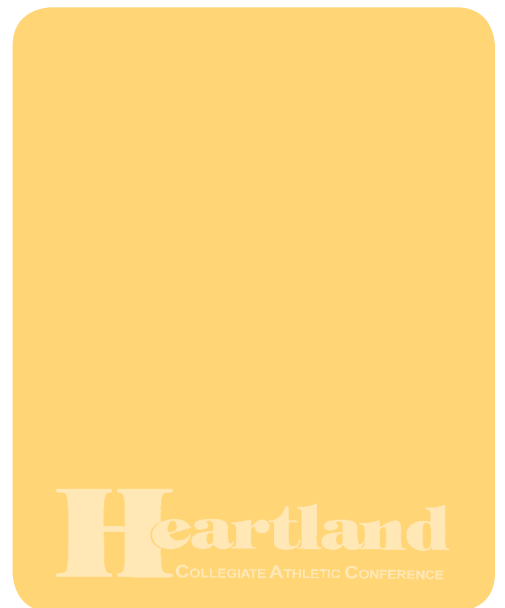

What is the College of Mount St. Joseph educational experience? It's learning through action – serving others, graduate-level research, paid co-op positions, and leadership development. It's a Catholic liberal arts education that helps you develop the knowledge to make a difference and the integrity to lead others.

The foundation of a Mount education comes from career-minded academic programs combined with dedicated support services and a 10:1 student-to-faculty ratio. New programs include a major in interactive media design & computing as well as minors in coaching and Spanish. The Academic Exploration Program, the Learning Center and personal advising are a few examples of the support that is available to help you achieve your academic goals.

At the Mount, you're encouraged to take your lessons outside of the classroom, into the community. Through the Service Learning program, students earn academic credit while volunteering to feed the hungry, building homes for Habitat for Humanity, or comforting the elderly. The Cultural Immersion program offers the chance to live, learn and work amidst other cultures. The Cooperative Education program, available for all majors, is a way for students to gain valuable, paid career experience while validating their choice of a major.

Student-athletes are among the Mount's most active leaders on campus. Competing in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference, the Mount fields more than 20 NCAA Division III sports teams. The newest lineup, men's volleyball, begins in spring 2010. Students also participate in 30 student-run clubs and organizations including Student Government Association and Black Student Union.

The Mount is committed to working with students to explore all financial aid options, especially eligibility for financial assistance including scholarships. In 2009-2010, 97 percent of full-time freshmen received some sort of gift aid; more than 10 million dollars in grants and scholarships were received by Mount students.

### Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 16th year as the Lions' athletics director for the 2009-2010 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount.

Radcliffe, who oversees 22 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. Radcliffe began his career at the Mount in 1986 as an athletic trainer and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition to teaching athletic training, he was the Lions' head athletic trainer for all the intercollegiate sports at the College.

Radcliffe became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, he stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount. Radcliffe received his bachelor's degree in 1978 the University of Montana and his master's degree in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio).

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

## Facilities

### Sports Complex and Schueler Field

The Sports Complex provides a state-of-the-art space for student-athletes and the fans who support them. It houses concessions, locker rooms, showers, equipment storage, and athletic training facilities and can seat sell-out crowds of 2,400. Sporting a synthetic, all-weather playing surface and track, the Mount's Schueler Field plays host to the football, soccer and lacrosse teams, in addition to home track meets.

### Harrington Center

Featuring a 2,000-seat gymnasium, the Jean Patrice Harrington, SC, Student Center is home to the Lions basketball and volleyball teams, and plays host to the wrestling team's home matches. In addition, the facility includes a running track, racquetball courts, a fitness center, and an athletic training center, providing service to student-athletes and the greater Mount community.

### Kinder Morgan Softball Complex

The Kinder Morgan Softball Complex has played host to the Mount's softball team since 2007. In addition, the College has developed property on River Road into practice fields for soccer and baseball. The facilities feature parking, restrooms and a service building for equipment storage.

### Midland Field and Marge Schott Stadium

The Lions' baseball team plays home games at Midland Field in Amelia, Ohio, and at the University of Cincinnati's Marge Schott Stadium. Midland Field is one of Cincinnati's finest baseball facilities for teams and spectators. The stadium features an indoor batting cage and a professionally maintained playing field.

