## ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT THE MOUNT

The Mount provides its students with athletic fields and the Harrington Center, a modern two-level student union with a running track, gym, fitness center, and food court. During the 2003-2004 academic year, the Mount began its Campus Expansion Plan, which includes athletic fields to accommodate more Mount teams on campus for practice and home games.

The Mount's East Fields on Delhi Road, which have been the home field for women's soccer, have been expanded into a game field and running track with seating for up to 2,400 spectators. The new Sports Complex gives the Mount Lions' football team its first home field on campus since 1990. It also provides a home field for women's soccer, men's soccer and lacrosse teams for men (2007) and women (2009). The track serves the Mount's track & field teams and additional facilities house the Mount's academic program in athletic training, as well as locker rooms and concessions. The Campus Expansion Plan also included the renovation of nearby College property into practice fields. The Lions' softball team began playing home games at the new River Road softball field in 2007.

The Mount Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field, one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators.

The Harrington Center, which opened in 1998, contains two full courts for Lions volleyball and basketball as well as the full range of Mount intramural teams. The Harrington Center also features a specially surfaced indoor running track; courts for racquetball, squash and walleyball; fitness center; weight training; athletic training; and locker facilities.

The Mount's west campus field, the J. Page Hayden Athletic Field, is the location for the Mount's field events during track & field meets and is a practice field for the Lions' Roar Marching Band. The Mount also provides lighted tennis courts for intercollegiate and intramural teams.

The Mount men's golf team's home course is Miami Whitewater Forest Golf Course in Harrison, Ohio. The course is a par-72, 6,808-yards course with a rating of 72.3 and a slope of 125. The women's golf team's home course is Aston Oaks Course in North Bend, Ohio.

## MOUNT ATHLETICS DIRECTOR



### Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 14th year as the Lions' athletic director for the 2008-2009 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount. The Lions' volleyball team finished in a tie for first place in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference last fall while the Lions football team finished as runner-ups in the HCAC regular season and qualified to their fourth

straight NCAA Division III playoffs. Women's soccer also advanced to the HCAC Semifinals while the men's soccer team enjoyed their best season to date, narrowly missing qualifying to the Conference Tournament. The women's tennis team finished with seven wins, their most since the 1997 season. The Lions' wrestling team finished 13-5-1 in duals, including an 11-1-1 mark against Division III schools, and ended the season ranked 21st in the country. The baseball team won the HCAC regular season, and advanced as the top seed and host to the Conference Tournament while the softball team qualified to the HCAC Tournament and played in the championship game, losing in extra innings.

In addition, there were plenty of other highlights, both individually and team-wise, for the Mount's athletic programs in 2007-2008.

Radcliffe, who oversees 21 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. A retired athletic trainer, Radcliffe began his athletic training career in 1976 and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition, Radcliffe has been the Lions' head athletic trainer, working with athletes from all the intercollegiate sports, as well as teaching athletic training at the College.

Radcliffe, who received his bachelor's degree in 1978 and his master's in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio), became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, Radcliffe stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount.

