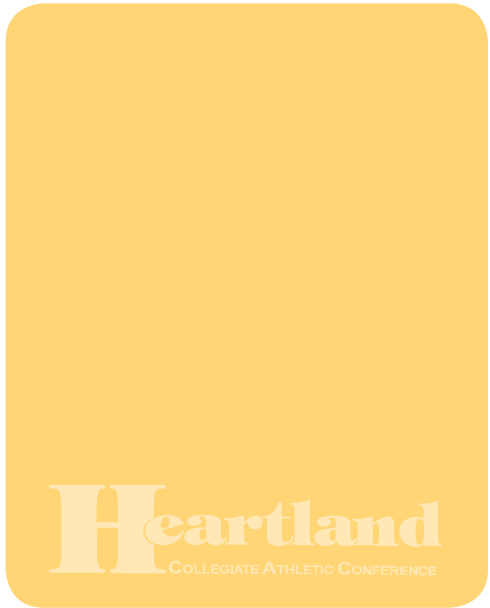

What is the College of Mount St. Joseph educational experience? It's learning through action – serving others, graduate-level research, paid co-op positions, and leadership development. It's a Catholic liberal arts education that helps you develop the knowledge to make a difference and the integrity to lead others.

The foundation of a Mount education comes from career-minded academic programs combined with dedicated support services and a 10:1 student-to-faculty ratio. New programs include a major in interactive media design & computing as well as minors in coaching and Spanish. The Academic Exploration Program, the Learning Center and personal advising are a few examples of the support that is available to help you achieve your academic goals.

At the Mount, you're encouraged to take your lessons outside of the classroom, into the community. Through the Service Learning program, students earn academic credit while volunteering to feed the hungry, building homes for Habitat for Humanity, or comforting the elderly. The Cultural Immersion program offers the chance to live, learn and work amidst other cultures. The Cooperative Education program, available for all majors, is a way for students to gain valuable, paid career experience while validating their choice of a major.

Student-athletes are among the Mount's most active leaders on campus. Competing in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference, the Mount fields more than 20 NCAA Division III sports teams. The newest lineup, men's volleyball, began in spring 2010. Students also participate in 30 student-run clubs and organizations including Student Government Association and Black Student Union.

The Mount is committed to working with students to explore all financial aid options, especially eligibility for financial assistance including scholarships. In 2009-2010, 97 percent of full-time freshmen received some sort of gift aid; more than 10 million dollars in grants and scholarships were received by Mount students.

Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 16th year as the Lions' athletics director for the 2009-2010 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount.

Radcliffe, who oversees 22 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. Radcliffe began his career at the Mount in 1986 as an athletic trainer and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition to teaching athletic training, he was the Lions' head athletic trainer for all the intercollegiate sports at the College.

Radcliffe became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, he stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount. Radcliffe received his bachelor's degree in 1978 the University of Montana and his master's degree in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio),

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

Facilities

Sports Complex and Schueler Field

The Sports Complex provides a state-of-the-art space for student-athletes and the fans who support them. It houses concessions, locker rooms, showers, equipment storage, and athletic training facilities and can seat sell-out crowds of 2,400. Sporting a synthetic, all-weather playing surface and track, the Mount's Schueler Field plays host to the football, soccer and lacrosse teams, in addition to home track meets.

Harrington Center

Featuring a 2,000-seat gymnasium, the Jean Patrice Harrington, SC, Student Center is home to the Lions basketball and volleyball teams, and plays host to the wrestling team's home matches. In addition, the facility includes a running track, racquetball courts, a fitness center, and an athletic training center, providing service to student-athletes and the greater Mount community.

Kinder Morgan Softball Complex

The Kinder Morgan Softball Complex has played host to the Mount's softball team since 2007. In addition, the College has developed property on River Road into practice fields for soccer and baseball. The facilities feature parking, restrooms and a service building for equipment storage.

Marge Schott Stadium/Western Hills High School

The Lions' baseball team plays home games at the University of Cincinnati's Marge Schott Stadium, and at Western Hills High School.

Marge Schott Stadium, has a seating capacity of 3,085, a field turf playing surface and a fully-lit playing field. In addition, the complex houses indoor batting cages and pitcher's mound, a fully equipped press box with private viewing areas, a players' clubhouse and lounge, dressing rooms for coaches, full laundry and equipment facilities, and a state-of-the-art training room.