Marge Schott Stadium, has a seating capacity of 3,085, a field turf playing surface and a fully-lit playing field. In addition, the complex houses indoor batting cages and pitcher's mound, a fully equipped press box with private viewing areas, a players' clubhouse and lounge, dressing rooms for coaches, full laundry and equipment facilities, and a state-of-the-art training room.

### Aston Oaks Golf Course

Aston Oaks Golf Course, located 15 minutes from campus, is the Mount's home golf course for the men's and women's golf teams. Constructed by the Jack Nicklaus Design Group, Aston Oaks is a par-72 course. The men's team faces 6,908 yards with a 73.6 rating and 140 slope. The women's team faces 5,758 yards with a 73.2 rating and a 130 slope.

### Mount Tennis Courts

The Lions' men's and women's tennis teams play all home matches on the six, fully-lit asphalt courts located behind the Harrington Center.

### Hayden Field

Located on the west side of campus, next to the tennis courts, Hayden Field is a multi-purpose site that includes a practice field for softball and track & field athletes.

# Cincinnati Spotlights

Students of the College of Mount St. Joseph greatly benefit from the rich heritage and traditions of Cincinnati. While the College is situated 15 minutes west of downtown, employment, arts and entertainment are never too far away.

Numerous Fortune 500 and Fortune 1000 companies are headquartered in Cincinnati. Procter & Gamble, The Kroger Company, and Fifth Third Bank, among others, contribute to Cincinnati's foundation while Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center is among the nation's top children's hospitals. Mount Cooperative Education students are hired by more than 100 hospitals, businesses and nonprofit organizations of Greater Cincinnati.

Boasting a vibrant commitment to the arts, Cincinnatians enjoy the Contemporary Arts Center, Cincinnati Art Museum, Aronoff Center, Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park, Music Hall, and a varied supply of art galleries. Mount students often incorporate Cincinnati's art exhibits and performances into their studies.

Cincinnati knows sports. The Cincinnati Reds, the Major League Baseball team, and the Cincinnati Bengals, of the National Football League, provide competition, entertainment and emotion for the city's sports fans. Co-op and volunteer opportunities with these organizations are often available to Mount students. Cincinnati is also home to the Flying Pig Marathon every May and the Master's and Women's Open tennis tournament every August.

Historical neighborhoods such as Mount Adams, Clifton and Over-the-Rhine make good architectural and cultural adventures, while additional entertainment options are just across the Ohio River in Newport, Covington and Mainstrasse of Northern Kentucky.