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

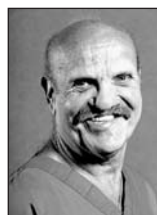

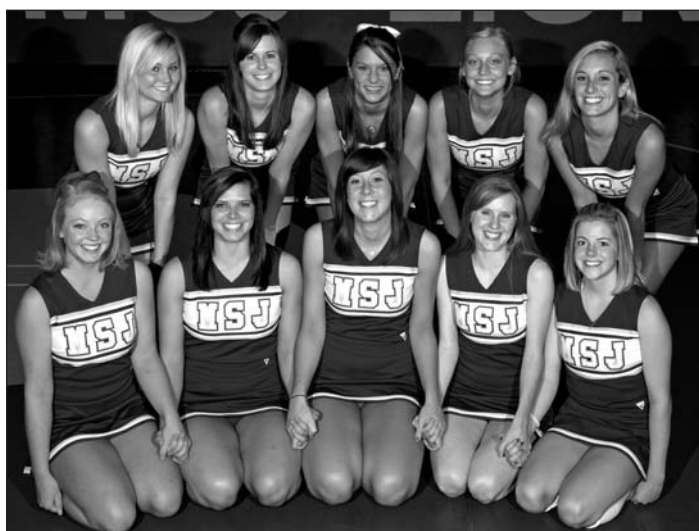

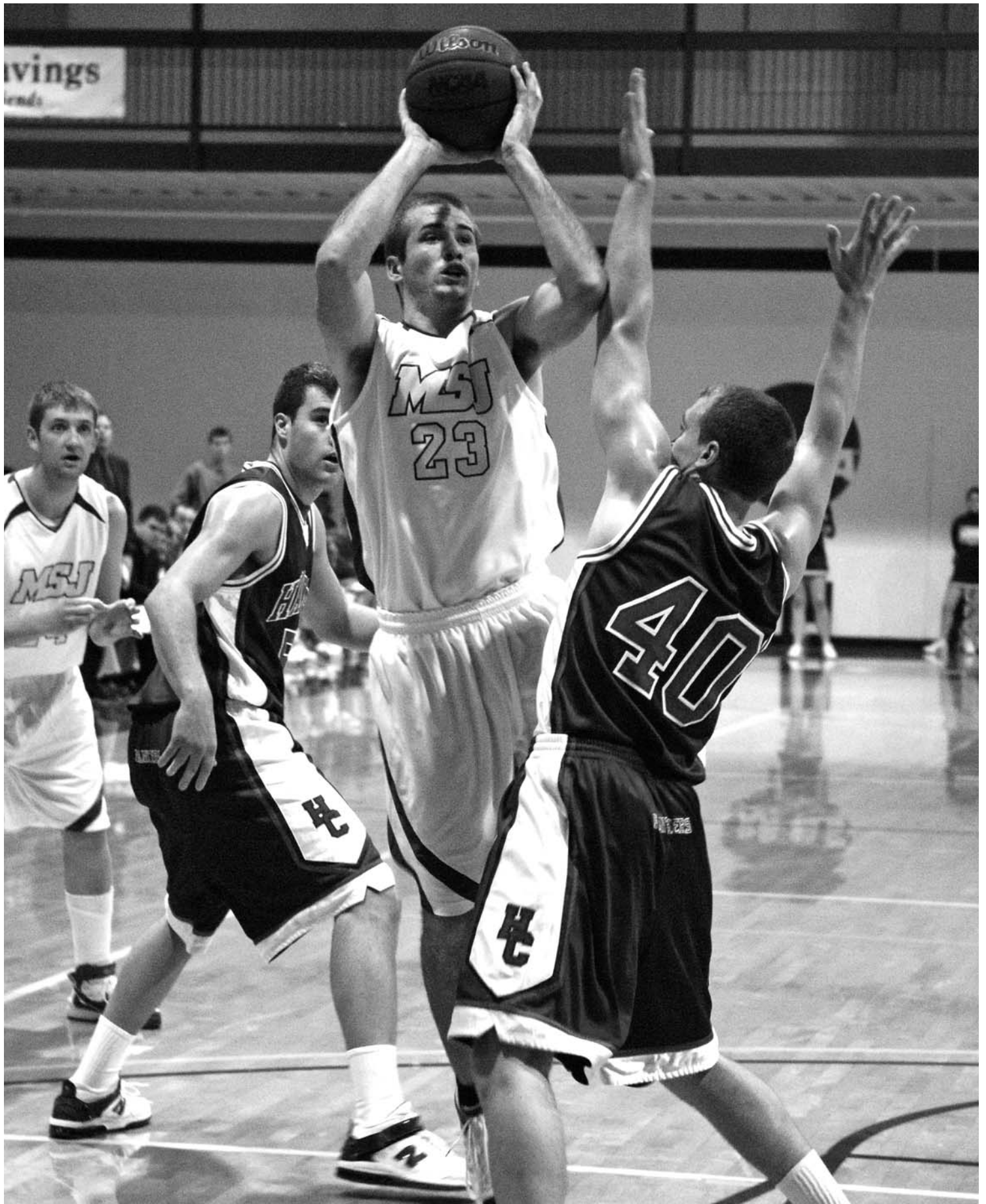

## 2008-2009 SEASON OUTLOOK

After a good effort last season with mixed results, the Lions hope to improve overall this year, including posting more wins. Head Coach Larry Cox will return for his 11th season with the Mount to guide them to a much better season this winter. To achieve success this season, the team has outlined many goals.

“I think any team would tell you that going into a season their goal is to win the conference championship and play in the NCAA Tournament,” explains Cox. “Beyond that we want to be prepared to play every single game physically, mentally and emotionally and to give 100 percent every time we’re on the court.”