Aston Oaks Golf Course

Aston Oaks Golf Course, located 15 minutes from campus, is the Mount's home golf course for the men's and women's golf teams. Constructed by the Jack Nicklaus Design Group, Aston Oaks is a par-72 course. The men's team faces 6,908 yards with a 73.6 rating and 140 slope. The women's team faces 5,758 yards with a 73.2 rating and a 130 slope.

Mount Tennis Courts

The Lions' men's and women's tennis teams play all home matches on the six, fully-lit asphalt courts located behind the Harrington Center.

Hayden Field

Located on the west side of campus, next to the tennis courts, Hayden Field is a multi-purpose site that includes a practice field for softball and track & field athletes.

Cincinnati Spotlights

Students of the College of Mount St. Joseph greatly benefit from the rich heritage and traditions of Cincinnati. While the College is situated 15 minutes west of downtown, employment, arts and entertainment are never too far away.

Numerous Fortune 500 and Fortune 1000 companies are headquartered in Cincinnati. Procter & Gamble, The Kroger Company, and Fifth Third Bank, among others, contribute to Cincinnati's foundation while Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center is among the nations' top children's hospitals. Mount Cooperative Education students are hired by more than 100 hospitals, businesses and nonprofit organizations of Greater Cincinnati.

Boasting a vibrant commitment to the arts, Cincinnatians enjoy the Contemporary Arts Center, Cincinnati Art Museum, Aronoff Center, Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park, Music Hall, and a varied supply of art galleries. Mount students often incorporate Cincinnati's art exhibits and performances into their studies.

Cincinnati knows sports. The Cincinnati Reds, the Major League Baseball team, and the Cincinnati Bengals, of the National Football League, provide competition, entertainment and emotion for the city's sports fans. Co-op and volunteer opportunities with these organizations are often available to Mount students. Cincinnati is also home to the Flying Pig Marathon every May and the Master's and Women's Open tennis tournament every August.

Historical neighborhoods such as Mount Adams, Clifton and Over-the-Rhine make good architectural and cultural adventures, while additional entertainment options are just across the Ohio River in Newport, Covington and Mainstrasse of Northern Kentucky.

