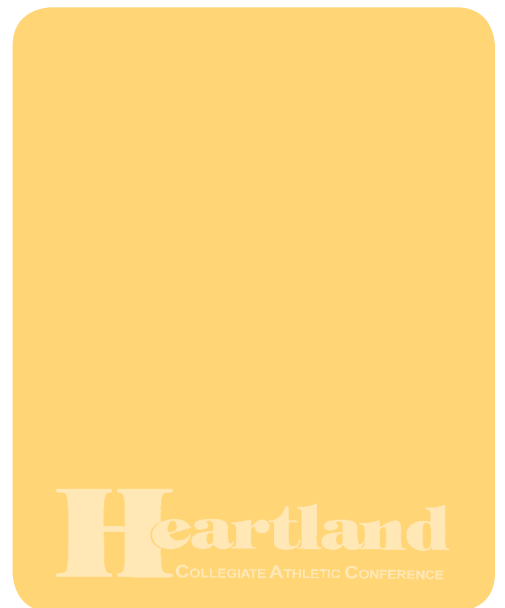

What is the College of Mount St. Joseph educational experience? It's learning through action – serving others, graduate-level research, paid co-op positions, and leadership development. It's a Catholic liberal arts education that helps you develop the knowledge to make a difference and the integrity to lead others.

The foundation of a Mount education comes from career-minded academic programs combined with dedicated support services and a 10:1 student-to-faculty ratio. New programs include a major in interactive media design & computing as well as minors in coaching and Spanish. The Academic Exploration Program, the Learning Center and personal advising are a few examples of the support that is available to help you achieve your academic goals.

At the Mount, you're encouraged to take your lessons outside of the classroom, into the community. Through the Service Learning program, students earn academic credit while volunteering to feed the hungry, building homes for Habitat for Humanity, or comforting the elderly. The Cultural Immersion program offers the chance to live, learn and work amidst other cultures. The Cooperative Education program, available for all majors, is a way for students to gain valuable, paid career experience while validating their choice of a major.

Student-athletes are among the Mount's most active leaders on campus. Competing in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference, the Mount fields more than 20 NCAA Division III sports teams. The newest lineup, men's volleyball, began in spring 2010. Students also participate in 30 student-run clubs and organizations including Student Government Association and Black Student Union.

The Mount is committed to working with students to explore all financial aid options, especially eligibility for financial assistance including scholarships. In 2009-2010, 97 percent of full-time freshmen received some sort of gift aid; more than 10 million dollars in grants and scholarships were received by Mount students.

## Meet the Director of Athletics



### Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 16th year as the Lions' athletics director for the 2009-2010 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount.

Radcliffe, who oversees 22 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. Radcliffe began his career at the Mount in 1986 as an athletic trainer and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition to teaching athletic training, he was the Lions' head athletic trainer for all the intercollegiate sports at the College.

Radcliffe became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, he stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount. Radcliffe received his bachelor's degree in 1978 the University of Montana and his master's degree in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio),

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

## Facilities

### Sports Complex and Schueller Field

The Sports Complex provides a state-of-the-art space for student-athletes and the fans who support them. It houses concessions, locker rooms, showers, equipment storage, and athletic training facilities and can seat sell-out crowds of 2,400. Sporting a synthetic, all-weather playing surface and track, the Mount's Schueller Field plays host to the football, soccer and lacrosse teams, in addition to home track meets.

### Harrington Center

Featuring a 2,000-seat gymnasium, the Jean Patrice Harrington, SC, Student Center is home to the Lions basketball and volleyball teams, and plays host to the wrestling team's home matches. In addition, the facility includes a running track, racquetball courts, a fitness center, and an athletic training center, providing service to student-athletes and the greater Mount community.

### Kinder Morgan Softball Complex

The Kinder Morgan Softball Complex has played host to the Mount's softball team since 2007. In addition, the College has developed property on River Road into practice fields for soccer and baseball. The facilities feature parking, restrooms and a service building for equipment storage.