A bid for the HCAC Championship will be made difficult due to the intensity of the strong conference.

“There’s a reason the HCAC is ranked as one of the top six conferences in the nation and that’s because of the quality and depth of the teams,” Cox adds. “There are no bottom-feeders in this conference. Each team is well-coached and has talented players and you have to be ready to play every single night or you’ll get beat.”

With the challenge set, the Lions know there are many aspects of the game they will have to improve on to progress from last season’s sub-.500 record. The main areas the team hopes to address this coming season will be the overall toughness and consistency of their game.

“We have to be physically and mentally tougher,” says Cox. “We have to be more consistent – we had flashes of brilliance last year but we had trouble sustaining it over 40 minutes. Our low post defense has to be better and we must be a better rebounding team – too many games were lost on the boards. Offensively, we shot a high percentage but we have to reduce our turnovers and watch ‘settling’ early instead of letting the offense work.”

The team has also placed great emphasis on preparation before the season even starts. As Coach Cox explains, success depends on sacrifices both on and off the court.

“The off-season has been critical for us in terms of not only getting physically ready to play and improving our overall athleticism but more importantly working on the team psyche after a disappointing season a year ago,” he states. “We met individually and as a team and told guys the direction we were going to go in regarding off-season work-outs and they needed to make a decision whether they were going to buy in or not. Most did and I think we are a much improved team because of it.

If you want to be a program that has aspirations of winning a championship, and being considered a top-20 program then you have to be willing to make sacrifices and lead a disciplined life-style and I’m proud to say our guys did that.”

The Lions will be returning a strong core of talented players who all look to compete for spots. Many of whom look to build on outstanding campaigns last season. All-Conference players Michael Romes and Mitchell Goldschmidt return as do Travis Huffman and Kyle McCord who saw a lot of action as starters and key substitutes last season. Frontcourt players that are back are John Valerius, Shaun Alexander and Jordan Brown. The Mount also appeared to have good depth at the guard spot with returners Mike Mechler, Chris Cioffi, Robby Lykes, and Spencer Jared all battling for playing time. In addition, the Lions return a group of others that played significant minutes on the team’s junior varsity team in 2007-08.

In addition to returning athletes, the team looks to introduce an exciting class of new players to the team. The new players will help fill roles throughout the team and will provide excellent competition for upper class members of the team.

“We’re very excited about our new players,” Cox adds. “It’s our third recruiting class with a full-time assistant/recruiting coordinator

(Associate Head Coach Del Walters) and I think you can really see the difference in our talent levels as compared to other years. That being said we do return 10 players who played significant varsity minutes last year so we have the luxury of not having to rush the freshmen out of necessity. If a freshmen is good enough to play on our varsity team that will mean he’s a really good player.”

With their goals firmly in mind and a dedication to improvement, this year’s Lions’ men’s basketball team is optimistic about their chances for the upcoming season and for the future.

## 2008-2009 COACHING STAFF



### Head Coach Larry Cox

Larry Cox begins his 11th season as the only men's basketball coach in the history of the Lions' program. He started the program in 1998 and his team finished with a winning record in its inaugural season. Over the 10 seasons he has built the Mount program into a solid, competitive team and is looking to take the next step this year for the top spot in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. In 2006-07, the Lions led the conference for most of the year before suffering one-point losses late in the season, but still finished with their second straight winning season. Coach Cox is also entering his sixth year as the Mount's assistant athletic director.

Coach Cox's first head coaching position came in the 1990 season at Thomas More College as he inherited a program that had not had a winning season in a decade and during his coaching tenure he turned the program around - finishing with four straight winning seasons. He compiled an overall record of 96-95, at Thomas More from 1990-98, and was named AMC Coach of the Year in both the 1994-95 and 1995-96 seasons, while also leading his school to the AMC regular season and tournament championships.

Prior to his tenure at Thomas More, Cox was the associate head coach from 1983-1989 at St. Joseph's College (Indiana), an NCAA Division II program, where he helped lead the program to an

average of 16 wins a season in the tough Great Lakes Valley Conference, which includes perennial powerhouses Kentucky Wesleyan, Southern Indiana and Northern Kentucky.