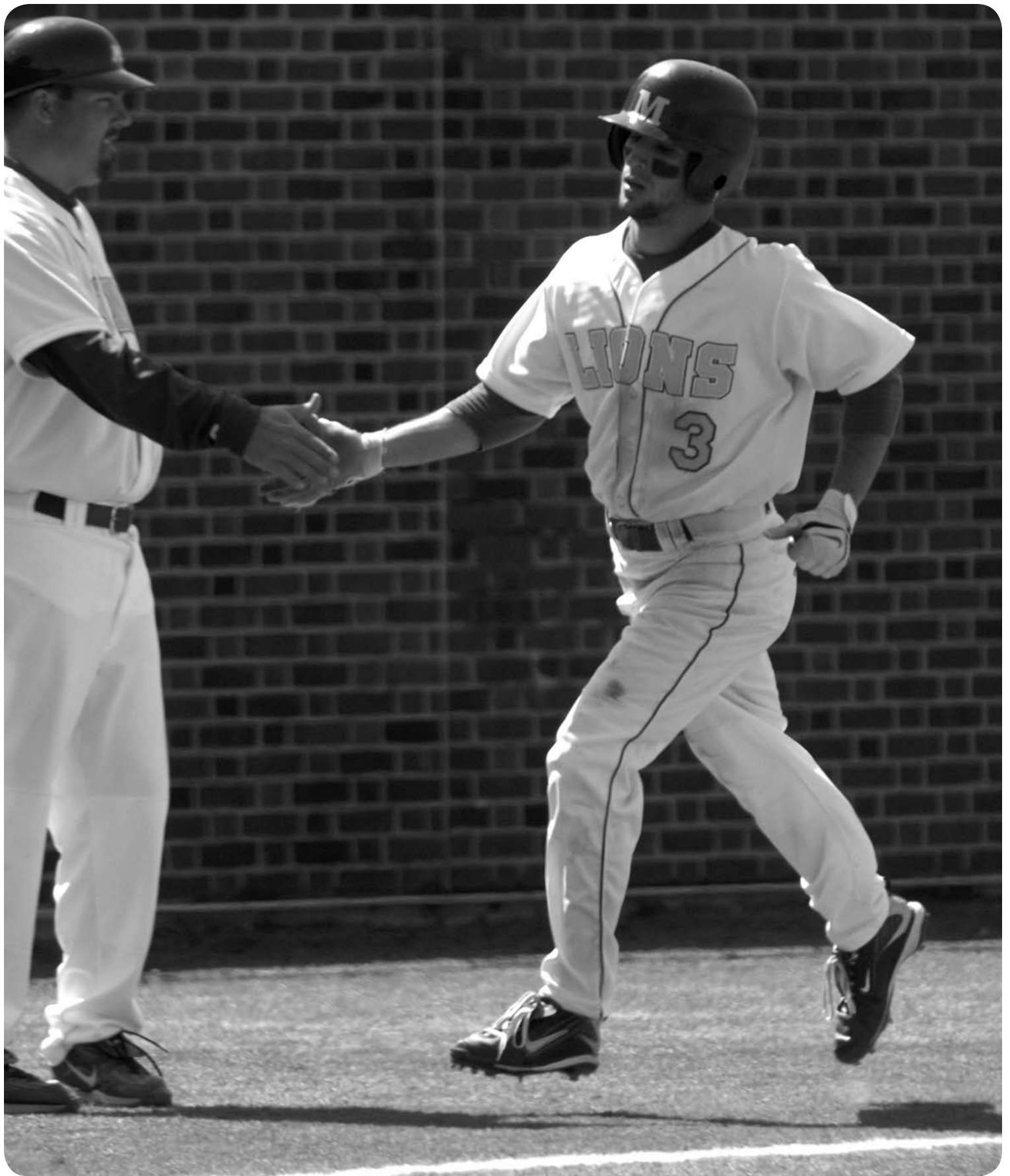


Mission in Action

The Lions are coming off a season a year ago that saw them produce an 18-22 overall mark and 8-14 conference mark. The sub-.500 record was the team's first since the 1995 season and their conference finish (sixth) left them out of the HCAC Post Season Tournament for the first time since the 2002 season.

Head Coach Chuck Murray admits that while the conference teams got better overall, from top to bottom, his team did fall short of their season goals – make and win the conference tournament, and post 25 or more wins – due to consistency in all areas of the game. The Lions' veteran mentor, his coaching staff, and team are looking to turn things around this spring and get back to the level of winning they had been accustomed to in the past.

"I've always said that this conference is one of the best in the country," Murray adds. "We could not handle the top four teams in the conference, going 1-11, as well as going 0-2 against the team that finished fifth (Transylvania). We want to start a new streak of better than .500 seasons and making the HCAC Post Season Tournament."

One large addition to the Lions for the 2011 season is on the team's coaching staff – pitching coach Joe Regruth. Regruth, who was the first Mount baseball head coach in the team's history, coaching the Lions from 1994-1996, returns and brings with him a wealth of coaching experience, from both the high school and college (Division I) ranks.

"Joe has had a lot of success over the years," Murray says. "I feel he'll bring a demeanor and presence to our team, and our pitchers, that hopefully will push our guys to work harder."

The Lions' roster numbers 30 this season, 20 of whom are returners from last season. The Mount has nine seniors on the team, along with eight juniors.

The following is a look at the Lions position-by-position with comments provided by Coach Murray.

PITCHING

The Lions have good experience in both their starting pitching and relief corps ranks this spring. Ben Hunterman, Brandon Bouley and Drew Ernst all give the team seasoned HCAC starters while Chris Hunt, back after arm surgery 10 years ago, will look to join that group.

"We have a good blend of experience and youth across the entire staff this season," Murray said. "We're trying to figure out where everyone will fit in this season, with our newcomers, and other returners. We need more consistency from our pitching staff this season."

As for the team's closer this season, Murray stated in the pre-season he was not sure who would hold down that role yet.

Other returners that figure to push for starting jobs and key relief roles are: Robert Layne, TC Wethington, Korey Eads, George Raggets, Troy Lippert, and Josh Schafer. Mitch Morgan will red-shirt this season.

INFIELD

Murray says the infield is fairly set, although he has a few key returners there coming off of injury. The Lions are expected to have either Ernst or Justin Shelton man the first base spot in 2011, while John Pasquale will most likely hold down second base, after seeing time mainly in center field last season. Josh Denny, shortstop, and Craig Shanks, third base, are also expected to hold down their starting spots again this season, if healthy. Pasquale, knee injury from football season, Denny, both ankles injured, and Shanks, off-season wrist surgery, were all not at 100 percent entering the team's February workouts. Pasquale was an Honorable Mention All-HCAC selection in 2010.

