ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT THE MOUNT

The Mount provides its students with athletic fields and the Harrington Center, a modern two-level student union with a running track, gym, fitness center, and food court. During the 2003-2004 academic year, the Mount began its Campus Expansion Plan, which includes athletic fields to accommodate more Mount teams on campus for practice and home games.

The Mount's East Fields on Delhi Road, which have been the home field for women's soccer, have been expanded into a game field and running track with seating for up to 2,400 spectators. The new Sports Complex gives the Mount Lions' football team its first home field on campus since 1990. It also provides a home field for women's soccer, men's soccer and lacrosse teams for men (2007) and women (2009). The track serves the Mount's track & field teams and additional facilities house the Mount's academic program in athletic training, as well as locker rooms and concessions. The Campus Expansion Plan also included the renovation of nearby College property into practice fields. The Lions' softball team began playing home games at the new River Road softball field in 2007.

The Mount Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field, one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators.

The Harrington Center, which opened in 1998, contains two full courts for Lions volleyball and basketball as well as the full range of Mount intramural teams. The Harrington Center also features a specially surfaced indoor running track; courts for racquetball, squash and walleyball; fitness center; weight training; athletic training; and locker facilities.

The Mount's west campus field, the J. Page Hayden Athletic Field, is the location for the Mount's field events during track & field meets and is a practice field for the Lions' Roar Marching Band. The Mount also provides lighted tennis courts for intercollegiate and intramural teams.

The Mount men's golf team's home course is Miami Whitewater Forest Golf Course in Harrison, Ohio. The course is a par-72, 6,808-yards course with a rating of 72.3 and a slope of 125.

MOUNT ATHLETICS DIRECTOR



Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 14th year as the Lions' athletic director for the 2008-2009 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount. The Lions' volleyball team finished in a tie for first place in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference last fall while the Lions football team finished as runner-ups in the HCAC regular season and qualified to their fourth

straight NCAA Division III playoffs. Women's soccer also advanced to the HCAC Semifinals while the men's soccer team enjoyed their best season to date, narrowly missing qualifying to the Conference Tournament. The women's tennis team finished with seven wins, their most since the 1997 season. The Lions' wrestling team finished 13-5-1 in duals, including an 11-1-1 mark against Division III schools, and ended the season ranked 21st in the country. The baseball team won the HCAC regular season, and advanced as the top seed and host to the Conference Tournament while the softball team qualified to the HCAC Tournament and played in the championship game, losing in extra innings.

In addition, there were plenty of other highlights, both individually and team-wise, for the Mount's athletic programs in 2007-2008.

Radcliffe, who oversees 21 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. A retired athletic trainer, Radcliffe began his athletic training career in 1976 and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition, Radcliffe has been the Lions' head athletic trainer, working with athletes from all the intercollegiate sports, as well as teaching athletic training at the College.

Radcliffe, who received his bachelor's degree in 1978 and his master's in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio), became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, Radcliffe stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive

influence in student life and development at the Mount.

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

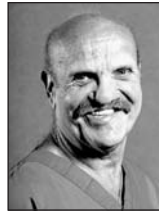

2008 SEASON OUTLOOK

This season will be the program's fourth in its history, and after last season in which the Mount narrowly missed making the HCAC Tournament, the Lions have high hopes for an even better campaign in 2008.

The Lions have shown steady improvement since their 2005 inaugural season, going from a winless first season to two wins in year two and four wins last fall. The 2007 team finished with the fifth most points in the HCAC (tied with Anderson), and just missed making the four-team postseason conference tournament. The Mount, which finished the season 4-14 overall, won their last two games – both in the conference, and finished the season with a 3-5 conference mark, losing once by a two-goal margin and once by a 1-0 decision (in overtime to Defiance).

Now, with six seniors leading the way, five of whom have been with the team since the first season in 2005, the Mount appears poised to make a strong run at a top-four conference finish. Leading the way this season will be seniors Austin Campbell, Robert Huesman, Ben Denier, Brian Thesing, Andrew Brockman, and Jake Merkel. Campbell, a goal keeper, is also a valuable player in the field, while Huesman provides versatility and talent at different positions for the Lions. Campbell played in all 18 games, including seven games in goal and will be counted on to provide leadership and production. Huesman, a Second Team All-HCAC selection last season, had four points and is adept at playing many different places on the field.

