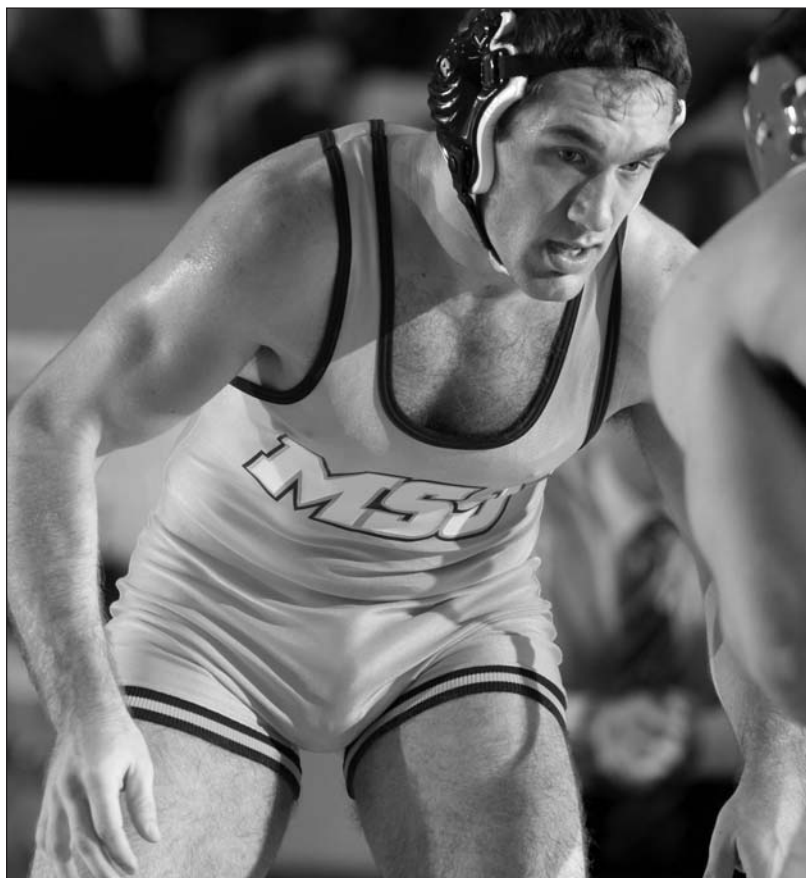

ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT THE MOUNT

The Mount provides its students with athletic fields and the Harrington Center, a modern two-level student union with a running track, gym, fitness center, and food court. During the 2003-2004 academic year, the Mount began its Campus Expansion Plan, which includes athletic fields to accommodate more Mount teams on campus for practice and home games.

The Mount's East Fields on Delhi Road, which have been the home field for women's soccer, have been expanded into a game field and running track with seating for up to 2,400 spectators. The new Sports Complex gives the Mount Lions' football team its first home field on campus since 1990. It also provides a home field for women's soccer, men's soccer and lacrosse teams for men (2007) and women (2009). The track serves the Mount's track & field teams and additional facilities house the Mount's academic program in athletic training, as well as locker rooms and concessions. The Campus Expansion Plan also included the renovation of nearby College property into practice fields. The Lions' softball team began playing home games at the new River Road softball field in 2007.

The Mount Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field, one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators.

The Harrington Center, which opened in 1998, contains two full courts for Lions volleyball and basketball as well as the full range of Mount intramural teams. The Harrington Center also features a specially surfaced indoor running track; courts for racquetball, squash and walleyball; fitness center; weight training; athletic training; and locker facilities.

The Mount's west campus field, the J. Page Hayden Athletic Field, is the location for the Mount's field events during track & field meets and is a practice field for the Lions' Roar Marching Band. The Mount also provides lighted tennis courts for intercollegiate and intramural teams.

The Mount men's golf team's home course is Miami Whitewater Forest Golf Course in Harrison, Ohio. The course is a par-72, 6,808-yards course with a rating of 72.3 and a slope of 125. The women's golf team's home course is Aston Oaks Course in North Bend, Ohio.

MOUNT ATHLETICS DIRECTOR



Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 14th year as the Lions' athletic director for the 2008-2009 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount. The Lions' volleyball team finished in a tie for first place in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference last fall while the Lions football team finished as runner-ups in the HCAC regular season and qualified to their fourth

straight NCAA Division III playoffs. Women's soccer also advanced to the HCAC Semifinals while the men's soccer team enjoyed their best season to date, narrowly missing qualifying to the Conference Tournament. The women's tennis team finished with seven wins, their most since the 1997 season. The Lions' wrestling team finished 13-5-1 in duals, including an 11-1-1 mark against Division III schools, and ended the season ranked 21st in the country. The baseball team won the HCAC regular season, and advanced as the top seed and host to the Conference Tournament while the softball team qualified to the HCAC Tournament and played in the championship game, losing in extra innings.

In addition, there were plenty of other highlights, both individually and team-wise, for the Mount's athletic programs in 2007-2008.