"We'll also have some freshmen and newcomers who will push for playing time in the infield and add to the depth there," Murray states. "We feel good about the players that we have in that group."

OUTFIELD

The Lions return a solid group of outfielders this season. They are Trace Norton, Ben Stroube, Garrett Edwards, and Pasquale, who may also see time there. Norton, now coming off shoulder surgery from last season, was a Second Team All-Conference honoree last spring. Murray states that others that will push for playing time in the outfield include freshmen and newcomers.

CATCHING

The Mount has returners at this spot in starter Jake Daugherty and Kyle Ottaway.

DESIGNATED HITTER

Murray says the team does not have one clear-cut favorite to hold down this spot, which may be shared by multiple players.

The Lions head coach says the team has benefitted from the addition of the Mount's new Strength and Conditioning Director Brent Rogers.

"Having Brent has helped us during the off-season," Murray adds. "I think we'll be in better shape this season."

"I know the guys were disappointed about last season, how it ended, and they want to get back to conference tournament. We were picked for sixth in the preseason poll, which I think is fair. I think the teams that finished above us last season are all Top-25 type teams. We're just hoping that we have improved and can move up since only the top four teams make the conference tournament. Franklin College, Manchester College, Anderson University, and Transylvania University were chosen as the top four teams in the coaches' preseason poll.

The Mount's season begins on February 26 with a doubleheader at Centre College, while the Lions are slated to open the 2010 home schedule on March 1 versus DePauw University. The Lions will play in the Snowbird Baseball Classic, March 6-12, in Port Charlotte, FL, and kick-off the 2011 HCAC season on March 25 when they host Bluffton University in a three-game series.

HEAD COACH CHUCK MURRAY

Chuck Murray enters his 15th season as the Lions head coach and his 18th season overall with the Mount's baseball program. Coach Murray has been with the program since its inaugural season of 1994, when he served as an assistant coach.

Under Murray's direction, the Lions recorded seven straight 20-wins or better seasons (2003-2009), and posted 14 consecutive seasons without a losing record (1996-2009). Murray has won 360 games over his 14-year Mount head coaching career, against 227 losses, good for a .613 winning percentage.

The 2009 season saw Murray lead the Mount to a 27-15 overall mark, 16-6 in the HCAC, good for second place and a berth in the HCAC Tournament for the seventh consecutive season (at that time, the longest current streak in the HCAC).

In 2008, the Mount recorded a 24-18 overall record and won the HCAC regular season championship with a 16-5 mark. The season was capped by Murray winning the HCAC Coach of the Year award. It was the program's 13th consecutive non-losing season, and 11th season of 24 or more wins. The HCAC Tournament appearance was the sixth straight season that they have accomplished that, and their eighth overall HCAC Tournament appearance in 10 seasons.

In 2007, the Mount recorded a school-record 33-11 mark, and qualified to the HCAC Tournament, winning the HCAC Championship for the second consecutive season (going undefeated at 3-0). They moved on to the NCAA Division III Mid-East Regional, where they lost two, one-run games. It was their third NCAA Division III post-season appearance over an eight-year time period. The 30-plus wins marked back-to-back 30-win seasons, after a 30-17 mark in 2006.

Murray was also named Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2003 as the Mount recorded a 17-4 regular season HCAC mark and first place finish. In addition, Murray helped lead the Mount to a 27-15 overall mark and runner-up finish in the HCAC Tournament in 2003 and again in 2004.

In 2000 the Lions were the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference champions and Division III Regional runner-up. Murray, who has helped place the Mount baseball program among the top schools in the country, has a 315-190 career record at the Mount, giving him a winning percentage of .623. The Lions have been a member of the HCAC since the 1999 season.

Murray has coached three All-Americans while at the Mount, Mark Schorsch (1999), Mark Sheppard (2003), and Steve Matre (2008 and 2009),

and six of his former players have been signed to professional baseball contracts: Mike Ayers (1996), Mike McNutt (2000), Dennis McRoberts (2003), Jason Miller (2004), Michael Mayer (2007), and Matre (2010). In addition, he has coached 13 all-region, 94 all-conference players, and two conference Most Valuable Players while at the Mount.