Denier, Thesing and Brockman round out the quartet of players who are in their fourth seasons with the team. Each brings different talents to the field for the Lions. Merkel returns for his third season with the Mount, after starting in 17 games on defense last season.

Juniors Chaz Roots, Peter Cahall, James Hall, and Bill Mayhall all lend experience and starting talent to the Lions' core of players. Cahall was a Second Team All-HCAC honoree last season.

Mount Head Coach Carrie Taylor has stressed to her veteran squad that the time is now for them to step up and make the season count. Six sophomores are also on the roster this fall and Taylor feels this could be the deepest squad she's had at the Mount.

The second-year class is led by goalkeeper Max Hoffman, who played 16 games last season and allowed only 32 goals, and midfielder Erik Jacob.

"Had we not lost in overtime last season to Defiance, we would have grabbed that fourth spot for the conference tournament," Taylor says. "We realize that we peaked at the end of the season in 2007 and that we need to start playing better earlier, which he have talked about doing this coming season."

The seniors have been through the no-win seasons and have helped this program continue to grow. They realize they've put the time in and want it to pay off now. I expect good things out of the team this season and to win more games. We feel realistically that we can get to the HCAC Tournament."

Although the Lions scored their most-ever goals in a season last year (13), Coach Taylor and her team will be looking to increase that total again this fall. She's hoping for increased scoring among the returners and contributions from some first-year players, as well. There are five freshman players and one transfer player new to the team in 2007.

"Offensively, we don't have any one star player," Taylor adds. "We need them all to contribute. We're looking for additional scoring from all of them and we think we have a decent group of players coming in that could contribute to the offense as well."

Taylor said the team kept together and worked hard in the off-season on conditioning, and organized a summer team. She said the leadership on the team is solid and the players seem to enjoy playing together.

As for the HCAC race, Taylor said she expects the usual teams, Transylvania and Rose-Hulman, to be the most formidable. With 11 of the team's 18 games on the road this season, Taylor said it would be interesting to see how her team reacts.

"The key of how our season will go this fall is how we start off," Taylor states. "The experience of how close we were at the end of last season should help us this season realize what kind of a start we must have to be there at the end and reach our goals."

2008 COACHING STAFF



Head Coach Carrie Taylor

Carrie Taylor begins her fourth season with the Mount's men's soccer team in 2008. Taylor was hired in December 2004 as the school's first full-time head soccer coach, heading up both the women's and men's programs at the Mount.

The Lions' coach has a variety of soccer coaching experience. She came to the Mount from Milford High School, where she was the girls' coach from 2001 through 2004. She was an assistant coach at Division I Xavier University (1999-2001) and has been involved with youth and Olympic Development soccer for nearly 11 years. She also was an assistant coach at Division I Temple University (1997).

In addition, Coach Taylor currently works with Kentucky, Nevada and Hawaii ODP teams, has been the Alaska ODP State Team head coach and is a Regional II girls' staff coach. She is the United States

Adult Soccer Association Women's Region II Select Team coach and USASA National Staff assistant coach. Taylor also has a United States Soccer Federation A License and National Youth License, and is a licensing clinician in Ohio and Kentucky. She is also a National Youth License instructor with U.S. Youth Soccer.

Taylor has a bachelor's degree in biology from the University of Michigan, a master's degree in sport administration from Wayne State University and a teaching certificate in life science.

She played on the University of Michigan club soccer team (1990-1994) and was a member of the Wolverines' inaugural varsity team in 1994. She played in the United States Women's Independent Soccer League (USWISL) in 1996 for the Columbus Ziggx and in the Women's United Soccer League (WUSL) in 2000 for the Kentucky Fillies.

Coach Taylor resides in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Assistant Coach Leah Todd

Leah Todd returns to the Mount for her fourth season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams. She recently completed her second bachelor's degree in athletic training from the Mount.

Todd is a December 2003 graduate of Seton Hall University, where she was a four-year starter for the Division I Pirates. She was a team co-captain her senior season and was named to the Big East All-Academic Team for three years. She also graduated with the record for most saves in a Big East Conference Tournament. Todd received a Bachelor of Arts in Social and Behavioral Science degree.

