What is the College of Mount St. Joseph educational experience? It's learning through action – serving others, graduate-level research, paid co-op positions, and leadership development. It's a Catholic liberal arts education that helps you develop the knowledge to make a difference and the integrity to lead others.

The foundation of a Mount education comes from career-minded academic programs combined with dedicated support service and a 12:1 student-to-faculty ratio. New on campus this year is a minor in Sustainability, Nursing Learning Labs and Biochemistry Lab.

At the Mount, you're encouraged to take your lessons outside of the classroom, into the community. Through the Service Learning program, students earn academic credit while volunteering to feed the hungry, building homes for Habitat for Humanity, or comforting the elderly. The Cultural Immersion program offers the chance to live, learn and work amidst other cultures. The Cooperative Education program, available for all majors, is a way for students to gain valuable, paid career experience while validating their choice of a major.

Student-athletes are among the Mount's most active leaders on campus. Competing in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic conference, the Mount fields more than 20 NCAA Division III sports teams. Students also participate in 40 student-run clubs and organizations including Student Government Association and Black Student Union.

The Mount is committed to working with students to explore all financial aid options, especially eligibility for financial assistance including scholarships. In 2010-2011, 96% of full-time freshmen received some sort of gift aid; more than 18 million dollars in grants and scholarships were received by Mount students.

Steve Radcliffe

Steve Radcliffe enters his 17th year as the Lions' athletics director for the 2011-2012 school year, and he looks forward to another outstanding season of athletics at the Mount.

Radcliffe, who oversees 22 athletic programs at the Mount, has long been a part of the sports programs at the College. Radcliffe began his career at the Mount in 1986 as an athletic trainer and was hired to implement the Mount's first academic program for athletic training in 1989. In addition to teaching athletic training, he was the Lions' head athletic trainer for all the intercollegiate sports at the College.

Radcliffe became the Mount's athletic director in 1995. Upon entering the position, he stressed the importance of upholding the College's stellar reputation of academics and athletics as a positive influence in student life and development at the Mount. Radcliffe received his bachelor's degree in 1978 from the University of Montana and his master's degree in physical education in 1981 from Miami University (Ohio).

Steve and his wife, Darlene, have two children, Victoria and Michael. The Radcliffes live in Delhi.

Facilities

Sports Complex and Schueler Field

The Sports Complex provides a state-of-the-art space for student-athletes and the fans who support them. It houses concessions, locker rooms, showers, equipment storage, and athletic training facilities and can seat sell-out crowds of 2,400. Sporting a synthetic, all-weather playing surface and track, the Mount's Schueler Field plays host to the football, soccer and lacrosse teams, in addition to home track meets.

Harrington Center

Featuring a 2,000-seat gymnasium, the Jean Patrice Harrington, SC, Student Center is home to the Lions basketball and volleyball teams, and plays host to the wrestling team's home matches. In addition, the facility includes a running track, racquetball courts, a fitness center, and an athletic training center, providing service to student-athletes and the greater Mount community.

Kinder Morgan Softball Complex

The Kinder Morgan Softball Complex has played host to the Mount's softball team since 2007. In addition, the College has developed property on River Road into practice fields for soccer and baseball. The facilities feature parking, restrooms and a service building for equipment storage.

Marge Schott Stadium

The Lions' baseball team plays home games at the University of Cincinnati's Marge Schott Stadium. Marge Schott Stadium, has a seating capacity of 3,085, a field turf playing surface and a fully-lit playing field. In addition, the complex houses indoor batting cages and pitcher's mound, a fully equipped press box with private viewing areas, a players' clubhouse and lounge, dressing rooms for coaches, full laundry and equipment facilities, and a state-of-the-art training room.

Aston Oaks Golf Course

Aston Oaks Golf Course, located 15 minutes from campus, is the Mount's home golf course for the men's and women's golf teams. Constructed by the Jack Nicklaus Design Group, Aston Oaks is a par-72 course. The men's team faces 6,908 yards with a 73.6 rating and 140 slope. The women's team faces 5,758 yards with a 73.2 rating and a 130 slope.

Mount Tennis Courts

The Lions' men's and women's tennis teams play all home matches on the six, fully-lit asphalt courts located behind the Harrington Center.

Hayden Field

Located on the west side of campus, next to the tennis courts, Hayden Field is a multi-purpose site that includes a practice field for softball and track & field athletes.

Cincinnati Spotlights

Students of the College of Mount St. Joseph greatly benefit from the rich heritage and traditions of Cincinnati. While the College is situated 15 minutes west of downtown, employment, arts and entertainment are never too far away.

Numerous Fortune 500 and Fortune 1000 companies are headquartered in Cincinnati. Procter & Gamble, The Kroger Company, and Fifth Third Bank, among others, contribute to Cincinnati's foundation while Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center is among the nation's top children's hospitals. Mount Cooperative Education students are hired by more than 100 hospitals, businesses and nonprofit organizations of Greater Cincinnati.