Murray began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, Cincinnati's Colerain High School, in 1984, under veteran hall of fame coach Don Colussi. He helped guide the Cardinals' baseball program for three seasons and in 1987 he assisted St. Xavier High School Hall of Fame head coach Bill Slinger until 1993. While at Colerain, Murray helped lead teams to district runner-up and regional runner-up finishes. His St. Xavier teams finished twice as GCL champions, as well as two-time district runner-ups and a sectional runner-up finish.

In 1999, Murray led the Midland Braves to the 1999 Dizzy Dean World Series Championship. He also guided Braves' teams to World Series appearances in 1989, 1991, 1995, and 1998. After coaching in the Midland ranks for 14 seasons, Murray stepped down as a coach and now serves primarily as an advisor to the program. In addition, Murray has coached former players turned pro: Chris Sexton (Cincinnati Reds), Chris Hook (San Francisco Giants), Ricky Stone (Cincinnati Reds), Sam McConnell (Atlanta Braves), Aaron Cook (Colorado Rockies), Mike Hill (Asst. GM Florida Marlins), Ahmed Plummer (San Francisco 49ers, NFL). He also has had former college coaches under his tutelage that have moved on to coach high school, collegiate or summer team programs.

Coach Murray earned a bachelor's degree in education from Northern Kentucky University and received a master's degree from Xavier University. In addition, Murray is a 15-year member of the ABCA (American Baseball Coaches Association).

He resides in Colerain Township with his wife, Melissa, twin sons Ryan and Patrick, and daughter Elizabeth.

Los Angeles Dodgers scout Tom Keefe, who scouted and signed former Mount pitcher Mike McNutt to a professional contract with the Florida Marlins in 2000, had this to say about the Lions' baseball program:

"The Mount's coaching staff is special because of the leadership of Coach Murray and all his assistants," said Keefe, who was a Marlins scout for nine years and has been with the Dodgers for eight years. "Coach Murray has assembled a fine coaching staff which produces the opportunity for young men to attend the Mount and get dramatically better."

"The openness, friendliness and cooperation that I've gotten from the Mount's coaches over the years have been great and it's gone a long way in developing a solid relationship."

ASSISTANT COACH JEFF NEWMAN

Jeff Newman returns for his third season as associate head coach and his ninth overall season as an assistant coach for the Mount. He will once again be the team's hitting coach, third base coach, recruiting coordinator and camp coordinator along with being in charge of the strength and conditioning program and developing practice plans. Newman has also been an assistant baseball coach at the University of Cincinnati where he was in charge of outfielders and coaching first base.

Coach Newman was hired in July 2005 by the College as a full-time coach, with the duties of head women's golf coach and assistant baseball coach. As hitting coach, the squad has set team records in batting average, hits, RBI, total bases, doubles, triples, and at-bats.

After graduating from Loveland High School, Newman accepted a baseball scholarship to Kentucky Wesleyan College where he played for two years before transferring to Barton College in North Carolina where he played his final two years.

Newman, who graduated in 1998 from Barton College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Sports Administration, became the athletic director and varsity baseball coach at Clermont Northeastern High School after college. While at CNE, Newman guided the baseball team to a two-year record of 36-18 as well as a league championship in 2000, and he received league Coach of the Year honors.

In addition to his years on the collegiate level, Newman spent six summers as a head coach in the nationally recognized Midland summer baseball organization. Coach Newman helped guide his teams to success on the national level, as evidenced by winning the National Championship in 2005 and two CABA Wood Bat World Series second-place finishes in 2003 and 2005. During his six years as head coach of the Midland Indians, Newman has coached eight players that have gone on to play professional baseball.

In the summer of 2009 Newman coached third base for the Cincinnati Steam in the Collegiate Greatakes League, in which they won the championship that season.

Coach Newman has also been a member of the ABCA (American Baseball Coaches Association) for over five years. Newman and his wife, Michelle, twin daughters, Bree and Corrine, and son, Casey, reside in Cincinnati, Ohio.



ASSISTANT COACH JASON KAMMER

Jason Kammer returns for his 11th season of coaching with the Lions. He graduated from the Mount in 2000 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. Kammer guides the team's catchers, is in charge of the defense, and is involved with recruiting. In addition, Kammer also connects Mount players with the area's top summer teams to continue to build their skills and abilities by playing competitive summer baseball.