She was an undergraduate assistant coach for Seton Hall in 2003, assisting with the team's goalkeepers and team conditioning.

The Lions' assistant coach played for the Cincinnati Ladyhawks amateur soccer team in the WUSL for five years, after playing briefly for the Atlanta Beat in the now-defunct professional WUSA. Todd has also worked at local soccer camps, and has served as a goalkeeper coach. Currently she trains goalkeepers for Cincinnati United Premier, and is the head coach for a Warren County girls' team.

Coach Todd and her husband Robert reside in Cincinnati, Ohio.



Assistant Coach Rudy Argueta

Rudy Argueta begins his second season as an assistant coach for the Lions' soccer team. He is a 2002 graduate of NAIA Union College in Barbourville, Kentucky, where he was a four-year starter. While at Union, he was the first player in school history to score 40 goals and have 40 assists.

He was a First Team All-Conference selection from 1999-2001, a two-time team captain, team MVP in 2000, and was honored with All-Region and All-American Honorable Mention Awards in 1999. Argueta graduated with a triple major, business administration, sports management and physical education, and a minor in economics.

Argueta, a midfielder, also has professional soccer experience with the Columbus Crew in 2002 and played for Info Sport at the Professional Soccer Combine (All-Star team) in 2002. Furthermore, he played with two different teams in the Professional Development League and the U-12 Guatemala National Youth Team from 1989 to 1991. He currently plays on numerous local teams including the Kentucky Wanderers.

He was most recently the boys' varsity assistant soccer coach at Turpin High School in Cincinnati as well as the junior varsity head coach for four years. In addition he has coached youth soccer and has been active in working many prestigious soccer camps around the country. Argueta has also worked as a personal soccer coach, training individuals, club teams and high school teams. He is currently the U-16 Cardinals Soccer Club's head coach.

Argueta and his wife Michelle reside in Cincinnati, Ohio.

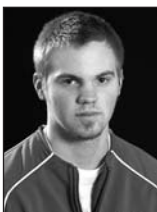

MOUNT IN THE HCAC

The Lions began their inaugural season of men's soccer in 2005 with a full slate of HCAC games. They were competitive in the HCAC, as they lost two games by one goal each, 3-2 to Bluffton and 1-0 to Franklin. They also dropped a 3-1 game to Hanover. Defender Dan McDonald was selected Second Team All-HCAC. Goalkeeper Kenny Goodin was second in the conference in saves and eighth in goals against average.

The 2006 season saw the Lions win their first-ever game in conference play, claiming a 1-0 win over Rose-Hulman. The Mount also defeated HCAC-rival Franklin 3-2 during the season. The Lions were first in the conference in goalkeeper saves, led by

Second Team All-HCAC selection Austin Campbell. Chris Dobrowolski tied for fifth-most goals in HCAC action, and was chosen Second Team All-Conference.

The Mount had their best season to date in the HCAC during the 2007 season, claiming three wins including two straight wins to close the season, posting a 2-1 victory over Franklin and a 2-0 win against Bluffton. They tied with the fifth-best record in the conference, narrowly missing a playoff bid. The Lions were second in the conference in saves while freshman goalkeeper Max Hoffman was second individually in the conference in saves. Robert Huesman and Peter Cahall were each voted Second Team All-Conference.

2008 SEASON OUTLOOK

With that impressive core of returning players, and a strong influx of first-year talent, led by a few transfers, the Mount looks ready to improve on last season's third place conference regular season finish and HCAC Tournament semifinal appearance.

"We thought last season was a successful season winning 11 games and setting or tying as many records as we did, but obviously we wanted more," Head Coach Carrie Taylor states. "We knew that we had to overcome losing our top two scorers from the year before, and the team pulled together well.

The Mount, which was 11-7-1 overall and 6-2 in the HCAC last season, was competitive against the two teams that finished ahead of them in the conference race – Rose-Hulman and Transylvania. Taylor feels her team has learned from last season's strong run and spate of close games against top competition. The Mount rolled off an eight-game winning streak during the season.

"We're really excited about this season, and we'll look to a large senior class for leadership," Taylor says. "We have high expectations this season. The seniors want to finish their careers on a high note."

The Mount is hoping to return to the Division III Regional Tournament, something they have not compete since 2005.