Boasting a vibrant commitment to the arts, Cincinnatians enjoy the Contemporary Arts Center, Cincinnati Art Museum, Aronoff Center, Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park, Music Hall, and a varied supply of art galleries. Mount students often incorporate Cincinnati's art exhibits and performances into their studies.

Cincinnati knows sports. The Cincinnati Reds, the Major League Baseball team, and the Cincinnati Bengals, of the National Football League, provide competition, entertainment and emotion for the city's sports fans. Co-op and volunteer opportunities with these organizations are often available to Mount students. Cincinnati is also home to the Flying Pig Marathon every May and the Master's and Women's Open tennis tournament every August.

Historical neighborhoods such as Mount Adams, Clifton and Over-the-Rhine make good architectural and cultural adventures, while additional entertainment options are just across the Ohio River in Newport, Covington and Mainstrasse of Northern Kentucky.

2011 Season Outlook

Tiffany Menhorn enters her second season as the head coach of the Lions' women's tennis team for the 2011 campaign. This season, Coach Menhorn wants the team to focus on maintaining consistency and improving every day through hard work. Maintaining Coach Menhorn's focus will help the Lions achieve their goals in 2011. Coach Menhorn wants to improve the team's overall and HCAC won-lost records, and believes these improvements can be accomplished through hard work and dedication.

"I expect hard work and dedication from the players," Menhorn adds. "They are vital to the growth of the program."

The Lions have a good mix of underclassmen and upperclassmen going into the 2011 season. The Mount returns four athletes from the 2010 squad and welcomes two newcomers as well as senior Bridget Kent who played for the Mount during her freshman year.

Coach Menhorn sees the main strengths of this year's team as having a couple great leaders that are vocal and positive as well as having strong upperclassmen, which she says is important to a successful program. When it comes to weaknesses, Coach Menhorn mentions that her squad has not had much success over the past few years, something she hopes to turn around soon.

"They are still developing a winning mentality," adds Coach Menhorn.

The Lions will have to replace Brittany Teagle and Judy Frey, both of whom have graduated. They were two of the most accomplished female tennis players in Mount history. Teagle finished her career first in matches played with 125, overall wins with 83, single wins with 43, and double wins with 40. Teagle was also selected Honorable Mention All-HCAC in 2010 and was a three-time Academic All-HCAC selection. Frey finished her career fourth in Mount women's tennis history in singles wins with 33, third in doubles wins with 29, fourth with 62 overall wins, third in matches played with 119, was a two-time HCAC All-Sportsmanship Team selection, and a three-time Academic All-HCAC.

The Lions will look toward senior Lauren McDonald to help fill the void. McDonald was the Lions' number four singles player in 2010. She finished 3-5 in singles and 9-6 in doubles, good for an overall record of 12-11 in 2010. McDonald also finished third in the fourth singles flight

of the HCAC Flighted Tournament. The Lions will also look to junior Kelsey Donovan to step up in 2011. Coach Menhorn labeled Donovan as powerful and says that she will likely compete at the number two or number three singles spot for the Lions in 2011.

Coach Menhorn is also counting on a big season from incoming freshman Brittany Hammond. "She has a great attitude and enthusiasm, and will be a great addition."

The rest of the roster includes sophomores Maureen Rabaut and Dallas Harris, junior Carolyn Biedenbarn, and senior Bridget Kent. All but Rabaut have college playing experience.

This season, Coach Menhorn wants the team to utilize non-conference matches to prepare the team for the HCAC matches, which she says are the most important.

"HCAC matches are important," Menhorn states. "They get the team into the HCAC tournament and ultimately the NCAA tournament."

The top four teams in the HCAC make the HCAC Tournament, so the Lions will be working hard to this season to achieve their goals.

HEAD COACH TIFFANY MENHORN

Tiffany Menhorn returns for her second season as the Lions' head women's tennis coach for the 2011-2012 school year. She is also the College's women's basketball assistant coach.

Menhorn joined the Mount coaching staff after two seasons as the first assistant women's basketball coach, as well as the assistant women's golf coach at Allegheny College. While at Allegheny she helped the women's basketball team to a record a cumulative 3.0 GPA during her final year, and she also coached numerous all-conference players.

Prior to Allegheny, she spent four years as a student-athlete at University of Pittsburgh at Greensburg where both her team and she

excelled. While at Pitt-Greensburg, she was part of three, 20-or-more win seasons, three AMCC championship games, three ECAC Tournament appearances, and one ECAC Championship. She garnered AMCC All-Conference honors four straight seasons (three times First Team) and finished as the second-leading all-time scorer with 1,502 points.

Coach Menhorn has a bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Pittsburgh at Greensburg (2008).