### Midland Field and Marge Schott Stadium

The Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field in Amelia, Ohio, and at the University of Cincinnati's Marge Schott Stadium. Midland Field is one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators. The stadium features an indoor batting cage and a professionally maintained playing field.

Marge Schott Stadium, has a seating capacity of 3,085, a field turf playing surface and a fully-lit playing field. In addition, the complex houses indoor batting cages and pitcher's mound, a fully equipped press box with private viewing areas, a players' clubhouse and lounge, dressing rooms for coaches, full laundry and equipment facilities, and a state-of-the-art training room.

### Aston Oaks Golf Course

Aston Oaks Golf Course, located 15 minutes from campus, is the Mount's home golf course for the men's and women's golf teams. Constructed by the Jack Nicklaus Design Group, Aston Oaks is a par-72 course. The men's team faces 6,908 yards with a 73.6 rating and 140 slope. The women's team faces 5,758 yards with a 73.2 rating and a 130 slope.

### Mount Tennis Courts

The Lions' men's and women's tennis teams play all home matches on the six, fully-lit asphalt courts located behind the Harrington Center.

### Hayden Field

Located on the west side of campus, next to the tennis courts, Hayden Field is a multi-purpose site that includes a practice field for softball and track & field athletes.

# Cincinnati Spotlights

Students of the College of Mount St. Joseph greatly benefit from the rich heritage and traditions of Cincinnati. While the College is situated 15 minutes west of downtown, employment, arts and entertainment are never too far away.

Numerous Fortune 500 and Fortune 1000 companies are headquartered in Cincinnati. Procter & Gamble, The Kroger Company, and Fifth Third Bank, among others, contribute to Cincinnati's foundation while Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center is among the nations' top children's hospitals. Mount Cooperative Education students are hired by more than 100 hospitals, businesses and nonprofit organizations of Greater Cincinnati.

Boasting a vibrant commitment to the arts, Cincinnatians enjoy the Contemporary Arts Center, Cincinnati Art Museum, Aronoff Center, Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park, Music Hall, and a varied supply of art galleries. Mount students often incorporate Cincinnati's art exhibits and performances into their studies.

Cincinnati knows sports. The Cincinnati Reds, the Major League Baseball team, and the Cincinnati Bengals, of the National Football League, provide competition, entertainment and emotion for the city's sports fans. Co-op and volunteer opportunities with these organizations are often available to Mount students. Cincinnati is also home to the Flying Pig Marathon every May and the Master's and Women's Open tennis tournament every August.

Historical neighborhoods such as Mount Adams, Clifton and Over-the-Rhine make good architectural and cultural adventures, while additional entertainment options are just across the Ohio River in Newport, Covington and Mainstrasse of Northern Kentucky.



## Mission in Action

Inspired by Catholic social teaching, Campus Ministry encourages students to identify their gifts and to use them for the common good through activities such as Pizza and Ponder, Homelessness Awareness Week, and 30-Hour Famine.

## 2010-2011 Season Outlook

For the 2010-2011 season the men's basketball team is going to have to fill some big shoes from the past season. The team lost four seniors who contributed 62 percent of the Lions' scoring in 2009-2010. Head Coach Larry Cox is confident in the talent level of the team but feels they will have to "tweak a few things" in order to take advantage of the new talent.

The Lions graduated First Team All-HCAC honoree Michael Romes as well as Honorable Mention All-Conference players Travis Huffman and Kyle McCord. Mike Mechler, guard, was also lost to graduation. In all, the Lions will have to replace almost 3,500 career points. Cox, while making some adjustments due to the heavy losses, will continue with his philosophy of attacking the ball and attacking the rim.

"My offense is going to be very similar, but we'll emphasize different set plays than what we used a year ago," Cox states. "I'm confident we're going to be a better shooting team and hopefully we'll be able to put multiple players on the floor that will have the ability to shoot the ball so the defense can't key on one or two players."

For the season Coach Cox said he will be emphasizing to the team to establish their own identity which starts with being physically and mentally tough, and competing hard for 40 minutes every game. Other areas that will be emphasized include, utilizing your defense to create your offense, improving full court pressure, rebounding more tenaciously at both ends, and taking better care of the ball.