Leading the way offensively this season for the Mount are the team's top four returning scorers, Beth Schuermann, Allie Pirman, Ashley Maynard, and Jessica Jester. All but Maynard, a sophomore, are seniors and provide good scoring and all-around skills. Seniors Samantha Huster and Erin Rosen will also look to provide offensive firepower for the Mount this season. Schuermann and Pirman were First Team All-HCAC selections last fall.

The Lions once again plan to have a strong defense which will be led by senior Laura Mund and junior Laurie Neumann. Others expected to contribute for the Mount in the midfield and defensive areas are returners Shannon Nortman, a junior, Megan Smith, a sophomore, and Jessica Smith, a sophomore. Sophomore forward Nikki Jones also returns. Senior goal keeper Kelly Bare is back and will hold down a starting spot again. Neumann was First Team All-Conference and a First Team All-Region player in 2007 while

Bare was a Second Team All-HCAC selection.

"I think we have good balance and talent throughout each of our three areas of the field (forward, midfield and defense)," Taylor adds. "Kelly Bare is also strong in goal. She came in and posted 10 shutouts last season.

We expect big things from some of our new players and expect them to step in and contribute right away," Taylor states. "We also have a handful of freshmen that are hungry and ready to step in right away and push for some playing time."

Taylor said she is hoping to use that depth to keep the Lions from getting run down, something she feels that they experienced toward the end of last season.

"I think our level of talent overall is better than it has ever been (since Taylor's been at the Mount)," she adds. "This is the first time we've kept the entire coaching staff from the year before, and we're all excited about the season."

As for the race in the HCAC, Coach Taylor estimates that Rose-Hulman and Transylvania will be the Mount's main adversaries for the top spot. Among other key games for the Mount in 2008 will be Thomas More, Wilmington and Wittenberg, the annual yearly rivals.

Losing to Transylvania to end last season left a bad taste in the mouths of the Lions' players.

"We'd like to win another HCAC Championship and get back to the NCAA Tournament," Taylor added. "The ladies realize the potential we have this season, and we think it will be a tremendous season."

Carrie Taylor begins her fourth season with the Mount's women's soccer team in 2008. She led the Lions to a third place finish in the conference regular season standings last fall, and a berth in the HCAC Tournament, where they lost in the semifinals to eventual HCAC Tournament

runner-up Transylvania University, 3-1.

Taylor's 2006 squad advanced to the conference championship game for a second straight season. In her stellar first-year campaign during the 2005 season the Mount won the HCAC regular season and the conference championship tournament with a victory over Transylvania, qualifying to the NCAA Division III Tournament. Taylor was also selected HCAC Coach of the Year in 2005.

She was hired in December 2004 as the school's first full-time head soccer coach, heading up both the women's and men's programs at the Mount. MOUNT IN THE HCAC

This season marks the Mount's 11th season of action in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. While a member of the conference, the Lions have been an HCAC power, competing against Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University. Their overall record during their time spent in the conference is 63-17-7. That mark includes five outright conference titles and one shared HCAC title. The Lions hold a winning record against seven of the eight conference opponents, including undefeated marks against Anderson (14-0), Franklin (12-0), Bluffton (10-0) and Defiance (12-0-2).

In 1998, the Lions' first year in the HCAC, the Mount and Wilmington were co-champions with a record of 5-1-1. There was not a conference tournament that year, but many Mount players were recognized for outstanding achievement. Three players were named First Team All-Conference, one player was named Second Team All-Conference, Mandy Blazer was co-MVP of the conference, and Head Coach Sam Pogoni was named Coach of the Year. The Lions placed second in the regular season with a 5-1 record in 1999, falling just short to Wilmington, who compiled a 6-0 mark. In the HCAC Tournament, the Mount went 3-0, defeating Wilmington by a 1-0 score, giving the Lions the tournament championship. Many Mount players were acknowledged for their accomplishments in 1999 as three players were named First Team All-Conference and one player received an Honorable Mention award.

In 2000, the Lions swept the conference 6-0 and won the end of the season tournament. They went 2-0 in the tournament defeating Anderson 5-0 for the championship. As in previous years, the Mount had a number of players that received awards. Lisa Sutton was named Player of the Year. Sutton and two other players were named First Team All-Conference and two players were named Second Team All-Conference.