In addition, Menhorn has run girls' basketball camps, been a sports camp counselor, and has conducted numerous basketball clinics. She was the Pitt-Greensburg Female Athlete of the Year (2007 and 2008) and a two-time team captain. She was also a member of the University of Pitt-Greensburg cross country team (2007).

She resides in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Mount in the HCAC

The women's tennis team has produced varying degrees of success as a member of the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. Other HCAC institutions that the Lions compete against include: Anderson University, Bluffton University, Defiance College, Earlham College, Franklin College, Hanover College, Manchester College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, and Transylvania University.

In 1998, the Mount's first year in HCAC action, the Lions placed seventh out of seven schools. They improved their finish to fourth place in 1999. During that season's conference tournament the Lions gained points in the HCAC Tournament from Molly McGraw, Nicole Lampe, Meghan Perry, and the doubles team of Emily Agler and Meredith Finley. Kelly Kirby and Emily Agler picked up HCAC Player of the Week honors during the season.

In 2000, the Lions placed fifth out of seven schools, but gained individual singles finishes from Lampe and Kirby. Jacqueline Gering and Lampe won HCAC Player of the Week awards during the season.

The 2001 season saw the Mount place sixth out of seven teams at the HCAC Tournament, but Gering, Stephanie Kiehl and McGraw tied the best ever Mount individual HCAC Tournament finishes, with each placing fourth in their flight. Gering and Kiehl placed fourth in third doubles, and McGraw won All-HCAC honors, becoming the first in Mount history to be selected to the All-HCAC Team. Although they placed seventh as a team in the HCAC Tournament in 2002, the Mount received solid results from Lampe, who was fifth in fifth singles, and Christina Nemec, who was fifth in fourth singles. The doubles team of Katie Giesen and Kiehl were fourth in third doubles.

In 2003, the Lions finished in fifth place, which tied their second-best HCAC Tournament finish ever.

In 2004, the Lions struggled in conference play, losing each of their regular season matches, including a hard-fought 5-4 setback to Defiance. Christina Nemec closed a solid season at the HCAC Tournament, placing fourth in the second singles flight, and capturing All-HCAC honors. The 2005 team was also winless in the HCAC regular

season and finished eighth in the HCAC Tournament. The 2006 Lions also were winless during the HCAC regular season campaign and did not qualify to the HCAC Tournament.

In 2007, the Mount finished seventh in the HCAC regular season standings, but did not qualify to the four-team HCAC Tournament. The two victories, over Bluffton and Defiance, were the most HCAC wins since the 2002 season. They also dropped a 5-4 decision to HCAC-foe Transylvania University. Laura Robison was named to the All-Conference team.

In 2008, the Lions' tennis team won three conference matches, and finished sixth at the HCAC Individual Championship. Brittany Teagle recorded a second place finish at fourth singles while Whitney Thomas earned a spot on the All-HCAC team. The Mount played competitively throughout the HCAC regular season, falling to conference champion Hanover College, 5-4.

The 2009 season saw the Mount record a 2-5 mark in HCAC play, recording 9-0 shutout wins over both Manchester and Defiance. The Lions also dropped a hard-fought 5-4 decision to HCAC-rival Franklin. In addition, the Mount recorded their highest finish at the HCAC Singles Flighted Tournament, turning in a third place standing. Judy Frey won the third singles flight while Laura Robison was second in second singles. Whitney Thomas and Robison were each named First Team All-HCAC while Frey was named to the HCAC All-Sportsmanship team.

In 2010, the Lions compiled a 1-7 record in HCAC competition finishing eighth in the HCAC. The Lions also finished eighth in the HCAC Flighted Tournament. The Mount had big wins this season against Defiance College (7-2), Oakland City University (9-0), and Sinclair Community College (7-2). The Lions received strong play from senior, Brittany Teagle. Teagle finished the season with a 17-10 overall record (8-4 in singles, 9-6 in doubles). Teagle was named HCAC Honorable Mention and senior Judy Frey was selected to the HCAC All-Sportsmanship team.

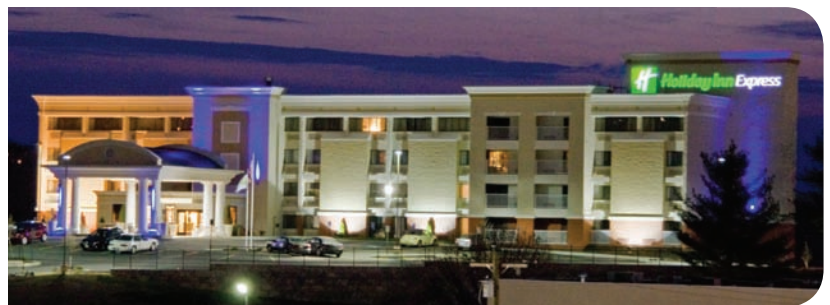