"You have to have players who will buy into the system," Cox adds. "If they believe in each other then they will share the ball, they'll put the team first and understand it's the name on the front of the jersey that matters, not the back."

The top returners the Lions will feature this season include lettermen: seniors Jordan Brown and John Valerius, as well as junior David Lane.

"I want these guys to continue to improve, be a year better not just a year older and to keep improving and expanding their game," Cox says.

Two potential key personnel additions are transfers Ben Haarman and Matt Wester, both of whom came from scholarship programs and used last year to practice with the team and learn the system. Both Wester and Haarman are seniors. Sophomores Alex Cole, Najeeb Abdur-Rahman, Aaron Barber, and Colin Smart will all be looked upon to make significant contributions as well.

"These guys have now graduated from being on the junior varsity team to now being college varsity players and they'll have some growing pains but they also have the right blend of talent and toughness we're looking for," says Cox.

Asked about any key games for the team this season Coach Cox says, "They are all key games, we have a very ambitious schedule, but the non-conference games against Wilmington College and Thomas More College, both of whom are top-20 teams nationally, certainly stand out as well as our exhibition game against NCAA Division II Northern Kentucky University and a regular season game at Division I Ball State University. Of course all our games in the HCAC are key to us. There's a reason the conference is considered one of the six power conferences in the nation, there is just so much parity and balance from top to bottom. I cannot think of another sport or conference where every team in the conference has beaten a top-20 team in the past five years!"

For the overall season outlook the Lions are prepared and poised to challenge in the HCAC, but it will come at a cost to achieve it.

"You need to have a high degree of commitment and sacrifice if you want to compete for the top spot in the HCAC," states Cox. "I believe this team wants to put the necessary time in both on and off the court in order to compete at the highest level in the HCAC."

# 2010-2011 Coaching Staff



## HEAD COACH LARRY COX

Larry Cox begins his 13th season as the only men's basketball coach in the history of the Lions' program. He started the program in 1998 and his team finished with a winning record in its inaugural season. Over the past 12 seasons he has built the Mount into a solid, competitive basketball program that has achieved

winning seasons and into a team that has defeated Top 25 opponents. Coach Cox is looking to take the Mount to the next step this season – competing for the HCAC regular season title and getting the Lions back into the HCAC Tournament. The Lions' coach is also entering his seventh year as the Mount's assistant athletic director.

Coach Cox's first head coaching position came in the 1990 season at Thomas More College as he inherited a program that had not had a winning season in a decade and during his coaching tenure he turned the program around - finishing with four straight winning seasons. He compiled an overall record of 96-95 and was named AMC Coach of the Year in both the 1994-95 and 1995-96 seasons, while also leading his school to the AMC regular season and tournament championships.

Prior to his tenure at Thomas More, Cox was the associate head coach from 1983-1989 at St. Joseph's College (Indiana), an NCAA Division II

program, where he helped lead the program to an average of 16 wins a season in the tough Great Lakes Valley Conference, which includes perennial powerhouses Kentucky Wesleyan, Southern Indiana and Northern Kentucky.

Coach Cox also spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at NCAA Division I Bowling Green State University (Ohio) in 1981-82 and 1982-83. During the first season the Falcons were conference runners-up and in the second season they won the Mid-American Conference outright finishing with a 21-9 record. For two seasons, from 1979-1981, he was an assistant at Hanover College (Indiana), where the school averaged 24 wins a season, won two Hoosier-Buckeye Conference Championships and advanced to the Elite Eight in the NAIA National Tournament.

Coach Cox holds a Bachelor of Arts in History degree from Hanover College (Indiana) and a Master of Arts in History degree and a Master of Education in Physical Education degree from Bowling Green State University (Ohio). He has taught classes at Bowling Green State University, St. Joseph's College, Thomas More College, and the Mount. During his tenure as a head coach, every player who has completed their four years of eligibility obtained a degree.

Coach Cox and his wife, Beth, reside in West Chester, Ohio and have triplet sons, Luke, Jake and Ryan.

## ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH DEL WALTERS

Del Walters begins his fifth season as a Mount basketball assistant coach. Walters is also the Lions' head men's tennis coach. He was named associate head men's basketball coach in August 2007. Walters is the basketball program's recruiting, strength and conditioning and summer camp coordinator.

Walters came to the Mount from Thomas More College where he was a men's basketball assistant coach since 2000. He was also Thomas More's head men's tennis coach (2004-2005), guiding the team to a 7-5 record, and was the men's and women's head cross country coach (2005-2006). Walters also assisted the men's basketball team at John Carroll University as a graduate assistant coach (1999-2000), after playing for two seasons and being a student assistant coach for two seasons. **ASSISTANT COACH GIL VOIGT**

He has been an assistant at Oak Hills High School (1994-1998), and has coached many teams in AAU programs offered to basketball players in the summer. He was also a television sportscaster for WECT-TV and WWAY-TV in Wilmington, North Carolina, for nine years.

Coach Voigt worked as the assistant publicity director, in spring training, for the Cincinnati Reds, 1991-1993. He currently produces TV statistics for many major league baseball teams that come to Great American Ballpark. Coach Voigt has also been a licensed football, basketball and baseball official since 1974, and is currently employed by the Fairfield City School District as a science teacher. In addition, Voigt is the head junior varsity and varsity assistant baseball coach at Madeira High School.

Coach Voigt resides in Cincinnati, Ohio.

**ASSISTANT COACH RODNEY MORGAN**

Rodney Morgan begins his sixth season on the Mount's staff. He also has coaching experience at Lawrenceburg Community Schools, coached football, basketball and track & field for 15 years.

## The Mount in the HCAC

This will be the 13<sup>th</sup> season for the Mount's men's basketball team in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC). Other institutions that are also members of this conference include: Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Earlham College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University.

In 1998, the first year for the Mount's basketball program as well as the first year of the HCAC play, the lions went 5-9 in the conference, which put them in sixth place out of eight teams. Jarrett Young was named Freshman of the Year and gained Honorable Mention All-Conference award. Joe Toney also received an All-Conference Honorable Mention award for his efforts during the season.

The Mount greatly improved in the 1999-2000 season. The Lions were 6-6 in conference play and won their way into the final four of the tournament where they lost in overtime to the champion, Franklin College. Jarrett Young was All-Tournament team for his contribution during the post-season. Other Lions received acknowledgement for outstanding play. Jared Franz and Joe Toney were named All-Conference while Young was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. Joe Toney also was named Player of the Week twice during the season.

The Lions tied for fifth place in the HCAC with five wins and seven loses in the 2000-01 season. The Mount was actually in first place with about two weeks to play but slipped in the standings and finished as the seventh and last seed in the post-season conference tournament. The Lions' season came to an end in the first round with a loss to Hanover, 73-69. Junior forward Jared Franz was selected All-Conference while junior forward Steve Bain was chosen Honorable Mention All-Conference.

The 2001-2002 campaign was a season marked by milestone achievements for two players. Seniors Joe Toney and Jarrett Young both scored their 1,000<sup>th</sup> career point. Steve Bain was named First Team All-Conference and was also a Player of the Week. Young received an All-Conference Honorable Mention award. The Mount lost in the first round of the tournament but placed fifth in the regular season team standings, recording a 5-9 mark.

The Lions began the 2002-2003 season winning three of their first four conference games and were 5-3 before suffering six straight HCAC losses. The Mount defeated second-place Anderson University and fourth-place Defiance College during the regular season, the Mount bounced back to defeat the Spartans on the road in the first round of the tournament. Tom

Luther, who finished second in the conference in rebounding, was a two time HCAC Player of the Week winner and also made All-Conference. Chris Washington was also selected to the All-Conference team.