"Coach Kam" played four years for Lions' head coach Chuck Murray. He was a member of back-to-back 30 win teams in 1999 & 2000, including the regional runner-up and HCAC conference championship team that won 30 games his senior season. The Mount alum was an Academic All-Conference selection during his junior year in college with a 3.6 GPA. Kammer was a 1999 member of the National College Athletic Honor Society.

Coach Kammer has also been a high school head coach and an assistant coach during the summer/fall in leagues around the city. Kammer, a St. Xavier High School graduate, is a retail product manager at Fifth Third Bank. He and his wife, Heather (Mount class of 2000), and daughters Grace and Olivia, reside in Delhi, Ohio.



ASSISTANT COACH JASON MILLER

Jason Miller returns for his seventh season with the Lions. Miller graduated from the Mount in 2000 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. Miller's responsibilities will include coaching the outfielders and being a bullpen coach, as well as helping out with base running and being involved with recruiting. He was a four-year player for the Lions as a centerfielder as well as a starting and relief pitcher. He was a member of the 2000 Conference Championship team and NCAA Regional runner-up team.

During Miller's four years as an outfielder/pitcher, he appeared in 142 games, posted a .300 career batting average and stole 48 bases. On the mound Miller compiled an overall record of 15-4 with seven saves and had 120 strikeouts in 112 1/3 innings of work.

His biggest career highlights were beating then No. 1 team Ohio Wesleyan University in the 2000 NCAA Tournament, 5-4, by pitching 6 2/3 innings to pick up the victory. Miller also holds the school's single-game strikeout record of 14, achieved on two separate occasions vs. Wabash College in 1999 and also during the first round of the 2000 HCAC Tournament vs. Franklin College. He also holds the single-game innings pitched record by tossing 10 innings in the 1999 complete game victory versus Wabash College.

In addition, Coach Miller has coached one of the top collegiate summer teams in the area for four summers, serving as the pitching coach for the Cincinnati Stars. The Stars won the NABF College World Series in 2002 and were the runner up in the 2003 season. Overall, 12 of his former players that he has coached have gone on to sign professional contracts. He also was signed to pitch professionally in the summer of 2004 by the Florence Freedom of the Frontier League.

A 1996 LaSalle graduate, Miller resides in Western Hills. He is a supervisor of the call center for Great American Life Insurance Co. Miller and his wife, Katie, reside in Western Hills.



ASSISTANT COACH JOE REGRUTH

Joe Regruth, who was the first head baseball coach at the Mount, returns this spring as the Mount's pitching coach. Regruth, who coaching career with the Lions, which spanned 1994-1996, culminated in an Association of Mideast Colleges Championship. He will be joined with Mount Head Coach Chuck Murray, who was as assistant under Regruth during the College's first three seasons.

Coach Regruth has most recently been the head coach with the Cincinnati Steam of the Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League, leading the team the past two seasons to the post season and a 2009 Championship. In addition, Regruth has also coached high school baseball at St. Xavier, Sycamore and Mariemont as well as being a pitching coach at Xavier University and the University of Cincinnati.

Regruth has spent several years with the Midland Corporation summer baseball program and has directed camps at the high school, college and professional levels. He has coached over two dozen pitchers that have gone on to play professional baseball.

The Lions' coach was a pitcher at Division I Tulane University (1984-1986) and Xavier University (1988), where he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in education (1990, 1993).

Regruth and wife, Deanna, have two children, Jackie and Trey. He serves on the faculty at Taylor High School.

**ASSISTANT COACH ADAM NEMO**

Adam Nemo joins the Lions' coaching staff this spring as an assistant coach in his first season. Nemo will work with the team's hitters and catchers.

Nemo graduated from River Valley High School in Marion, Ohio, and went on to play at the Ohio State University. He graduated from OSU in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in history. In his final two years at Ohio State, he was

an assistant coach at Thomas Worthington High School in Columbus. In addition, Nemo has a master's degree in sport administration from Xavier University (2008).

The Mount in the HCAC

The Lions's baseball team begins their 13th year in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. Other conference institutions they compete against include: Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Earlham College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania. The Mount has a 141-95 regular season record in HCAC play and has finished in third place or higher in nine of the 12 seasons they have been in the conference.

