal of a 25-win season will be the intense non-conference schedule they will face. Murray feels that the team's trip to Florida where they will take on opponents such as Heidelberg College, Ohio Wesleyan University, Mount Union College, Wittenberg University, Albion College, and Suffolk University will prove a tough early season challenge for the Lions.

To prepare themselves the team has worked very hard this off-season to be in the best possible shape that they can be. Murray feels that they have accomplished this and will be ready to go opening day. Overall, Murray and his staff feel very good about the upcoming season.

“We are very optimistic,” Murray states. “We have quite a few transfers and good depth in both the infield and the outfield. I feel all the pieces are in place for us to make a good run and have a successful season.”

Murray began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, Cincinnati's Colerain High School, in 1984, under veteran hall of fame coach Don Colussi. He helped guide the Cardinals' baseball program for three seasons and in 1987 he assisted St. Xavier High School Hall of Fame head coach Bill Slinger until 1993. While at Colerain, Murray helped lead teams to district runner-up and regional runner-up finishes. His St. Xavier teams finished twice as GCL champions, as well as two-time district runner-ups and a sectional runner-up finish.

In 1999, Murray led the Midland Braves to the 1999 Dizzy Dean World Series Championship. He also guided Braves' teams to World Series appearances in 1989, 1991, 1995, and 1998. After coaching in the Midland ranks for 14 seasons, Murray stepped down as a coach and now serves primarily as an advisor to the program. In addition, Murray has coached former players turned pro: Chris Sexton (Cincinnati Reds), Chris Hook (San Francisco Giants), Ricky Stone (Cincinnati Reds), Sam McConnell (Atlanta Braves), Aaron Cook (Colorado Rockies), Mike Hill (GM Florida Marlins), Ahmed Plummer (San Francisco 49ers, NFL). He also has had former college coaches under his tutelage that have moved on to coach high school, collegiate or summer team programs.

Coach Murray earned a bachelor's degree in education from Northern Kentucky University and received a master's degree from Xavier University. He resides in Colerain Township with his wife, Melissa, ten-year-old twin sons Ryan and Patrick, and eight-year-old daughter Elizabeth.

Los Angeles Dodgers scout Tom Keefe, who scouted and signed former Mount pitcher Mike McNutt to a professional contract with the Florida Marlins in 2000, had this to say about the Lions' baseball program:

“The Mount's coaching staff is special because of the leadership of Coach Murray and all his assistants,” said Keefe, who was a Marlins scout for nine years and has been with the Dodgers for six years. “Coach Murray has assembled a fine coaching staff, which produces the opportunity for young men to attend the Mount and get dramatically better.”

Assistant Coach Jeff Newman

Jeff Newman enters his first season as associate head coach and his seventh overall season as an assistant coach for the Mount. He will once again be the team's hitting coach, third base coach, recruiting coordinator, and camp coordinator along with being in charge of the strength and conditioning program and developing practice plans. Newman has also been an assistant baseball coach at the University of Cincinnati where he was in charge of outfielders and coaching first base. Coach Newman was hired in July 2005 by the College as a full-time coach, with the duties of head women's golf coach and assistant baseball coach. As hitting coach, the squad has set team records in batting average, hits, RBI, total bases, doubles, triples, and at-bats.

Coach Newman helped guide his teams to success on the national level, as evidenced by winning the National Championship in 2005 and two CABA Wood Bat World Series second-place finishes in 2003 and 2005. During his six years as head coach of the Midland Indians, Newman has coached eight players that have gone on to play professional baseball.

Coach Newman has also been a member of the American Baseball Coaches Association for over five years. Newman and his wife, Michelle, and two-year-old twin daughters, Bree and Corrine, reside in Cincinnati, Ohio.