Radcliffe, who oversees 21 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. A retired athletic trainer, Radcliffe began his athletic training career in 1976 and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition, Radcliffe has been the Lions' head athletic trainer, working with athletes from all the intercollegiate sports, as well as teaching athletic training at the College.

Radcliffe, who received his bachelor's degree in 1978 and his master's in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio), became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, Radcliffe stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount.

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

2008-2009 SEASON OUTLOOK

After a strong finish last season, the Lions look to continue their climb into becoming an elite team. Last year, the Lions were able to break multiple team and individual records. The team also saw success at every tournament, leading up to a 21st national ranking. Mount alum Casey Stouffer will enter his second season as head coach of the Lions. Stouffer enjoyed much success his first season, earning the prestigious honors of both HCAC and Midstates Conference Coach of the Year.

Despite the tremendous amount of success, Stouffer and the Lions have their sights set even higher this year with a specific goals in mind. According to Stouffer, these goals include being HCAC Champions, a top-three team at Regionals, and a top-20 ranked Division III team nationally by the end of the season. Goals also include having at least three wrestlers at the National Championships.

The Lions will have a tough challenge in the HCAC, as well as many of their tournament scheduled this season.

“Manchester looks to be our toughest competition in the HCAC,” Stouffer says. “In the Mid-States Conference Tournament Olivet and Trine will be the ones to overcome.”

An off-season and practice focus on both technique and conditioning will help the Lions through the rigors of the season. Returnees Eric Meyer, Chad Craft, Jakob Porter, and Dave Harris will be some of the few team veterans who will look to make a make an impact this season. Adding more members of the team will also help as well.

“Freshmen and transfers will play a big part of our team as there are 18 of them. We will need them to step in and win for us right away because about six of the 10 weight classes will be freshmen. Bringing in 18 new wrestlers in the off-season will help the team be more competitive because they have to fight for a starting position which helps everybody get better,” says Stouffer. “Also, several of the wrestlers spent time in the off-season at different wrestling clubs and open mats.”

With their goals firmly in mind, the Lions aim to be the team to beat this season.

2008-2009 COACHING STAFF



Head Coach Casey Stouffer

Casey Stouffer returns for his second season this winter as Lions' head coach. Stouffer, a 2001 Mount graduate and former Lions' wrestler, took over the Lions' program last season. Stouffer is the fourth head coach in the program's history, following Ron Corradini Sr., Rod Huber and Thomas Wynn. Stouffer has a Bachelor of Arts in

Health/Physical Education degree. He is also working on a Masters in Education Administration degree and has Colorado teacher certification in health/physical education (K-12).

The Lions' coach is a native of Wabash, Ind., and is a graduate of Southwood (Indiana) High School.

Stouffer, who wrestled for Huber for four seasons, was a letter-winner in the sport each of the four years, and was a three-time team captain. He also played on the Mount's tennis team for one season. While at the Mount, Stouffer was a member of FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes), the founder of Huddle at MSJ, and was affiliated with the Mount Education Association and NEA

(National Education Association). Stouffer also made Dean's List at the Mount three times and was a NCAA Division III Scholar Athlete All-American (1999, 2000 and 2001).

After graduation from the Mount, Stouffer trained at the Olympic Wrestling Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., was a world champion in folkstyle wrestling (2002), an Ironman world wrestling champion (2002) and placed sixth at the Greco-Roman World Team Trials (2002).

Stouffer was a Coach/Counselor at the FCA Wrestling Camp and Ohio State University Wrestling Camp (1999), as well as being a retreat counselor for four years for Fellowship Christian Athletes. He was a teacher and head coach at Amelia High School (2002) before moving to Colorado Spring, Colo. During his time in Colorado, Stouffer was a physical education teacher at Colorado Springs Christian School and a health/physical education teacher at Lewis Palmer High School for four years. He was also the varsity head wrestling coach at Lewis Palmer High School for four seasons.

Coach Stouffer, and his wife, Jessica, reside in Cincinnati, Ohio.



Assistant Coach Steve Iori

Steve Iori returns for his fourth season as a Lions' assistant coach. Iori graduated from the College of Mount St. Joseph in 2001 with a Bachelor of Science in business administration degree with concentrations in marketing and management. He was a four-year wrestler for the Lions, and was the team's Rookie of the Year in 1998, after placing

in the top six of every meet, and qualifying to NAIA National tournament that season. Iori was also on the Mount's first conference and regional championship team in 2000 and was a team captain as a senior.

Iori has been a substitute teacher and part owner of a landscaping business. He also coached wrestling at Elder High School for four years following college, directing numerous state placers, many of whom have gone on to wrestle collegiately. He also was a volunteer coach with the Elder Kids Club and Junior High programs and also assisted with the Westside Freestyle/Greco-Roman Wrestling Club. He is currently employed in Fifth Third Bank's Consumer Lending Direct Equity lending division, analyzing risk and approving equity loans for new and/or existing FifthThird customers. He also owner of Meshed Landscaping. Iori resides in Cincinnati, Ohio.