Coach Cox also spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at NCAA Division I Bowling Green State University (Ohio) in 1981-82 and 1982-83. During the first season the Falcons were conference runners-up and in the second season they won the Mid-American Conference outright finishing with a 21-9 record. For two seasons, from 1979-1981, he was an assistant at Hanover College (Indiana), where the school averaged 24 wins a season, won two Hoosier-Buckeye Conference Championships and advanced to the Elite Eight in the NAIA National Tournament.

Coach Cox holds a Bachelor of Arts in History degree from Hanover College (Indiana) and a Master of Arts in History degree and a Master of Education in Physical Education degree from Bowling Green State University (Ohio). He has taught classes at Bowling Green State University, St. Joseph's College, Thomas More College, and the Mount. During his tenure as a head coach, every player who has completed their four years of eligibility has their degree.

Coach Cox and his wife, Beth, reside in West Chester, Ohio, and have triplet sons, Luke, Jake and Ryan, born on October 26, 2007.

### Associate Head Coach Del Walters

Del Walters begins his third season as a Mount basketball assistant coach. Walters is also the Lions' head men's tennis coach. He was named associate men's basketball coach in August 2007. Walters is also the program's recruiting, strength and conditioning and summer camp coordinator.

Walters came to the Mount from Thomas More College where he was a men's basketball assistant coach since 2000. He was also Thomas More's head men's tennis coach (2004-2005), guiding the team to a 7-5 record, and was the men's and women's head cross country coach (2005-2006). Walters also assisted the men's basketball team at John Carroll University as a graduate assistant coach (1999-2000), after playing for two seasons and being a student assistant coach for two seasons. He also has worked at Thomas More College, John Carroll University and Wittenberg University basketball camps.

The Lions' second-year coach is a 1994 graduate of Villa Angela-St. Joseph High School in Cleveland, Ohio, where his team won the Ohio Division II State Championship during his senior season. Walters was a Second Team All-District and Honorable Mention All-City selection while in high school. He is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the Black Coaches Association.

Walters is a 1999 graduate of John Carroll University, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Communications degree. He resides in Ft. Mitchell, Ky.



### Assistant Coach Gil Voigt

Gil Voigt begins his 11<sup>th</sup> season as an assistant coach at the Mount. He graduated from Ohio University in 1975 where he earned his bachelor's degree in radio-TV communications. Voigt earned his master's degree in biology from UNC-Charlotte in 1990.

Coach Voigt started his coaching career at high schools in Charlotte and Wilmington, N.C. He coached at Laney High School in Wilmington, N.C., where a few years before he began coaching, Michael Jordan had graduated. He then moved to Florida where he was head coach of St. Andrew's Methodist in Brandon, Fla. He has been an assistant at Oak Hills High School (1994-1998), and has coached many teams in AAU programs offered to basketball players in the summer. He was also a television sportscaster for WECT-TV and WWAY-TV in Wilmington, N.C. for nine years.

Coach Voigt worked as the assistant publicity director, in spring training, for the Cincinnati Reds, 1991-1993. He currently produces TV statistics for many major league baseball teams that come to Great American Ballpark. Coach Voigt has also been a licensed football, basketball and baseball official since 1974, and is currently employed by Fairfield City School District as a science teacher. In addition, Voigt is the head junior varsity and varsity assistant baseball coach at Madeira High School.

Coach Voigt resides in Cincinnati, Ohio.

### Assistant Coach Rodney Morgan

## MOUNT IN THE HCAC

This will be the 11th season for the Mount's men's basketball team in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC). Other institutions that are also members of this conference include: Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University.

In 1998, the first year for the Mount's basketball program as well as the first year of HCAC play, the Lions went 5-9 in the conference, which put them in sixth place out of eight teams. Jarett Young was named Freshman of the Year and gained an Honorable Mention All-Conference award. Joe Toney also received an All-Conference Honorable Mention award for his efforts during the season. The Mount greatly improved in the 1999-2000 season. The Lions were 6-6 in conference play and won their way into the final four of the tournament where they lost in overtime to the champion, Franklin College. Jarett Young was on the All-Tournament team for his contribution during the post-season. Other Lions received acknowledgement for outstanding play. Jared Franz and Joe Toney were named All-Conference while Young was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. Joe Toney also was named Player of the Week twice during the season.