Assistant Coach Jason Kammer

Assistant Coach Jason Miller

Jason Miller returns for his fifth season with the Lions. Miller graduated from the Mount in 2000 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. Miller's responsibilities include coaching the outfielders and being a bench coach, as well as helping out with base running and being involved with recruiting. THE MOUNT IN THE HCAC

The Lions' baseball team begins their 11th year in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. Other conference institutions they compete against include: Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University. The Mount has a 117-75 regular season record in HCAC play and has finished in third place or higher in eight of the 10 seasons they have been in the conference. The Lions have a .500 or better record against six of their eight HCAC opponents.

In 1999 the Mount ended the season in second place, falling short of first place by two wins, but qualifying to their first HCAC Tournament. The Lions led the conference in fielding and were third in batting. Mike McNutt was second in the conference in strikeouts while Mark Schorsch was second with runs scored and first in stolen bases. Ben Miller, Schorsch and McNutt were named to the All-Conference team while Mike Cronin, Chris McKeever, Jeremy Viltro, Tom Taulbee, and Steve Jostworth were Honorable Mention All-Conference selections.

In 2000 the Lions tied for second place in the HCAC and won the end of the year HCAC Tournament by defeating Anderson University, 9-1, in the finals. They led the conference in ERA and fielding percentage, while placing in the top three in batting average, runs scored, RBI, home runs, stolen bases, and saves. Many members of the Lions' baseball team were recognized for their accomplishments. McNutt, McKeever, Ben Miller, and Schorsch were named to the All-Conference team, while Robert Barnes, Mike Cronin, Sam Merkel, and Jason Miller were named to Honorable Mention All-HCAC. During 2000 Ben Miller and Jason Miller were Players of the Week.

2001 saw the Lions finish in fourth place but lose out on gaining the final HCAC Tournament spot to Manchester due to the tie-breaker. There were, however, many highlights during the season. The Mount placed in the top three in on-base percentage, saves, innings pitched, and fielding percentage. Dennis McRoberts pitched a perfect game against Defiance – the only perfect game in HCAC history. Again in 2001 many players were honored for their skills and abilities, including Jeremy Viltro and McRoberts as All-Conference members and Tom Taulbee, Cronin, Scott Jones, and Nick Donley as Honorable Mention All-Conference members. Cronin was named Player of the Week, while Dennis McRoberts was named Player of the Week twice.

The Mount finished sixth in the HCAC in 2002 with a 9-12 record. Although they missed out on appearing in the conference tournament, 2002 included many highlights during the regular season. The Lions played many close games against conference foes. Four of their losses were by one run, and three were by two runs. The Mount placed in the top three in nine categories in the conference statistics including first in total plate appearances and runners picked off. Mike Cronin led the HCAC in on-base percentage, and Mark Sheppard was third in runs scored and tied for second in doubles. Mike Cronin received First Team All-Conference honors while Steve Jostworth, Chris McKeever, Sam Merkle, Ben Miller, and Sheppard received Honorable Mention awards. McKeever was also named Player of the Week. The Lions ended the season strong, sweeping Transylvania University in a three-game series.

The Lions rolled off a stellar 17-4 record in 2003 and captured the HCAC regular season title. The Mount posted a winning record against every HCAC team, including 3-0 sweeps over Defiance, Bluffton and second-place Anderson. Head Coach Chuck Murray, who guided the team to their first-ever regular season championship, was named HCAC Coach of the Year. The Mount was picked fifth in the conference coach's preseason poll. The Lions, the top seed

for the HCAC Tournament, started out the post-season 2-0 but dropped two championship games to Anderson. In addition, Mark Sheppard picked up Most Valuable Player honors in the conference. Four other teammates, Sam Merkle, Ben Miller, Donny Nagel, and Ryan Desjardins were named First-Team All-Conference. Three other Mount players picked up All-Conference honors while three different players were selected for Player of the Week awards. The Lions were statistically well-represented among the top hitters and pitchers in the HCAC, while the team led all HCAC teams (in conference games only) in batting average, runs scored, doubles, walks, RBI, hit by pitch, sacrifice flies, and on-base percentage. They were second in hits and ERA.