## Mission in Action

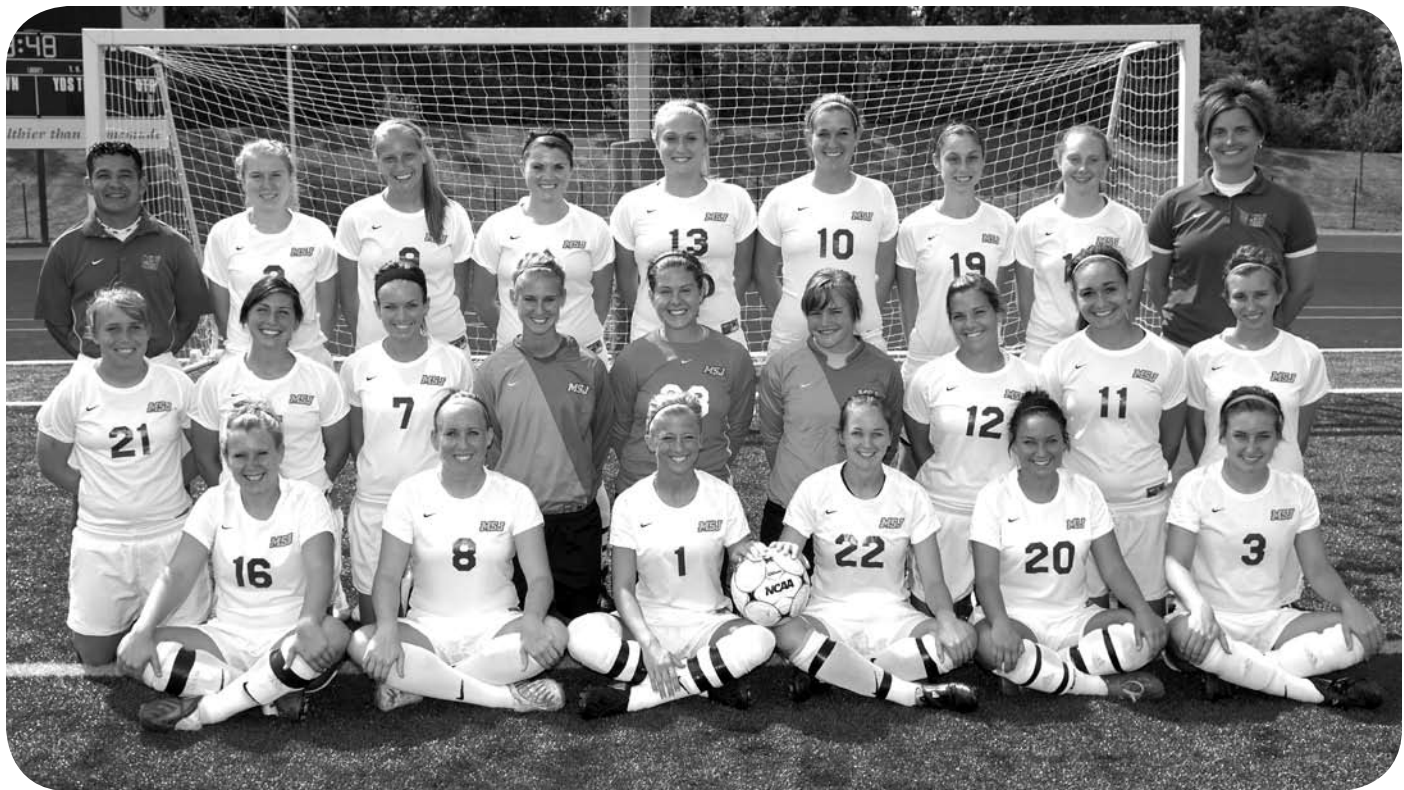

## 2010 Season Outlook

To play in the NCAA tournament you need to have the team peaking at the right time and hitting all cylinders. According to Head Coach Leah Todd that is what the women's soccer team needs to do if they want to compete for a Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference Championship this fall.

Last season was Coach Todd's first season as the women's head soccer coach and she said she dealt with a lot of trial and error.

"I was afraid I was going to make a mistake that would cost us a game," she adds. However she learned that you can learn from those mistakes for the next game and make any other changes that need to be made.

"I am going to be better prepared for each game we go into this season," says Todd. With an 11-6-2 overall and 6-2 conference record in 2009, the women's team qualified to the HCAC Tournament and finished tied for third place in the conference.

"We have great senior leaders who are stepping up and setting the example for the underclassmen. Seniors Jessica Smith, Ashley Maynard and Carrie Rickett are some of the few seniors we have that have stepped it up," Todd says.

The team is returning all the offense from last year in the forward and midfield spots. However, the defense will be looking for players to step up and contribute. The Lions lost two starters in Laurie Neumann and Shannon Nortman.

"Some players will be moved from midfield to the back and a few of our freshman girls will need to make an impact to help us out," Todd adds.

According to Todd, the conference will be tough with Earlham College joining the conference this fall, Hanover College young, as well as Transylvania University, always being good.

"The conference used to just have four teams battling for the top spot now there it's like six or seven teams," Todd states. "We just need to never give up and never quit."

There will be a few games that Coach Todd says that will be key for the team during the upcoming season: including the opening game against Wittenberg University and all conference games specially our

first one against Bluffton University, Hanover College (Pink Game) and Transylvania University.

Junior Andrea Caldwell is the powerhouse upfront leading the way. She led the team in scoring with 12 goals. To help Caldwell in the front will be junior Ashley Smith, sophomores Alyssa Seiler and Jasmine Merk.

"We have a lot of depth on this team so I will be able to mix and match lineups which gives me more freedom and others team will not know what to expect from us," Todd says.

The midfield is also going to be strong and deep again this year. Seniors Jessica Smith and Maynard will be leading the group at those spots. Maynard had four goals and also contributed four assists last season, while Smith tallied a goal and assisted on a team-high five goals. Sophomores Jessica Pykosz and Brittany Bowman will be helping in the midfield, too. Pykosz recorded eight goals which were second behind Caldwell's total. Bowman is coming off an injury from last season but was a big contributor when healthy. Coach Todd says Smith and Pykosz have been working really hard this offseason and have let her know how the team was doing with off-season workouts and pickup games.