The Lions tied for fifth place in the HCAC with five wins and seven losses in the 2000-01 season. The Mount was actually in first place with about two weeks to play but slipped in the standings and finished as the seventh and last seed in the post-season conference tournament. The Lions' season came to an end in the first round with a loss to Hanover, 73-69. Junior forward Jared Franz was selected All-Conference while junior forward Steve Bain was chosen Honorable Mention All-Conference.

The 2001-2002 campaign was a season marked by milestone achievements for two players. Seniors Joe Toney and Jarett Young both scored their 1,000th career point. Steve Bain was named First-Team All-Conference and was also a Player of the Week. Young received an All-Conference Honorable Mention award. The Mount lost in the first round of the tournament but placed fifth in the regular season team standings, recording a 5-9 mark.

The Lions began the 2002-2003 season winning three of their first four conference games and were 5-3 before suffering six straight HCAC losses. The Mount defeated second-place Anderson University and fourth-place Defiance College during the regular season. After losing to HCAC-foe Manchester College at home to end the regular season, the Mount bounced back to defeat the Spartans on the road in the first round of the tournament. Tom Luther, who finished second in the conference in rebounding, was a two-time HCAC Player of the Week winner and also made All-Conference. Chris Washington was also selected to the All-Conference team.

In 2003-2004, the Mount played competitively throughout most of the HCAC campaign, despite posting a 4-10 conference mark. Their wins included triumphs over Manchester and Anderson, as well as Defiance and Bluffton (back-to-back). The Mount also lost two games in overtime, to Anderson and Transylvania. They did, however, win three of their last five regular season HCAC games and suffered a one-point loss to Defiance in the HCAC Tournament. Seniors Tom Luther and E.J. Engelkamp collected conference post-season awards. Luther was sixth in the conference in scoring, while senior teammate Matt Volkerding was first in rebounding and third in blocked shots.

The Mount began the 2004-05 conference slate with two straight wins and played well at home, finishing 4-3 in conference play. The Lions, however, recorded a 1-6 road record in the conference, winning only at Defiance College. After that win, the Mount dropped four straight HCAC match-ups to slip to 5-9 in the conference.

They dropped a six-point decision in the first round of the HCAC Tournament to eventual runner-up Franklin College. The Lions finished third as a team in blocked shots and tied for first in steals. Kevin Darthard, who was named First Team All-Conference, was fifth in the HCAC in scoring average and field goal percentage. Derrick Jones was selected Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

In 2005-2006, the Lions had one of the most successful seasons in the program's history. Winning six of their first seven games to start the season, the Mount finished 16-11 overall and 8-6 in the tough HCAC. Finishing fourth in the HCAC regular season, the Lions were the number four seed and hosted their conference tournament opener, beating number five seed Manchester, 67-55. However, their season would end in the conference semifinals, when they lost to the seventh-ranked team in the country, Transylvania, 83-79. Leading the way for the Mount were seniors Kevin Darthard and Derrick Jones, who were voted First team All-Conference. Other notable HCAC accomplishments included juniors Robbie Noschang and Tony Blomer being named Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

The Lions started out slowly in the conference in 2006-2007, going 1-2 but then ran off a five-game win streak to up their record to 6-2. The Mount was in the thick of the conference race for first place the rest of the season, but was hurt by two close losses down the stretch – an overtime loss to Defiance and a one-point defeat to Bluffton.

Their 9-7 record was tied for the third-best in the conference, but the Mount was denied the fourth and final HCAC Tournament spot on the tie-breaker system. Michael Romes was selected Freshman of the Year and First Team All-HCAC while teammate Tony Blomer was also a First Team All-Conference selection. Romes led the conference in field goal percentage while Blomer paced the HCAC in blocked shots. Teammates Jeff Perry and Michael Eirons both made Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

The Lions had a rough start to the 2007-08 conference season, losing their first four HCAC games, but bounced back to win two of three after that. Last year's win total in the HCAC also included a victory over conference champion Defiance. The Mount was fifth in points per game and fourth in field goal percentage while several individual Lions' players made their mark in HCAC games. Michael Romes was second in points per game, and fifth in rebounds per game and shooting percentage, while teammate Michael Eirons ranked in the top 11 in four different statistical categories in conference action. Josh Carter led the conference in assists per game and was fourth in free throw accuracy. Romes was selected First Team All-HCAC for the second straight season while Mitchell Goldschmidt, Eirons and Carter were each chosen Honorable Mention All-Conference. Romes also picked up an HCAC Player of the Week award.