In 2003-2004, the Mount played competitively throughout most of the HCAC campaign, despite posting a 4-10 conference mark. Their wins included triumphs over Manchester and Anderson, as well as Defiance and Bluffton (back-to-back). The Mount also lost two games in overtime to Anderson and Transylvania. They did, however, win three of their last five regular season HCAC games and suffered a one-point loss to Defiance in the HCAC tournament. Seniors Tom Luther and E.J. Engelkamp collected conference post-season awards. Luther was sixth in the conference in scoring, while teammate Matt Volkerding was first in rebounding and third in blocked shots.

The Mount began the 2004-2005 season conference slate with two straight wins and played well at home, finishing 4-3 in conference play. The Lions, however, recorded a 1-6 road record in the conference, winning only at Defiance College. After that win, the Mount dropped four straight HCAC match-ups to slip to 5-9 in the conference. They dropped a six-point decision in the first round of the HCAC Tournament to eventual winner Franklin College. The Lions finished third as a team in blocked shots and tied for first in steals. Kevin Darthard, who was named First Team All-Conference, was fifth in HCAC in scoring average and field goal percentage. Derrick Jones was selected Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

In 2005-2006, the Lions had one of the most successful seasons in the program's history. Winning six of their first seven games to start the season, the Mount finished 16-11 overall and 8-6 in the tough HCAC. Finishing fourth in the HCAC regular season, the Lions were the number four seed and hosted their conference tournament opener, beating number five seed Manchester 67-55. However, their season would end in the conference semifinals, when they lost to the seventh-ranked team in the country, Transylvania, 83-79. Leading the way for the Mount were seniors Kevin Darthard and Derrick Jones, who were voted First team All-Conference. Other notable HCAC accomplishments included juniors Robbie Noschang and Tony Blomer being named Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

The Lions started out slowly in the conference in 2006-2007, going 1-2 but then ran off a five-game win streak to up their record to 6-2. The Mount was in the thick of the conference race for first place the rest of the season, but was hurt by two close losses down the stretch – an overtime loss to Defiance and a one point defeat to Bluffton.

Their 9-7 record was tied for the third-best record in the conference, but the Mount was denied the fourth and final HCAC tournament spot on the tie-breaker system. Michael Romes was selected first Freshman of the Year and First Team All-HCAC while teammate Tony Blomer was also a First Team All-Conference selection. Romes led the conference in field goal percentage while Blomer paced the HCAC in blocked shots. Teammates Jeff Perry and Michael Eirons both made Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

The Lions had a rough start to the 2007-2008 conference season, losing their first four HCAC games, but bounced back to win two of three after that. The win total for HCAC games included a victory over conference champion Defiance. The Mount was fifth in points per game and fourth in field goal percentage while several individual Lions' players made their mark in HCAC games. Michael Romes was second in points per game, and fifth in rebounds per game and shooting percentage, while teammate Michael Eirons ranked in top 11 in four different statistical categories in conference action. Josh Carter led the conference in assists per game and fourth in free throw accuracy. Romes was selected First Team All-HCAC for the second straight season while Mitchell Goldschmidt, Eirons and Carter were chosen Honorable Mention All-Conference. Romes also picked up an HCAC Player of the Week award.

While the Mount only captured two conference wins during the 2008-2009 season, they did play competitively in a number of HCAC games, losing nine games by 10 points or less, including four games, by four points or less. One big win during the HCAC season was the team's one-point home win over Bluffton University, who finished with the third-best record in HCAC play. The Lions were fifth in both the team defense field goal percentage and team defense three-point field goal percentage categories, and fourth in assists and steals. Michel Romes, was named First Team All-HCAC, was second in the conference in points per game, fourth in rebounds per game, and seventh in steals per game. Chris Cioffi was fourth in field goal percentages. Kyle McCord and Travis Huffman were each awarded Honorable Mention All-HCAC.

The Mount began and finished the 2009-2010 season winning two straight conference games. In addition they lost ten games by ten points or less. Michael Romes, who again was selected First Team All-HCAC for his fourth year in a row and was a HCAC Player of the Week honoree, led the conference in scoring and was fourth in rebounding. Two other Mount players, Travis Huffman and Kyle McCord, both received Honorable Mention All-HCAC. The Mount was fifth in rebounding margin and third in assists as a team.