Coming off injury from last year will be senior Carrie Rickett. Rickett was injured midway through last season and had to sit out the rest of the year. Todd is looking for big things from Rickett.

"Carrie will ready physically and mentally for this season," Todd adds. "After missing part of last year, Carrie will want to come in and contribute big time for the team."

Todd faces replacing graduating seniors Neumann and Nortman on defense a challenge. The only returner on the backline is senior Sarah Schulte who will be moved from outside to inside defense. Coach Todd says Schulte is primed for a big season and will be relying on her to help carry the defense this season.

Last season's goalkeeping duties were split between freshmen Shelbi Benzinger and Kayla Ziegler. Ziegler will not return for 2010 and sophomore Paige Apel and freshman Chelsea Lang look to provide depth in the nets for the team this fall.

## Mount in the HCAC

This season marks the Mount's 13<sup>th</sup> season of action in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. While a member of the conference, the Lions have been an HCAC power, competing against Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University. Their overall record during their time spent in the conference is 77-15-9. This mark includes six outright conference titles and one shared HCAC title. The Lions hold a winning record against seven of the eight conference opponents, including undefeated marks against Anderson (16-0), Franklin (14-0), Bluffton (12-0), and Defiance (14-0-2).

In 1998, the Lions first year in the HCAC, the Mount and Wilmington were co-champions with a record of 5-1-1. There was not a conference tournament that year, but many Mount players were recognized for outstanding achievement. Three players were named First Team All-Conference, one player was named Second Team All-Conference, Mandy Blazer was co-MVP of the conference, and Head Coach Sam Pogoni was named Coach of the Year.

The Lions placed second in the regular season with a 5-1 record in 1999, falling just short to Wilmington, who compiled a 6-0 mark. In the HCAC Tournament, the Mount went 3-0, defeating Wilmington by a 1-0 score, giving the Lions the tournament championship. Many Mount players were acknowledge for their accomplishments in 1999 as three players were named First Team All-Conference and one player received an Honorable Mention award.

In 2000, the Lions swept the conference 6-0 and won the season end tournament. They went 2-0 in the tournament defeating Anderson 5-0 in the championship. As in previous years, the Mount had a number of players received awards. Lisa Sutton was named Player of the Year. Sutton and two other players were named First Team All-Conference and two players were named Second Team All-Conference.

In 2001, the Mount placed second behind an undefeated Transylvania team in regular season play with 5-1 record, but fought back to win the conference championship to qualify for the NCAA Division III Regional Tournament. The Lions again received many honors including three All-Conference nominees. In addition, Lisa

Sutton was also awarded Academic All-Conference Academic All-District, NSCAA All-Ohio, and Conference Player of the Week twice. Jill Miller was also an HCAC Player of the Week honoree and Sam Pogoni was named Coach of the Year.

The Lions won five of seven games in the conference in 2002 (with one tie against defending regular season champion Transylvania). The team's lone setback in regular season play came by a 1-0 score at Hanover College. The Mount avenged that loss by defeating the Panthers 2-0 in the conference championship game. Three Mount players, Erin Fox, Erin Mallory, and Lindsay Doll were named All-Conference.

The Lions slipped a bit in conference play during the 2003 season but still compiled a .500 record with a 3-3-1 record. That record left them in fifth place tie with Defiance, as they missed qualifying to the post-season HCAC Tournament for the first time ever. The Mount scored the second most goals in conference-only games. Michele Philips was selected All-Conference honors.

After a one-year absence from the HCAC Tournament, the Mount returned to conference post-season competition in 2004, but dropped a 1-0 double overtime game to eventual HCAC Tournament champion Manchester. The Lions' defense posted three shutouts in conference play, and qualified to the HCAC Tournament by blanking Bluffton, 6-0, collecting the third seed in the tournament. A conference-tying best total of five players received All-Conference recognition: Margie Pfiester, Jessey Spradlin, Lori Sullivan, Michele Phillips, and Sarah Lamping.