In 1999 the Mount ended the season in second place, falling short of first place by two wins, but qualifying to their first HCAC tournament. The Lions led the conference in fielding and were third in batting. Mike McNutt was second in the conference in strikeouts while Mark Schorsch was second with runs scored and first in stolen bases. Ben Miller, Schorsch and McNutt were named to the All-Conference team while Mike Cronin, Chris McKeever, Jeremy Viltro, Tom Taulbee, and Steve Jostworth were Honorable Mention All-Conference selections.

In 2000 the Lions tied for second place in the HCAC and won the end of the year HCAC Tournament by defeating Anderson University, 9-1, in the finals. They led the conference in ERA and fielding percentage, while placing in the top three in batting average, runs scored, RBI, home runs, stolen bases, and saves. Many members of the Lions' baseball team were recognized for their accomplishments. McNutt, McKeever, Ben Miller and Schorsch were named to the All-Conference team, while Robert Barnes, Mike Cronin, Sam Merkel, and Jason Miller were named to Honorable Mention All-HCAC. During 2000 Ben Miller and Jason Miller were Players of the Week.

2001 saw the Lions finish in fourth place but lose out on gaining the final HCAC Tournament spot to Manchester due to the tie-breaker. There were, however, many highlights during the season. The Mount placed in the top three in on-base percentage, saves, innings pitched, and fielding percentage. Dennis McRoberts pitched a perfect game against Defiance - the only perfect game in HCAC history. Again in 2001 many players were honored for their skills and abilities, including Jeremy Viltro and McRoberts as All-Conference members and Tom Taulbee, Cronin, Scott Jones, and Nick Donley as Honorable Mention All-Conference members. Cronin was named Player of the Week, while Dennis McRoberts was named Player of the Week twice.

The Mount finished sixth in the HCAC in 2002 with a 9-12 record. Although they missed out on appearing in the conference tournament, 2002 included many highlights during the regular season. The Lions played many close games against conference foes. Four of their losses were by one run, and three were by two runs. The Mount placed in the top three in nine categories in the conference statistics including first in total plate appearances and runners picked off. Mike Cronin led the HCAC in on-base percentage, and Mike Sheppard was third in runs scored and tied for second in doubles. Mike Cronin received First Team All-Conference honors while Steve Jostworth, Chris McKeever, Sam Merkle, Ben Miller and Sheppard received Honorable Mention awards. McKeever was also named Player of the Week. The Lions ended the season strong sweeping Transylvania in a three-game series.

The Lions rolled off a stellar 17-4 record in 2003 and captured the HCAC regular season title. The Mount posted a winning record against every

HCAC team, including 3-0 sweeps over Defiance, Bluffton and second-place Anderson. Head Coach Chuck Murray, who guided the team to their first ever regular season championship, was named HCAC Coach of the Year. The Mount was picked fifth in the conference coach's preseason poll. The Lions, the top seed for the HCAC Tournament, started out the post-season 2-0 but dropped two championship games to Anderson. In addition, Mark Sheppard picked up Most Valuable Player honors in the conference. Four other teammates, Sam Merkle, Ben Miller, Donny Nagel, and Ryan Desjardins were named First-Team All-Conference. Three other Mount players picked up All-Conference honors while three different players were selected for Player of the Week awards. The Lions were statistically well-represented among the top hitters and pitchers in the HCAC, while the team led all HCAC teams (in conference games only) in batting average, run scored, doubles, walks, RBI, hit by pitch, sacrifice flies, and on-base percentage. They were second in hits and ERA.

In 2004, the Lions had an up-and-down season in the conference. After winning in their first conference match-up of the season versus Defiance, they dropped three straight HCAC games. Following a three-game sweep by Bluffton, the Lions collected a win against Anderson to open a series that brought their record to 8-5 in the conference, the most games over .500 they would go all season in conference play. Following the AU win they dropped four straight HCAC contests before regrouping to grab the second seed in the HCAC Tournament. The Lions defeated Franklin College in two of three games to end the regular season and also defeated the Grizzlies to open the HCAC Tournament. The Mount then defeated top seed Manchester, but fell to Manchester twice in the championship game to finish as tournament runner-ups. Dave Novosel and Marc Terwilliger were named First Team All-Conference while six teammates were selected to either Second Team or Honorable Mention.