In 2004, the Lions had an up-and-down season in the conference. After winning in their first conference match up of the season versus Defiance, they dropped three straight HCAC games. Following a three-game sweep at Bluffton, the Lions collected a win against Anderson to open a series that brought their record to 8-5 in the conference, the most games over .500 they would go all season in conference play. Following the AU win they dropped four straight HCAC contests before regrouping to grab the second seed in the HCAC Tournament. The Lions defeated Franklin College in two of three games to end the regular season and also defeated the Grizzlies to open the HCAC Tournament. The Mount then defeated top seed Manchester, but fell to Manchester twice in the championship game to finish as tournament runner-ups. Dave Novosel and Marc Terwilliger were named First Team All-Conference while six teammates were selected to either the Second Team or Honorable Mention.

The Mount produced another successful HCAC season in 2005. The Lions swept both Anderson and Defiance in series action, three games to none, and won two of three games against Bluffton. The Mount grabbed the third seed for the HCAC post-season tournament by defeating Hanover in the last weekend series. Two of their three games scheduled against Manchester during the regular season were rained out and not rescheduled. They then went on to post a 1-2 record in the HCAC Tournament. Seven Lions gained All-HCAC honors, led by First-Team senior outfielder Marc Terwilliger. The Mount was second among HCAC teams in ERA, with a 2.73 in conference games. Zach Grove led the way for the Mount, finishing second in the conference with a 1.93 ERA in HCAC-only games. Joel Steinmetz was second in the conference with seven stolen bases. In 2006, after finishing in a four-way tie for second place, grabbed the fourth and final seed with two dramatic, weekend-doubleheader sweeps over Bluffton University and Transylvania University. At that point their remarkable post-season run started, as they went 3-0 in the Conference Tournament, including a 2-1 victory over nationally-ranked Manchester in conference final. Michael Mayer was named Second Team All-HCAC while teammates Nick Katsetos, Ryan Meyer, Neil Gamble, and Mike Elsasser were Honorable Mention All-Conference. Justin Ziemann, Mayer and Gamble picked up HCAC Player of the Week awards.

The Mount finished with the second-best record in the conference in 2007, going 15-7 just behind first place Transylvania (16-6). The Lions swept through the HCAC Tournament, winning all three games by outscoring their opponents 17-7, to move on to the NCAA Regional Tournament. Michael Mayer and Seth DeBra claimed First Team All-HCAC honors while teammates Ryan Meyer, Joe Imhoff and Nick Weimer were named Second Team All-Conference. Six other Mount players won Honorable Mention All-Conference. The Mount also had five players named either HCAC hitter or pitcher of the week during the season.

The Lions claimed the HCAC regular season last season with a 16-5 record, finishing one-half games ahead of Franklin College, and grabbed the top seed and host for the HCAC Tournament. They started out HCAC play with a 5-0 mark, and had 3-0 season series sweeps over both Anderson and Defiance. The Mount also made a clean sweep of the post-season HCAC individual awards, with pitcher Steve Matre winning the MVP award, outfielder Ben Stroube won Freshman of the Year and Head Coach Chuck Murray was honored as conference Coach of the Year. Seth DeBra, Nick Weimer, Todd Schwertman and Ryan Rodriguez were named Second Team

All-Conference while Matt Flamm, Robert Urmston, Justin Ziemann and Zach Grove were selected Honorable Mention All-HCAC. Ziemann also picked up an HCAC Player of the Week award. In the statistical team categories, for HCAC games only, the Lions were second in earned run average, third in on base percentage, and fourth in batting average, slugging percentage and runs scored. Matre was first in the conference in saves while Stroube led the HCAC in doubles. Stroube was also fourth in the HCAC in batting average and slugging percentage. DeBra was third in hits while Rodriguez was third in runs scored.