Over the course of the 2005 season, the Mount compiled a record of 13-6-2, including a 5-0-2 HCAC record, and steamed rolled to yet another conference championship. Leading the way for the Lions in 2005 was Jessey Spradlin, who tallied nine goals in conference games and was named the HCAC Most Valuable Player. Other players receiving First Team All-Conference recognition were Sandy Rack, Katie Henlein, Michele Phillips Kristi Poling, and Amanda Hauck. Hauck had an HCAC-best four shutouts in conference play. Head Coach Carrie Taylor was named HCAC Coach of the Year.

The Lions recorded another stellar season of play in the HCAC during the 2006 campaign, when they rolled to a 7-1 record, good for second place in the conference. The Mount out-scored their opponents

41-5 in HCAC play. The Lions defeated Rose-Hulman in the first round of the HCAC Tournament, 3-1 but fell in the conference championship game to Transylvania by an identical score. Jessey Spradlin, who led the conference in points per game, and goals, and was tied for second in assists, was voted HCAC Most Valuable Player for the second straight season. She also won three Conference Player of the Week awards. Mount teammates Katie Henlein, Beth Schuermann and Sarah Thaxton were among the offensive statistical leaders while Becky Thaxton was second in goals against average and shutouts, and tied for sixth in saves, as well as HCAC co-freshman of the Year. Sandy Rack, Kristi Poling, Spradlin and Henlein were named First Team All-Conference while Laurie Neumann and Schuermann were selected Second Team All-HCAC. As a team, the Lions were first in conference in points, goals and assists, as well as second in goals against average and tied for second in shutouts.

The Mount finished in third place in the HCAC in 2007, losing to the conference's top two teams, Rose Hulman and Transylvania both by 1-0 scores. The Lions were ousted in the HCAC Tournament by Transylvania, 3-1, but had a fine all-around season of play from many individuals adding up to a strong team performance. The Mount was second in shutouts, goals against average, and assists, and was third in points scored and tied for third in goals scored. Freshman Ashley Maynard was first in game winning goals, fourth in goals per game and sixth in points per game. Mount leading scorer Beth Schuermann was also in the top ten in the HCAC goals per game and points per game. Allie Pirman was second in the conference in assists per game. Kelly Bare finished first in the HCAC in shutouts (five), second in goals against average and seventh in saves. Schuermann, Pirman, and Laurie Neumann were named First Team All-HCAC while Bare and Laura Mund were named Second Team All-Conference. Bare also picked up an HCAC Player of the Week award.

In 2008 the Lions claimed both their regular season title and the conference tournament championship, going undefeated during the

entire conference slate of games, out-scoring their opponents 22-1. The Mount was first in HCAC team statistical categories goals allowed per game and shutouts; and second in points scored, goals scored, and assist. Conference MVP Kelly Bare, was second in goals against average and first in shutouts, as she was selected a two-time Player of the Week winner and First Team All-Conference. Beth Schuermann, also a First Team All-Conference honoree, was tied for third in points per game, second in goals and tied for first in game-winning goals, and collected two Player of the Week awards. She was joined on the First Team by Allie Pirman, Laurie Neumann and Shannon Nortman. Nikki Jones, Laura Mund and Jessica Jester were named Second Team All-HCAC. Ashley Maynard was second in the conference in assists while Head Coach Carrie Taylor collected the HCAC Coach of the Year award.

The Lions recorded a second-place tie with Transylvania in the HCAC standings, with each finishing with 6-2 marks during the 2009 season. Hanover and Rose-Hulman tied for first place and the four teams faced off in the opening round of the Conference tournament. The Mount fell to Hanover, 2-1, to end their season at 11-6-2 overall. The Lions allowed only five goals in eight regular season conference games, and scored a conference-best 22 goals in those contests. Andrea Caldwell had a stellar season for the Mount, leading the conference in points per game, goals per game and game winning-goals (four). She won HCAC Player of the Week honors twice and was named First Team All-HCAC. Jessica Pykosz, who was third in assists per game, was named First Team All-Conference, as was Laurie Neumann. Ashley Maynard was also third in assists per game and was a Second Team All-HCAC honoree. Shannon Nortman also garnered Second Team All-Conference honors while Shelbi Benzinger was first in goals against average and first in shutout (four). Brittany Bowman picked up a HCAC Player of the Week award during the season. As a team, the Lions were first in points and goals; second in goals against average and shutouts; and third in assists.