The Mount produced another successful HCAC season in 2005. The Lions swept both Anderson and Defiance in series action, three games to none, and won two of three games against Bluffton. The Mount grabbed the third seed for the HCAC post-season tournament by defeating Hanover in the last weekend series. Two of their three games scheduled against Manchester during the regular season were rained out and not rescheduled. They then went on to post a 1-2 record in the HCAC tournament. Seven Lions gained All-HCAC honors, led by First-Team senior outfielder Marc Terwilliger. The Mount was second among HCAC teams in ERA, with a 2.73 in conference games. Zach Grove led the way for the Mount, finishing second in the conference with a 1.93 ERA in HCAC-only games. Joel Steinmetz was second in the conference with seven stolen bases.

In 2006, after finishing in a four-way tie for second place, grabbed the fourth seed and final seed with two dramatic, weekend-doubleheader sweeps over Bluffton University and Transylvania University. At that point their remarkable post-season run started, as they went 3-0 in the Conference Tournament, including a 2-1 victory over nationally-ranked Manchester in conference final. Michael Mayer was named Second Team All-HCAC while teammates Nick Katsetos, Ryan Meyer, Neil Gamble, and Mike Elsasser were Honorable Mention All-Conference. Justin Zieman, Mayer and Gamble picked up HCAC Player of the Week awards.

The Mount finished with the second-best record in the conference in 2007, going 15-7 just behind first place Transylvania (16-6). The Lions swept through the HCAC Tournament, winning all three games by outscoring their opponents 17-7, to move on to the NCAA Regional Tournament. Michael Mayer and Seth DeBra claimed First Team All-HCAC honors while teammates Ryan Meyer, Joe Imhoff and Nick Weimer were named Second Team All-Conference. Six other Mount players won Honorable Mention All-Conference. The Mount also had five players named either HCAC hitter or pitcher if the week during the season.

The Lions claimed the HCAC regular season in 2008 with a 16-5 record, finishing one-half games ahead of Franklin College, and grabbed the top

seed and host for the HCAC Tournament. They started out HCAC play with a 5-0 mark, and had a 3-0 season series sweeps over both Anderson and Defiance. The Mount also made a clean sweep of the post season HCAC individual awards, with pitcher Steve Matre winning the MVP award, outfielder Ben Stroube won Freshman of the Year and Head Coach Chuck Murray was honored as conference Coach of the Year. Seth DeBra and Nick Weimer, Todd Schwertman and Ryan Rodriguez were named Second Team All-Conference while Matt Flamm, Robert Urmston and Justin Zieman and Zach Grove were selected Honorable Mention All-HCAC. Zieman also picked up an HCAC Player of the Week award. In the statistical team categories, for HCAC games only, the Lions were second in earned run average, third in on base percentage, and fourth in batting average, slugging percentage and runs scored. Matre was first in conference saves while Stroube led the HCAC in doubles. Stroube was also fourth in the HCAC batting average and slugging percentage. DeBra was third in hits while Rodriguez was third in runs scored.

The 2009 season saw the Lions continue their winning ways in conference play as they finished with a 16-6 record, tied for second best mark in the HCAC. The Mount started slowly in HCAC play, going 1-3 in their first four games, but then won 10 of their next 11 conference games, including three-game sweeps over Bluffton and Defiance and taking two of three versus Rose-Hulman. The Lions advanced to the HCAC Tournament and went 1-2, but saw several different players enjoy excellent individual seasons. Ten players took home either First Team, Second Team or Honorable Mention All-Conference awards, highlighted by first team members Nick Weimer, Ryan Rodriguez and Steve Matre. Three Mount players also won HCAC Player of the Week honors during the season. As a team, the Lions finished fifth- in conference games only- in batting average, slugging percentage, on base percentage and runs scored, while placing fourth in earned run average.

In 2010 the Mount finished sixth in the HCAC with an 8-14 HCAC record. The Lions played many close conference games, going 2-3 in one run games. They started out the season by sweeping a three-game series against Bluffton, and were 5-5 in their first 10 conference games. The Lions swept the season's two-game series against Hanover, and won the season series against Defiance College, two games to one. The sixth place finish left the Mount out the HCAC Post-season Tournament, something they had participated in from 2003-2009. Matt Flamm and Trace Norton were honored with Second Team All-Conference honors, while John Pasquale, Mark Lakas and Ryan Rodriguez were named Honorable Mention All-HCAC. George Raggets was tied for second in the conference in appearances with 11, while the Mount finished tied for fourth in team fielding percentage.