In 2001, the Mount placed second behind an undefeated Transylvania team in regular season play with a 5-1 record, but fought back to win the Conference Championship to qualify for the NCAA Division III Regional Tournament. The Lions again received many honors including three All-Conference nominees. In addition, Lisa Sutton was also awarded Academic All-Conference, Verizon Academic All-District, NSCAA All-Ohio, and Conference

Player of the Week twice. Jill Miller was also an HCAC Player of the Week honoree and Sam Pogoni was named Coach of the Year.

The Lions won five of seven games in the conference in 2002 (with one tie against defending regular season champion Transylvania). The team's lone setback in regular season play came by a 1-0 score at Hanover College. The Mount avenged that loss by defeating the Panthers 2-0 in the conference championship game. Three Mount players, Erin Fox, Erin Mallory and Lindsay Doll were named All-Conference.

The Lions slipped a bit in conference play during the 2003 season, but still compiled a .500 record with a 3-3-1 mark. That record left them in a fifth place tie with Defiance, as they missed qualifying to the post-season HCAC Tournament for the first time ever. The Mount scored the second most goals in conference-only games. Michele Philips was selected for All-Conference Honors.

After a one-year absence from the HCAC Tournament, the Mount returned to the conference post-season competition in 2004, but dropped a 1-0 double overtime game to eventual HCAC Tournament champion Manchester. The Lions' defense posted three shutouts in conference play, and qualified to the HCAC Tournament by blanking Bluffton, 6-0, collecting the third seed in the tournament. A conference-tying best total of five players received All-Conference recognition: Margie Pfister, Jessey Spradlin, Lori Sullivan, Michele Phillips, and Sarah Lamping.

Over the course of the 2005 season, the Mount compiled a record of 13-6-2, including a 5-0-2 HCAC record, and steamed rolled to yet another conference championship. Leading the way for the Lions in 2005 was Jessey Spradlin, who tallied nine goals in conference games and was named the HCAC Most Valuable Player. Other players receiving First Team All-Conference recognition were Sandy Rack, Katie Henlein, Michele Phillips, Kristi Poling, and Amanda Hauck. Hauck had an HCAC-best four shutouts in conference play. Head Coach Carrie Taylor was named as HCAC Coach of the Year.

The Lions recorded another stellar season of play in the HCAC during the 2006 campaign, when they rolled to a 7-1 record, good for second place in the conference. The Mount out-scored their opponents 41-5 in HCAC play. The Lions defeated Rose-Hulman in the first round of the HCAC Tournament, 3-1, but fell in the conference championship game to Transylvania by an identical score. Jessey Spradlin, who led the conference in points per game, and

goals, and was tied for second in assists, was voted HCAC Most Valuable Player for the second straight season. She also won three Conference Player of the Week awards. Mount teammates Katie Henlein, Beth Schuermann and Sarah Thaxton were among the offensive statistical leaders while Becky Thaxton was second in goals against average and shutouts, and tied for sixth in saves, as well as HCAC co-Freshman of the Year. Sandy Rack, Kristi Poling, Spradlin and Henlein were named First Team All-Conference while Laurie Neumann and Schuermann were selected Second Team All-HCAC. As a team, the Lions were first in the conference in points, goals and assists, as well as second in goals against average and tied for second in shutouts.

The Mount finished in third place in the HCAC in 2007, losing to the conference's top two teams, Rose-Hulman and Transylvania both by 1-0 scores. The Lions were ousted in the HCAC

Tournament by Transylvania, 3-1, but had a fine all-around season of play from many individuals adding up to a strong team performance. The Mount was second in shutouts, goals against average, and assists, and was third in points scored and tied for third in goals scored. Freshman Ashley Maynard was first in game winning goals, fourth in goals per game and sixth in points per game. Mount leading scorer Beth Schuermann was also in the top ten in the HCAC in goals per game and points per game. Allie Pirman was second in the conference in assists per game while teammate Samantha Huster was fifth in assists per game. Kelly Bare finished first in the HCAC in shutouts (five), second in goals against average and seventh in saves. Schuermann, Pirman and Laurie Neumann were named First Team All-HCAC while Bare and Laura Mund were named Second Team All-Conference. Bare also picked up an HCAC Player of the Week award.