Assistant Coach Brennan Ryan

Brennan Ryan returns for his second season as an assistant coach on the Mount's wrestling staff. Ryan, who has his master's degree in education from Xavier University, was most recently the head coach at Roger Bacon High School, a position he had held since 2000. During that time his teams recorded an 86-24 dual record, were two-time Division II-III city champs, two-time sectional champs, three-time GCL Central/North champs, and ranked in the Top 5 in Cincinnati Division II-III all seven seasons.

As a coach, Ryan was voted SWOWCA Division II Coach of the Year for 2005-06 and 2006-07, and also GCL North/Central Coach of the Year in 2004-05, 2005-06, and 2006-07.

In addition, Ryan has coached the Storm Club Baseball team in Cincinnati, from 2004-2007 as a head coach and 1999-2003 as an assistant; and also was an assistant coach and head baseball coach at Roger Bacon High School (1998-2007).

He is currently self-employed, owning his own promotional products/ad specialty company (513 Promotional Products).

MOUNT IN THE HCAC

The Mount wrestling team is a member of the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. The schools that are included in the wrestling division of the HCAC are different than the schools that are included in any other HCAC sports. They are: Olivet College, MacMurray College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, Illinois College, and Wabash College.

The Mount began its first year in the HCAC, 1998-1999, placing third in the championship tournament with 53 points. Rico Hill (133), Casey Stouffer (125) and Jimmy Wandsnider (157) were named to the All-Conference Team. Each one of these wrestlers also won their weight class in the tournament.

The 1999-2000 season showcased many accomplishments by the Lions. The Mount placed first in the HCAC Tournament with 98.5 points. Coach Rod Huber was named Coach of the Year, while Rico Hill (133), Jared Combs (184) and James Wagers (197) were all named to the All-Conference Team.

The Lions had another good season in 2000-2001. The Mount placed third in the HCAC Tournament. Kyle Bowser (157) and Jarrod Martin (197) were named All-Conference. With new Head Coach Thomas Wynn leading the way, the Lions improved their skills and results, placing sixth overall in the 2001-2002 conference tournament. Sidney Bostic (141) placed sixth, Robert Roberson (149) placed fourth, Chris Bonati (165) placed third, Jared Combs (184) placed first, and Josh Scharfenberger (197) placed fifth in the conference tournament. Combs was also named First-Team All-Conference.

In the 2002-2003 season the Mount placed fourth in the conference tournament, led by Tim Harrison (141) in first place and Nate Jolly (157) in third place. The Mount had five wrestlers place in the meet, which was won by Manchester College.

The 2003-04 season saw the Lions claim fifth place in the conference tournament. The team was led by Jason Roush (149), who took first place in his weight class and went on to the NCAA National Tournament, and by Ron Helm (141), third place. The Mount also collected one fourth place finish and four fifth place finishes in the tournament.

In the 2004-2005 the Lions recorded a third place finish at the conference tournament, their best finish since 2000-2001. Seven Mount wrestlers recorded placings at the tournament, as Jason Roush (149) and Julian Hall (141) came in first. Three others wrestlers, Tim Harrison (141), Steve Austin (125) and Bob Poweski (197) were all runner-ups in their respective weight classes. The Mount placed second at the Mid-states Conference Tournament for the 2005-2006 season, as Joe Kaake (125), Elliott Spence (157) and Tim Kelly (174) claimed individual titles. The Mount was awarded the HCAC title by out-distancing Manchester College, who was sixth at the Mid-states Conference Tournament.

The Mount, Rose-Hulman and Manchester held the HCAC Duals Tournament in 2006-2007, with the Mount defeating Rose-Hulman, 55-0, and narrowly losing to Manchester, 24-23. Five Mount wrestlers went 2-0 during the two duals, led by Elliott Spence (157) who had two pins. The Mount finished fourth at the Mid-States Conference Tournament and claimed first in the HCAC edging fifth place Rose-Hulman and sixth place Manchester. Jason Roush was voted the Mid-States Conference Wrestler of the Year while Roush, Spence and Josh Sasfy were named to the All-Academic Team. Steve Austin (125), Eric Meyer (133) and Tim Kelly (197) each placed first in their weight division at the Mid-states Tournament.

The Lions recorded a 2-0 mark at the HCAC Tournament duals last season, with Manchester 1-1 and Rose-Hulman 0-2. Mount Head Coach Casey Stouffer was named HCAC Coach of the Year while senior Elliott Spence was honored as HCAC Wrestler of the Year. In the two conference duals, the Mount defeated Manchester, 28-22; and Rose-Hulman, 37-12. Eric Meyer, Spence, Heath Lukacs, Chad Craft, and Pat Truster all went 2-0, and were named First- Team All-HCAC. The Mount was second in the Mid-states Conference Tournament, placing just behind #1 Olivet College, 162.5-141. Stouffer was named Mid-states Coach of the Year while Spence picked up a Mid-states Co-Wrestler of the Year honor. Meyer was named to the Mid-states All-Academic Team. Meyer (133) and Spence (149) each went 3-0 at Mid-States and won their respective weight class.
